### 7 December 2025 SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

### 'REPENT FOR THE KINGDOM OF GOD IS CLOSE AT HAND.'

Dear friends,

Last Sunday was the beginning of the season of Advent. Jesus called us to stay wake because we do not know when our master is coming. Thus, we are called to get prepared for the unknown time of arrival of the master.

This Sunday, the call for preparation continues. John the Baptist proclaims the coming of the kingdom -a call to repent as part of the preparation to enter the kingdom of God.

The sacrament of Baptism and of the penance become the key to unlock the gates of heaven. John the Baptist invoking the words of prophet Isaiah who said, 'A voice cries out in the wilderness, prepare a way for the Lord, make his path straight". John the Baptist spoke God's message without fear or favor and paid with his life.

His passionate mission was about preparing the people to welcome the savior. He offered baptism as a washing ritual signifying the wash away of sin. Many flocked into him.

When the religious leader (Pharisees and Sadducees) came for baptism. John was very hard on them, calling them brood of vipers trying to escape the coming retribution He warned them against the presumption of salvation by claiming descent from Abraham. The only security lies in bearing the fruits of genuine repentance.

It is only the good works of love especially towards the needy and marginalized flowing out of genuine heart of repentance, that open wide the doors of our hearts. And so, Advent calls us to prepare the way to welcome the Lord and experience salvation. St Paul says in the second reading, 'Christ is the hope of all people'.





The Advent Wreath is one of the key symbols in the Church's Liturgy over the next four weeks of waiting and preparation for Christmas. Today, we bless the wreath and light the first candle. Before we do so, let us pause and pray together with a longing and waiting for the coming of the Lord.
