A CALL FOR HUMILITY

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday's readings offer a profound message of hope, humility, and new life in Christ. This message resonates through the prophet Zechariah, spoken at a time when the people of Israel had strayed from the Lord's promise. In the first reading, Zechariah announces the arrival of a humble King, riding not as a warrior on a horse, but on a donkey. We witness the fulfilment of this prophecy in Jesus Christ, whose entire divine and human life reveals that God's power is manifested not through force, but through gentleness, peace, and love.

Christians worldwide are called to integrate these virtues into their daily lives. Saint Paul echoes this teaching in the second reading, a letter addressed to the Christians of Rome. He reminds us that those who belong to Christ are called to live according to the Spirit rather than selfish desires. The Holy Spirit, who raised Jesus Christ from the dead, dwells within us and empowers us to choose what is good, even amidst challenges.

These difficulties represent a burden we often carry. In this context, Jesus, in the Gospel, extends one of the most comforting invitations in all of Scripture: "Come to me, all you who labour and are burdened, and I will give you rest."

Dear friends, many of us bear heavy burdens: worries about family, health issues, work, or the future. Jesus does not promise a life devoid of challenges; however, He guarantees to walk with us and bestow upon us a peace that only He can provide.

May we learn from His humble and gentle heart to bring our burdens to Him. As Christians, let us become instruments of His peace in a world often fragmented by various conflicts. May the Holy Spirit transform our families, our parish, and our communities into places where peace can flourish.

A Ministry of Welcome and Hospitality for Parishes.

St Benedict: A Life Ordered Toward God:

The feast of St Benedict is celebrated on Saturday, 11 July. Born in Italy around the year 480, he lived during a time of great uncertainty, after the collapse of the Roman Empire. In a restless world, Benedict chose to seek God through silence, prayer, and discipline.

Benedict taught that holiness is found not only in great acts, but in the faithful offering of each day to God. His greatest contribution was the Rule of St Benedict, a guide for monastic life built around prayer, work, community, humility, and obedience. Its spirit is often expressed in the words *Ora et labora*, meaning “pray and work.”

One of the key marks of Benedict’s spirituality is balance. He valued silence, but not isolation. He valued discipline, but not harshness. He valued obedience, but not fear. He wanted communities where people could seek God together and grow in holiness through ordinary life.

St Benedict reminds us that faith needs rhythm. We need time for prayer, work, rest, silence, and service. Without this rhythm, our lives can become busy but not peaceful. Benedict did not change the world through argument or force. He formed small communities of faith that became centres of worship, learning, hospitality, and culture. His life teaches us that holiness is not beyond our reach. It begins in the simple duties of today, carried out with love, patience, and trust in God.

Receiving the Body and Blood of Christ:

The Eucharist stands at the centre of our Catholic life. It is, as our previous Archbishop, Most Rev Anthony Randazzo reminded us, “*the sacred mystery at the heart of our Catholic faith: the Holy Eucharist.*” It is not only a holy gathering. It is a remembrance of what Jesus once did. It is Christ himself, present among us.

At every Mass, the sacrifice of Calvary is made present. The risen Lord comes to us under the signs of bread and wine. In this mystery, “*heaven touches earth.*” We do not stand at a distance from the saving work of Christ. As the Archbishop wrote, “*We do not simply remember; we participate.*” This is why receiving Holy Communion is never ordinary. When we receive the Body of Christ, we receive the Lord who gave himself for us. When we drink from the chalice, we receive the Precious Blood poured out for the forgiveness of sins. Under either form, we receive the whole Christ. Yet receiving both the Body and Blood expresses more fully the sign of the Eucharistic banquet, the meal of the Lamb, and the covenant sealed in his Blood.

The chalice reminds us that our faith is not bloodless. Christ loved us to the end. He gave his Body. He poured out his Blood. In receiving both, we are drawn more deeply into his sacrifice, his mercy, and his risen life. “*As we receive the Body and Blood of Christ, we are united more deeply to Our Lord and to one another.*” The Eucharist then sends us out as Christ’s Body in the world: to live with mercy, to serve with humility, and to love with courage.

May we approach this mystery with awe, reverence, and joy, proclaiming: “*When we eat this Bread and drink this Cup, we proclaim your Death, O Lord, until you come again.*”

Sister Alessandra Smerilli Appointed Prefect of Vatican Dicastery

Pope Leo XIV has appointed Italian Salesian Sister Alessandra Smerilli, F.M.A., as Prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development.

This is a significant appointment, as Sister Smerilli becomes the first woman to head this major Vatican office. The Dicastery for Promoting Integral Human Development exists to help the Church promote the dignity of the whole human person. Its work includes human rights, health, justice, peace, the economy, work, care for creation, migration and humanitarian emergencies. It also studies and promotes the Church's social teaching.

In this sense, the Dicastery helps the Church respond to many of the great human questions of our time. It is concerned not only with charitable works, but also with the deeper social structures.

Sister Alessandra is a member of the Salesian Sisters of Don Bosco. Since 2021, she has served as Secretary of the Dicastery, meaning she already brings considerable experience and knowledge of its work. Her appointment is not that of an outsider, but of someone who has helped lead and shape the Dicastery in recent years.

Sister Alessandra is also an economist, with doctorates in political economy and economics. She has taught political economy in several Catholic and pontifical institutions. This background is important for a Vatican office that deals with both practical human needs and the larger systems that shape people's lives.

Commenting on the appointment of his successor, Cardinal Michael Czerny said that it "represents a recognition of her leadership." He noted that Sister Alessandra "combines the critical rigor of an economist with the Salesian spirituality of caring for young people and those most in need." He also praised her willingness and inclusive approach, saying that she helps ensure "that no one is left behind." This appointment is a strong sign of the Church's continuing commitment to human dignity, social justice, care for creation, and the service of those who are most vulnerable.
