A Lenten Journey – we encourage everyone to keep a good Lent.

Pope Francis appeals to the faithful "to not allow this season of grace to pass in vain" and invites believers to prepare to celebrate the paschal (Easter) mystery with mind and heart renewed, warning that "Sin leads man to consider himself the god of creation, to see himself as its absolute master and to use it, not for the purpose willed by the Creator but for his own interests".

Referring to the three key Lenten disciplines and practices, Pope Francis explains:

- Fasting means turning away from the temptation to "devour" everything to satisfy our voracity (greed, desire);
- *Prayer* teaches us to seek God's will, and to abandon idolatry and the self-sufficiency of our ego;
- *Almsgiving*, whereby we escape from the insanity of hoarding everything for ourselves and share what we have with those in need.

Bishop Anthony also calls the people of Broken Bay "to be converted to Christ anew." What concrete plans will you put in place to keep a good Lent? Please note in the bulletin a number of suggestions for you to consider for the weeks of Lent.

What do the readings say to us this Sunday?

First Reading (Ecclesiasticus 27:4-7). A person's talk shows the kind of person he or she is.

Second Reading (1 Corinthians 15:54-58). The resurrection of Christ takes the sting out of death for those who believe in him.

Gospel (Luke 6:39-45).

A blind guide cannot lead others. A person's words flow from what fills his heart.

The **first reading** says: just as an orchard is judged by the quality of its fruit, so a person's talk shows what kind of person s/he is. This links with what Jesus says in the Gospel: 'A tree is known by its fruit... the words of the mouth flow out of what fills the heart."

In the Gospel it moves from love of enemies (last week) to love of one's brothers and sisters in the community. A Christian is "his brother's (and sister's) keeper". But one cannot undertake to guide others unless one has found the way oneself. Hence, self-awareness must precede criticism of others.





A Reflection

A tree is judged by its fruits. A sound tree produces good fruit. An unsound tree produces bad fruit. In the same way, a person can be judged by his or her deeds. A good person produces a harvest of good deeds; A bad person produces a harvest of evil deeds.

Lord, help us to shun all evil, And to live a life of genuine goodness. Then our deeds will flow from what we are, As naturally as good fruit from a good tree.

Received from a Member of the Catechist Team:

"I had the great pleasure of serving as a Catechist under the supervision of the amazing Cecilia Kean. Cecilia was a former very successful primary school teacher, she displayed a sensitivity, a softness with her young students but always firmness when the occasion was needed. To those she cajoled into helping her by her lovely smile she was a real leader of her constantly changing team of volunteers.

Constantly short staffed every year Cecilia was called on to ask parishioners from the altar of a Sunday for replacements. Young married mothers with children, mature aged students who were at university, retired parishioners, all were approached to help in the huge task of educating primary school students in the Catholic Special Religious Education Program which is developed by the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, Catholic Diocese of Broken Bay. Members of Cecilia's team were always aware of problems that occasionally arose with the administration office of the primary schools in how, where and when the lessons could be presented especially with the advent of the Covid virus, Cecilia handled such frustrations effortlessly and quickly resolved the situation for her team members.

From time to time a volunteer Catechist would become unable to attend due to a family commitment or sickness which meant Cecilia would need to at short notice take an extra class. Sometimes Cecilia would take up to three classes in the one morning and often attending a different school in the same week due to a staff shortage. Doing the extra work in her stride, never complaining, she just loved the children. Cecilia with the assistance of the Holy Spirit has lead both the children and their families to deepen their response as disciples leading the children and their parents to a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ.

What Cecilia Keen has done for the parish of Holy Name can only be measured by God our Heavenly Father but we as team members say thank you Cecelia for choosing us to work with you and for your enthusiasm and support. I know God will bless you abundantly."

I, myself, have begun to appreciate more than ever, the riches contained in the Word of God. If you've ever struggled to read the
