Dear Friends

This is regarded as the mother church of Christendom. And we celebrate the feast as a sign of devotion and unity with the Chair of Peter, which, as St. Ignatius of Antioch said, "it presides over the whole assembly of charity". Our gathering in the church as a community of believers for prayer is more than any other simple gathering. It attests our heavenly assemble in the Kingdom of God.

Today's feast of the Cathedral for the diocese of Rome blends the boundaries between humanly, and physical church buildings and the Church as the body of Christ. As St. Paul says in the second reading that 'We are God's building and Christ Jesus is our foundation'. We are, you and I, each of us individually and all of us together, temples of the Holy Spirit. St. Paul says, "if anybody should destroy the temple of God, God will destroy him, because the temple of God is sacred; and you are that temple". This is fulfilled in the gospel of today. Therefore, when we enter a church building, we are no longer simply on earth, we are touching and tasting the heavenly realities and our eternal future.

Prophet Ezekiel in the first reading says, 'the glory of God is present in the Temple'. This is where he shall live. And the water flooring from the sanctuary of the temple gives life and healing. This is nothing more than the sacraments in the church.





November Mass Counts



From the Diocesan Liturgical Commission

9 November – Dedication of the Lateran Basilica – Feast
 Celebrated at the Vigil Mass on Saturday 8 November, and the day Masses of Sunday 9 November.



What is the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica?

This feast day **celebrates the anniversary of the Dedication of Rome's Lateran Basilica** in 324 A.D.
In that year, Pope Sylvester established his cathedral and residence on property given to the Church by the Emperor Constantine.

When Cardinal Robert Prevost OSA was elected Pope in May, he became the 14th Bishop of Rome to take the name Leo. The first Pope to have that name was Saint Leo the Great, whose memorial the Church will celebrate on November 10. Unlike the current Pope Leo, St Leo the Great did not choose his name. The custom of choosing a "Papal" name wouldn't start until a few centuries later.



Meaning "lion", St Leo the Great was certainly a lion for the Church. He helped to defend Rome against Attila the Hun, causing the invader to withdraw. He also called the Council of Chalcedon, which led to one of the first great splits in the Christian world, as the Oriental Orthodox broke away following the Council. He also had an eye for the poor, re-energising charitable works in Rome amid an influx of refugees and poverty, associating fasting with charity and almsgiving.

This same spirit is echoed by Pope Leo XIV, who has signalled his intent to be not only a peacemaker, but a Pope who looks out for the poor. This spirit is routed in the belief of the dignity of every human being, something championed by Pope Leo XIII, who revolutionised Catholic social teaching at the end of the 19th century, and who was the main inspiration behind Pope Leo XIV's name choice.

We pray Pope Leo XIV will embody his namesake and be a "lion": a fierce defender of the most vulnerable, and a strong advocate for the dignity of every human being.

Pope Leo's Prayer Intention for November 2025

During the month of November, Pope Leo invites us to pray that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter might find consolation in their community, and may receive peace of heart from the Spirit of Consolation.

At different stages of the process, individuals are given the invitation to continue on their journey towards the Easter Sacraments and reception into the Church.

Urgent Appeal for More Catechists - Can you please help?

The original meaning of "catechist" is one who "echoes God's word", however catechists are much more than that. Facilitating a child's faith formation is a rewarding experience that does not require a teacher's degree or an advanced degree in theology: all it requires is enthusiasm, as well as generosity in sharing your time with others.

Are you looking for a new way to give back to the community? Have you thought about volunteering? You may or may not be aware, but there is a shortage of volunteers instructing Catholic children in public schools within our area. Public schools in NSW offer Special Religious Education each week which is volunteer driven.

As baptised Catholics, we are called to share the Good News of Jesus Christ and one of the most rewarding ways to fulfil this call is to be part of the parish team of catechists. We have Catechist classes at Warrawee Public School on Wednesday mornings and at Wahroonga Public School ("The Bush School") on Thursday mornings. The lessons are for 30 minutes.

All resources are supplied and training is offered by the Diocese of Broken Bay. We have a wonderful group of dedicated Catechists doing this, but many are taking multiple classes or have combined groups as we need more volunteers.
