From Fr David

Dear friends,

We come to a weekend of special commemoration when we celebrate the 65th Anniversary of the opening of our beautiful parish church on 21 March 1954, and bring to a conclusion the celebrations of our 70th anniversary of the establishment of our parish. Our Lenten Journey

Extracts from Pope Francis' Lenten Message 2019

The path to Easter demands that we renew our faces and hearts as Christians through repentance, conversion and forgiveness, so as to live fully the abundant grace of the paschal mystery.

Lent invites Christians to embody the paschal mystery more deeply and concretely in their personal, family and social lives, above all my fasting, prayer and almsgiving.

Fasting: learning to change our attitude towards others and all creation, turning away from the temptation to 'devour' everything so as to satisfy our voracity and being ready to suffer for love, which can fill the emptiness of our hearts

Prayer: teaches us to abandon idolatry and the self-sufficiency of our ego, and to acknowledge our need of the Lord and his mercy.

Almsgiving: we escape from the insanity of hoarding everything for ourselves in the illusory belief that we can secure a future that does not belong to us. And thus to rediscover the joy of God's plan for creation and for each of us, which is to love him, our brothers and sisters, and the entire world, and to find in this love our true happiness.

Let us not allow this season of grace to pass in vain! Let us ask God to help us set out on a path of true conversion. Let us leave behind our selfishness, and our self-absorption, and turn to Jesus' Pasch. Let us stand beside our brothers and sisters in need, sharing our spiritual and material goods with them.

In this way, by concretely welcoming Christ's victory over sin and death into our lives, we will also radiate its transforming power to all of creation.
