# 5th October 2025 — 27th SUNDAY in ORDINARY TIME

### **FAITH AND SERVICE**

A Christian life is a long journey to meet Christ. It starts from that particular day of our baptism and ends the last day of our life on earth. It is a kind of earthly pilgrimage whereby faith plays a special role.

From the Letter to the Hebrews in Chapter 11 we have a teaching over the meaning of the Faith. According to the author of this letter, faith is the assurance of things hoped for. It is the conviction of things not seen. Our daily life is marked with ordinary gestures or actions of faith. More often we do not realise that.

For example, waking up in the morning after a long night of sleeping and hoping to be alive the following day. An ordinary act of faith is also seen when standing before a tomb of our beloved ones in silence recalling in memory his presence with hope of seeing him one day again. In a similar way, travelling maybe seen as an ordinary act but it requires faith. Generally, when it concerns taking a flight for example, we do not ask to the pilot to show us his diplomas or to demonstrate to us his capability and experience of handling the flight. Sometimes we do not even see him. Yet we board with strong hope that he knows how to pilot the aircraft. We trust "blindly" the entire staff of the stewards that they are going to take care of us till we reach our various destinations. So, this faith in humanity is a belief that things will work out for the best for us. However believing in God who is greater than us that our humanity can offer comfort especially during tough times. Our faith has to be a strong belief. We can then understand the anxiety of the apostles over their faith.

In this Sunday's Gospel, the apostles are on their journey of faith with Jesus. This journey started the moment they were chosen and they agreed to leave everything in order to follow Jesus. However, they realised that their faith was not great enough. This is to say that their faith needed to be increased in order to understand very well the teaching of Jesus, spiritual things and also to react.

"Increase our faith!" This is the request of the apostles to Jesus. A request that is current. A revival of our life of faith is needed today more than ever because our world is often characterised by uncertainty and rapid change. The development of sciences and technology seem to answer to all the needs of our humanity today.

The apostles did the above request for a purpose; that is to be committed afterwards. So just like the apostles we need an active faith that compels us to serve others. When we trust in the love of God we are motivated to serve. A kind of service that is motivated by no expectation of recognition.

Let us come back to ourselves and make ours this request of the apostles with the purpose of living out faith in God through our actions.

# **Pray The Rosary**

The Rosary consists of 20 Mysteries divided into four distinct parts – The Joyful, The Luminous, The Sorrowful and The Glorious Mysteries.

Each Mystery is represented by a Decade made up of the Our Father, Ten Hail Marys and a Glory Be.



October is The Month of the Holy Rosary. The feast day of Our Lady of the Rosary is 7 October. It was instituted to honour the Blessed Virgin Mary in gratitude for the protection that she gives the Church in answer to the praying of the Rosary.

The Rosary is appealing and simple. The purpose of the Rosary is to help us meditate on the great mysteries of our salvation. Every time we pray the Our Father we are reminded that Jesus' Father is the initiator of salvation. Praying the Hail Mary reminds us that we are joining with Mary in contemplating these mysteries. In addition, they help to make us aware that Mary was and is still intimately joined with her son, Jesus, in all the mysteries of earthly and heavenly existence.

The constant repetition of prayer creates an atmosphere of contemplation. The traditional fifteen Mysteries of the Rosary were finalized by the sixteenth century.

The mysteries are grouped into sets:

The Joyful Mysteries,

The Sorrowful Mysteries,

The Glorious Mysteries,

The Luminous Mysteries (which were announced in 2002 by Pope John Paul II)

"Of course, the Rosary belongs to every month, but in October the Church celebrates this prayer in a special way: reminding us of its simple beauty and gentle power. It is a time of grace for us to return to this prayer if we have let it slip away: or perhaps to discover for the first time, in the company of Mary, how the Rosary can guide us into unpretentious prayer".

No audition required this is an inclusive choir experience.


