## Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School

In Stage 1, students are exploring the sacrament of Baptism and learning about its sacred symbols, including water, the Paschal Candle, oils, and Scripture. Through engaging discussions and reflection, we are discovering how Baptism welcomes people into the Church community and calls us to share in Jesus' life and mission. Students responded to this learning through drawing, watercolour painting, and playdough creations. We were also fortunate to visit our church to explore the sacred space where Baptisms take place.



## May, the Month of Mary

May is the Month of Mary. For centuries, the Catholic Church has set aside the entire month of May to honour Mary, Mother of God. Not just a day in May, but the entire month.



The month of May is a special time for Catholics to pay homage to our Blessed Mother Mary. We pay homage to her. Contrary to misconceptions, we do not worship her. As Catholics, we honour Mary.

### Ways We Can Honour Mary:

- Pray the Rosary
- Say the Hail Mary Prayer throughout the day
- Create a Prayer Corner, placing some representation of our Blessed Mother whether that be a photo, small statue, or Rosary beads.
- Create an outdoor space, flowers in honour of Mary

### Why Should We Do This?

Not only because it is a long-standing tradition in the Church. Not only because there are special graces connected to it.

Do it because Mary is the Mother of Christ – your mother, everyone's mother – and because she cares for all of us day-in-and-day-out without fail, interceding for us in even the tiniest matters. For that, she deserves an entire month in her honour.

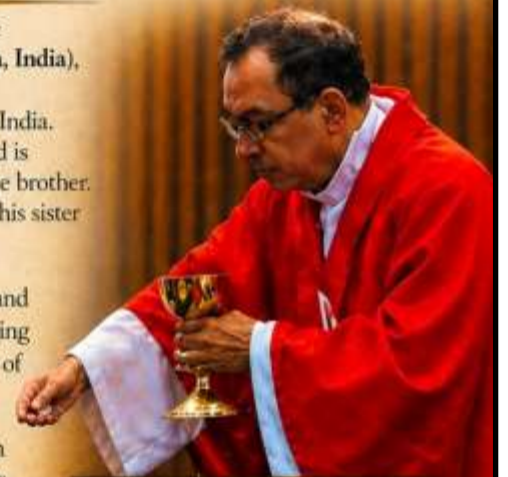

### First Reading Acts 8: 5-8, 14-17

#### A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

### Second Reading 1 Peter 3:15-18

#### A reading from the first letter of St Peter

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong. Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Alleluia, alleluia!  
All who love me will keep my words,  
and my Father will love them and we will come to them.  
Alleluia!

### Gospel John 14: 15-21

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples:

'If you love me you will keep my commandments.  
I shall ask the Father,  
and he will give you another Advocate to be with you for ever,  
that Spirit of truth  
whom the world can never receive  
since it neither sees nor knows him;  
but you know him,  
because he is with you, he is in you.  
I will not leave you orphans;  
I will come back to you.  
In a short time the world will no longer see me;  
but you will see me,  
Because I live and you will live.  
On that day  
you will understand that I am in my Father  
and you in me and I in you.  
Anybody who receives my commandments  
and keeps them  
will be one who loves me;  
and anybody who loves me will be loved  
by my Father,  
and I shall love him and show myself to him.'

### Gospel Reflection

This text follows on from last Sunday's gospel. It is a part of Jesus' long and tender farewell to his disciples which the Gospel of John sets at the Last Supper.

He is saying goodbye to them but promises that he will not leave them orphans. As risen Lord in the Holy Spirit, he will remain with them forever.

The text plays with the idea of 'seeing'. They will no longer see with their eyes; instead they will see with the heart because they love him. To love Christ is to know him because God is love. Jesus repeats what he said in last week's gospel – I am in my Father – but broadens it now to include the disciples... I am in my Father, and you in me and I in you. All are one in love.

In the context of the Easter season, we hear Jesus speaking about his resurrection and his enduring presence with us in the Holy Spirit. It should be read as a quiet meditation.

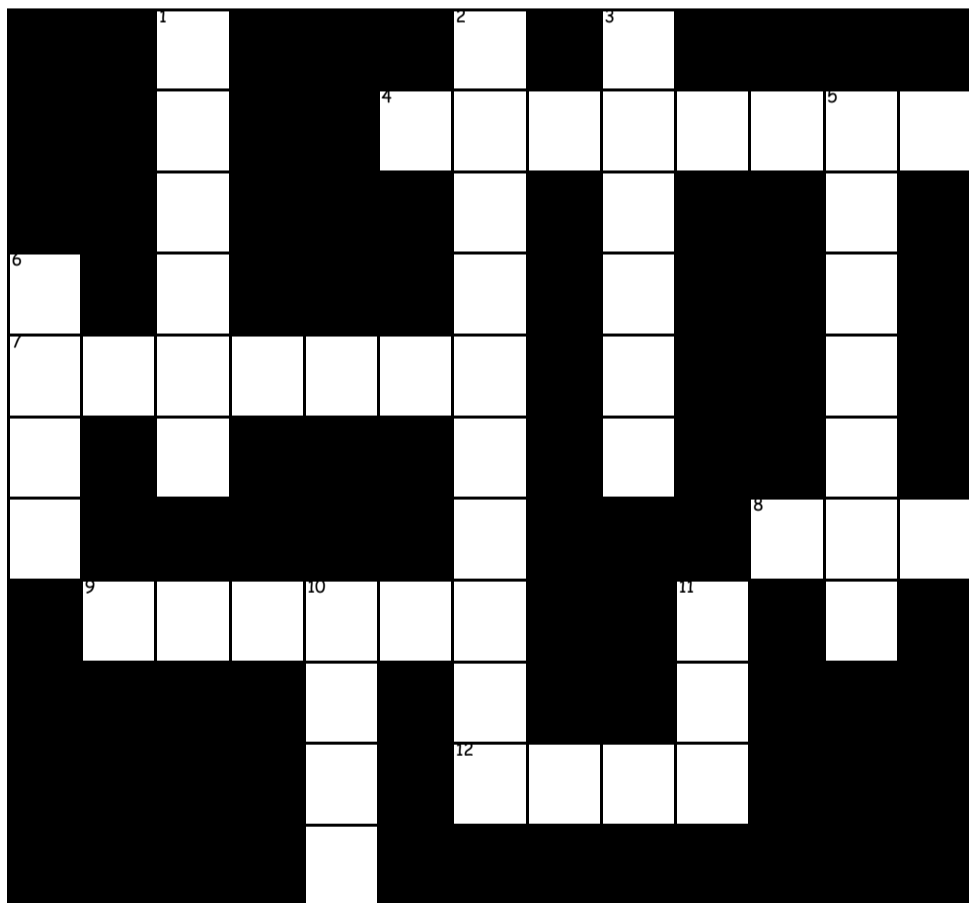

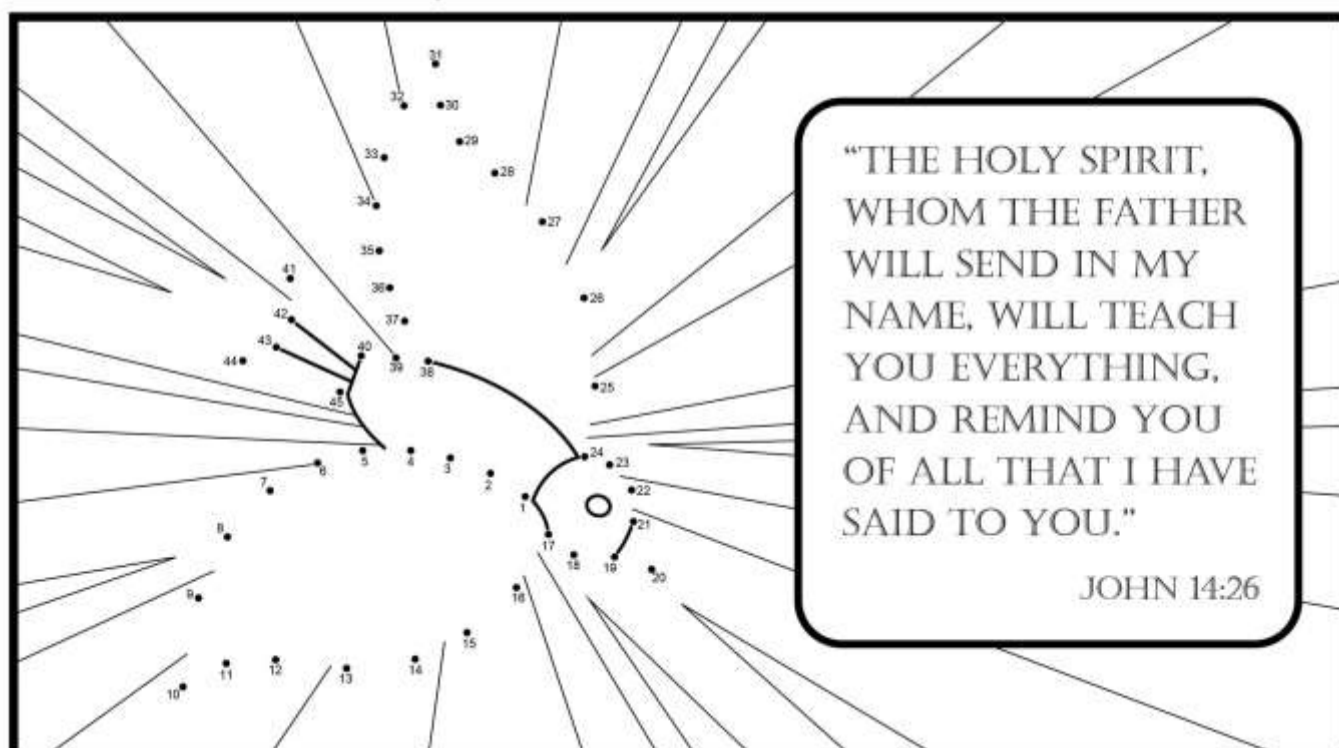
