# 6th Apríl 2025 — FIFTH SUNDAY OF LENT

Dear friends.

This week's gospel from St John (8:1-11) speaks about the woman caught in adultery, and how her accusers bring her before Jesus for judgement. Jesus is able to turn the tables on the woman's accusers by calling them to examine their own consciences before condemning the woman.

The late Cardinal Basil Hume once said: 'there is a certain solidarity in sin.' As humans, we are all sinners in that, we feel a certain solidarity in our moments of weakness with one another. St Paul says in his letter to the Romans: 'For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God.' (Rom 3:23). That is why the accusers of the woman eventually wander off, unwilling to cast stones, because they themselves are sinful as well.

This scene is a 'test case' for Jesus, as the woman is merely a pawn in their scheming. Jesus shows solidarity with the woman by getting down to her level. An old tradition says that while Jesus began writing with his finger (just as God wrote the Ten Commandments with his finger on Mt Sinai), he is writing down the sins of the woman's accusers or perhaps he was writing the law which puts greater emphasis on mercy than on condemnation.

The solidarity of Jesus with each one of us goes all the way to the cross. Eventually, it is Jesus who becomes the condemned one, the victim: though one without sin. Christ's sinlessness conquers all sin. Again St Paul reminds us: 'God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.' (Rom 5:8).

As Jesus forgave all from the cross, for he said: 'they did not know what they were doing,' so in today's gospel he says: 'Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?' 'No one sir,' she replied. 'Neither do I condemn you,' said Jesus 'go away, and don't sin anymore.'




