**Sunday: 8.00am, 9.30am, 11.00am and 5.30pm**

We will continue to make available Our Sunday Mass online.

This will then be your allocated Mass each weekend for the time ahead.

**Remember: In order to comply with the requirement of no more than 50 people at a religious gathering, we ask that only those who have first registered through the Parish Office attend a Sunday Mass.**

We are also obliged to record the names of those who attend each Mass so that we can assist in the Government's strategy of testing, tracing and isolating.

It is not necessary to register for these weekday Masses, but we will need you to sign in with your contact details. People may attend one or more of the weekday Masses.

## From Fr David

Dear friends,

This Sunday we celebrate Trinity Sunday. It is that Sunday each year on which we are invited to reflect on the central mystery of our Christian life—our understanding of God as a Trinity of Persons. This is the radical Christian imagination of God, revealed to us through the story of Jesus, and our incorporation into his own identity as Son of the Father. Our God is a communion of persons made one through, for, by, in, and love of each other. Each family is a mirror of the Trinity, each family is the most transparent icon of our understanding of God as Christians. They teach us that, as for God, we find our identity in and through our relationships. We are our relationships.

It is on this very Sunday that we begin to gather again as a community of faith. How heartening it has been to see as many wanting to gather in faith again. It shows us just how social is our faith. It is not simply something individual, wrapped up in our own subjectivity. No, faith by its very nature comes alive most when it is shared. It is not possible to be Christian without community. It is the community, not just ourselves as individuals, that bears the life of the Risen Lord, and something is missing in our discipleship when we are not part of a community. As does our family, it is the community that teaches us that we come to know God through our relationship with one another. So, on this Trinity Sunday let us come back together as a community, celebrating the bonds that make present Christ in such a way that we can touch, hear and see.

We come together with responsibility and care. The challenge of the COVID19 virus remains. And therefore, though certain restrictions have eased, we still cannot re-introduce the full range of parish activities just yet. Taking everything step by step, and vigilant for the wider community experience of the pandemic, at this stage we introduce only Masses. We will wait before introducing other devotions or liturgies just to see how things go in the larger society, and because of the legal responsibilities the parish bears to ensure compliance with current safety regulations. Therefore we ask you to be a little more patient before we begin to consider parish activities other than Mass.
