



Natural Fertility Awareness Week this year is August 22 -28.

Natural Fertility Awareness Week is dedicated to helping women understand their fertility and manage it without the need for drugs, devices or invasive techniques.

Once learned, fertility awareness can be used throughout a woman's reproductive life, even when her cycles are not regular.

The theme for Natural Fertility Awareness Week 2022 is:

Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross Jordan (1848-1918) Priest and Founder of the Salvatorians Feast Day 21 July 2022

John Baptist Jordan was born into a poor family in Gurtweil, Germany. His family's poverty prevented him from completing his studies and entering a seminary and he spent some years working as an itinerant painter and labourer.

In time, he was able to begin seminary studies and he was ordained a priest on 21 July 1878. Father Jordan had demonstrated a proficiency with languages and his archbishop sent him to Rome to study Greek and Semitic languages.

Father Jordan became increasingly aware that God was calling him to establish a new apostolic work in the Church, envisioning a collaborative society of priests, religious and lay people who would promote the Catholic Faith throughout the world.

On 8 December 1881, Father Jordan and a small group of companions professed religious vows, establishing the "Apostolic Teaching Society", At the time of his profession, Father Jordan took the religious name "Francis Mary of the Cross".

A short time later, the Society came to include a group of religious women (this first group of sisters later became an independent community known as the Sisters of the Sorrowful Mother).

In the years that followed, the Society Father Jordan founded was transformed into two distinct religious communities, one including priests and brothers and the other, a new community of religious sisters. Given a new name and now dedicated to the Divine Saviour, these communities became known as the Salvatorians.

Father Jordan spent the remainder of his life governing the community of priests and brothers and overseeing the establishment of new missions in several countries, and the ongoing publishing and educational projects of the young community.

Blessed Francis Mary of the Cross died on 8 September 1918, in Fribourg, Switzerland, where he had been forced to relocate during the First World War. He was beatified on 15 May 2021.

Today, Salvatorian priests, brothers, sisters, and lay members serve in a myriad of ministries in more than 40 countries, inspired by Father Jordan's vision of collaboration and universality.

Now Martha who was distracted with all the serving said, 'Lord, do you not care that my sister is leaving me to do the serving all by myself? Please tell her to help me.' But the Lord answered: 'Martha, Martha,' he said, 'you worry and fret about so many things, and yet few are needed, indeed only one. It is Mary who has chosen the better part; it is not to be taken from her.'

Reflection

God's generosity towards us

If a neighbour can be imposed upon and coerced into giving bread in the middle of the night, will not God, our heavenly Father and provider, also treat us with kind and generous care no matter how troubling or inconvenient the circumstances might appear? Jesus states emphatically, How much more will the heavenly Father give! St. Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD) reminds us that "God, who does not sleep and who awakens us from sleep that we may ask, gives much more graciously." The Lord Jesus assures us that we can bring our needs to our heavenly Father who is always ready to give not only what we need, but more than we can ask. God gives the best he has. He freely pours out the blessing of his Holy Spirit upon us so that we may be filled with the abundance of his provision. Do you approach your heavenly Father with confidence in his mercy and kindness towards you?

Father in heaven, you have given me a mind to know you, a will to serve you, and a heart to love you. Give me today the grace and strength to embrace your holy will and fill my heart with your love that all my intentions and actions may be pleasing to you. Help me to be kind and forgiving towards my neighbour as you have been towards me.


he who acts with justice and speaks the truth from his heart; He who does not slander with his tongue. (R.)


Do you pray with joy and confidence? The Jews were noted for their devotion to prayer. Formal prayer was prescribed for three set times a day. And the rabbis had a prayer for every occasion. It was also a custom for rabbis to teach their disciples a simple prayer they might use on a regular basis. Jesus' disciples ask him for such a prayer. When Jesus taught his disciples to pray he gave them the disciple's prayer, what we call the *Our Father* or *Lord's Prayer*


