An Important Announcement on COVID19 Development

Yesterday afternoon we had to close Holy Name church at Wahroonga, having been informed by NSW Health at 3.30pm that someone infectious with COVID19 was present at Holy Name at the 9.30am Mass on Sunday 23 August. Of course, the person's identity is not public, though I am now aware of the person involved. They were asymptomatic at the time. After Sunday, they were notified that they had been classified as a close contact of someone associated with the Sydney CBD cluster. (They are not associated in any way with the recent Tangara cluster.) The person involved was tested on Tuesday and on Thursday afternoon received a diagnosis of positive for COVID19. They are now in isolation but, thankfully, in good health. We are keeping them very much in prayer and are in close contact with them. A media release was issued by our Diocese by 4.30pm on Thursday and the media has identified the church widely today. Given that our parish's COVID19 Safety plan is as developed as we have it, and particularly because virtually everyone present in the church was masked, the risk of transmission is regarded by NSW Health as low, and those people who were present at the 9.30am Mass are considered by NSW Health as "casual contacts" rather than as "close contacts." This is testimony to the good practice and procedures we have had in place. We have now contacted the 68 people present at the church for the Sunday 9.30am Mass to inform them of their status as a casual contact. They are not required to isolate, but they must monitor for symptoms and should symptoms occur they must be tested and isolate. This also demonstrates the critical importance of recording all attendees at any Mass. Casual contacts are advised to monitor for symptoms and if symptoms appear to isolate immediately and get tested for COVID. Please be sure to read the [Casual Contact information sheet from NSW Health](#) In line with our diocesan COVID strategy, Bishop Anthony has now closed our church until further notice. A forensic COVID19 clean of the church occurred on the afternoon Friday 28 August. Our church will remain closed until we can have clarity about the extent of any outbreak that may ensue. This may take a couple of weeks.

The Celebrant of the 9.30am Mass on Sunday 23 August was Fr Anselam Lakra. Fr Anselam undertook COVID testing on Friday. Given that Fr Joey Frez and myself were not present in the church the risk of contagion for us is very low indeed. However, given that we live with Fr Anselam and share life together, I think it is prudent that Fr Joey (and myself) restrict our pastoral availability – especially to our schools – until such time as Fr Anselam receives the results of his COVID test. The receipt of such may not be until Sunday or Monday.

It certainly is a strange time through which we journey! Be assured I will keep in contact with you and brief you with any further information that comes to hand.

An Important Letter from Fr David

Dear friends,

I need to raise an important consideration for our parish community to avoid any surprise in the future, and so that, even now, we might prayerfully reflect on its possibility. I am now coming to the end of my 6-year appointment as Parish Priest of Holy Name. Bishop Comensoli appointed me to this privileged role in May 2015. In Australia, the practice is that parish priests are appointed for six-year terms. This provides a Bishop the capacity to discern the often-changing needs of a diocese and to develop the life of the diocese in the best way possible. To be sent to a parish with leadership and care for its community is a great honour. It can never be thought of as the personal possession of a priest. At his Ordination, he takes a promise of Obedience to his bishop and his successors, and therefore it is important that he always seek an open, listening heart to where and how the Spirit is calling him in his relationship with the wider local church of his diocese and through his filial relationship with the Bishop. It would therefore be presumptuous for a priest to think that he would be automatically re-appointed to a parish at the end of his term. He must always cultivate an openness of heart to discern what is best for the Church to which he has committed his life.

I am now well into the final year of the 6-year term here at Holy Name. However, I have actually been with you much longer. I arrived in September 2010, ten years ago, even whilst I continued as a member of the faculty of the Catholic Institute of Sydney for several more years after that. It was a difficult time for our community given that it was provided a novel form of leadership at the time. Eight years ago, in September 2012, I was made Administrator of the Parish, and since that time, thanks be to God, we have seen the community go from strength to strength in many wonderful ways building on the remarkable participation and contribution of so many. Ten years is a significant time for a priest to be part of the life of a parish. It is, in fact, the longest a single priest has been involved in the life of Holy Name since its foundation in 1948 and I am hopeful that it has given our community the stability that it has needed. Personally, it has been the most remarkable journey. It has had a few challenges along the way, yet many wonderful moments of growth and development. Some of the most important lessons in my life have been learnt from you over the last ten years. The question that now must come to the fore is that of the future. The answer to the question is not yet clear. However, Bishop Anthony has invited me to consider what may happen in 2021. He has many situations which he needs to address, and it may be that he asks me to assume a new parish at the service of the needs of our Diocese as a whole. It may be that he asks me to maintain my role here for you. This is the discernment in which he is currently engaged.

As I have mentioned, I do not want any of us to be surprised by the outcome of the Bishop's discernment, whichever way it may go. At this stage, and with Bishop Anthony's agreement, I want to share with you transparently the Spirit-filled consideration that belongs to the Bishop's own ministry of service and that is currently taking place. We will know the outcome of Bishop Anthony's discernment before the end of this year, and I have assured him that I will certainly accept whatever his discernment may be and engage this as the Spirit's call both to me personally and to us as a community of faith. Please pray for Bishop Anthony in his discernment. We have been gifted by a Shepherd with great vision and energy, truly committed to growing our local Church of Broken Bay, and I am very privileged to work with him in this endeavour. I need to say that what I have shared with you does not affect the continuing presence of Fr Anselam with us. Bishop Anthony is not envisaging a change in the appointment of Fr Anselam, though it is likely that Fr Joey will receive a new appointment towards the end of this year.

You may recall that in June 2018 I was set to take a sabbatical. All of this got entirely overturned when Bishop Comensoli left us. The two years since have been very intense for me as you know. And apart from a two week break in the middle of 2019 I have not had a holiday for some time. Bishop Anthony has provided me with time now for a good holiday from 18 October to 20 November. This will come around soon enough, and I expect that upon my return at the end of November we will know the outcome of the Bishop's discernment and its implications for the start of the new year. Be assured that you all in my heart and prayer during this time of discernment, as I ask that you include me in your prayer too. Above all let us ask for an open heart to all that the Lord does in our lives.
