Dear friends,

At the very end of Peter Weir's film about *Gallipoli*, Frank Dunne (played by Mel Gibson), is racing back to the front line trench with the news that the attack has been called off. Meanwhile, Major Barton is commanded to 'order the men over.' In the scenes that follow each man prepares for his final moment on earth.

Just as they prepare to attack, Barton offers these words of encouragement: "All right men, we are going. I want you to remember who you are, you are the Tenth Lighthorse Brigade. Don't forget it! Good luck."

Knowing who we are gives us dignity. Being called by name presumes intimacy. So when Jesus asks the disciples in the gospel of Matthew (Mt 16: 13-20), who do people say he is, they know he is a great prophet. But it is Peter who clearly identifies who Jesus is "You are the Christ," Peter said, "the Son of the living God!" This insight into Jesus' identity is not something Peter has come to on his own: it is a revelation to Peter by the Father in Heaven.

Our identity and who we are is always important to us, so that we can find meaning and purpose in our lives. More importantly, our faith in the identity of Jesus as the Son of God, enriches our call and identity when we speak and act in his name. When we fail, and fall short of the call to follow him, He is always there to forgive and love us through our struggle, so that we can once again move forward on pilgrimage to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Thank you to Fr Sunny for celebrating the 5:00pm Vigil Mass this weekend in my absence.

Social Justice Sunday, 27 August

Australia's Catholic bishops have called on the nation to seek "a new engagement" with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in their annual Social Justice Statement for 2023-24. Since the 1940s, the bishops have published annual statements that urge the Catholic community to reflect and act on social, economic and ecological issues.

This year's statement is Listen, Learn, Love: A New Engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples. "One of the objectives of this statement is that we want Catholics to understand that Catholic social teaching and Catholic social action are not simply theoretical and academic exercises," he said.

The Bishops invite us, as Catholics, to begin a new engagement with the First Peoples to overcome injustice, an engagement grounded in love. This love is at the heart of Jesus' message. This love is characterised by a commitment to encounter and dialogue, reciprocity, mutual accompaniment and a desire to put the other at the centre of our attention.
