
Meet Our New Catechist Coordinator, Gladys!

Join us for Adoration from 5pm to 6pm every Sunday during Lent before our 6pm Mass at Sacred Heart Church, Pymble.


Beginning on Sunday, 22 February and every Sunday until 22 March.

Men's Dinner



With me, bear the hardships for the sake of the Good News, relying on the power of God who has saved us and called us to be holy – not because of anything we ourselves have done but for his own purpose and by his own grace. This grace had already been granted to us, in Christ Jesus, before the beginning of time, but it has only been revealed by the Appearing of our saviour Christ Jesus. He abolished death, and he has proclaimed life and immortality through the Good News.

Gospel Matthew 17: 1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus took with him Peter and James and his brother John and led them up a high mountain where they could be alone. There in their presence he was transfigured; his face shone like the sun and his clothes became as white as the light. Suddenly Moses and Elijah appeared to them; they were talking with him. Then Peter spoke to Jesus. ‘Lord,’ he said ‘it is wonderful for us to be here; if you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.’ He was still speaking when suddenly a bright cloud covered them with shadow, and from the cloud there came a voice which said, ‘This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour. Listen to him.’ When they heard this, the disciples fell on their faces, overcome with fear. But Jesus came up and touched them. ‘Stand up,’ he said ‘do not be afraid.’ And when they raised their eyes they saw no one but only Jesus.

As they came down from the mountain Jesus gave them this order. ‘Tell no one about the vision until the Son of Man has risen from the dead.’

Gospel Reflection

It is only a few weeks since we heard the story of Jesus' baptism in which the heavens opened and the Father's voice was heard. Now, a similar revelation-event occurs in the presence of Peter, James and John. The heavens open and light, bright as the sun, shone around Christ. And again the voice: This is my Son, the Beloved; he enjoys my favour; followed by the added exhortation: Listen to him.

These disciples have received the gift of a glimpse of the resurrection. Memory of this vision returned, no doubt, to make sense of their bewildering experience of the Paschal Mystery when they witness Christ's agony in the garden before he is arrested.

For the disciples, as now for us, beholding Christ in the Paschal Mystery fills us with awe ('fear of the Lord'). The proclamation of this story should aim to evoke a sense of amazement on the part of the assembly, a wonder which will be reinforced in the celebration of the Eucharist.

Siena Catholic College

Catholic Schools Broken Bay (CSBB) is delighted to announce that a new K-12 Co-educational College is being established in Pymble from 2027. The setting for the proposed new College, Siena Catholic College, is the existing school sites of Our Lady of Perpetual Succour Catholic Primary School, West Pymble, and Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School, Pymble. Students in Kindy-Year 4 will be located on the West Pymble site, and students in Years 5-12 will be located on the Pymble site.

While Siena Catholic College will be a K-12 school, there will be an annual intake of new Year 7 students, with the first intake commencing in January 2027. This means that students completing Year 6 in any of our CSBB primary schools will be given preferential consideration for enrolment at Siena in Years 7-12.

Families are warmly invited to attend the Siena Catholic College Open Days in March 2026 to meet key staff, hear about the vision for the new College, and explore the facilities and programs that will be available.
