I rejoice, I rejoice, down to my soul. Help me to prepare my heart to be open and able to receive your immense love.



Pymble Parish COVID Update



Based on the current Public Health Orders, both Sacred Heart and OLPS will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who at tend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified.

The following will apply **until 15 December**:

- The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the <u>2 sqm principle</u>. This will be 260 for Sacred Heart Church, and 130 for OLPS Church. This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- Congregational singing will not be possible.
- COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be reintroduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head;
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession;
 - It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

From 15 December 2021:

- Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- Masks will no longer be compulsory but strongly recommended where you can not socially distance.
- There will be no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.
- It will still be essential for all visitors to check-in using the QR code.



Liturgy of the Word Third Week of Advent

Entrance Antiphon Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

First Reading Zep 3:14-18

A reading from the prophet Zephaniah

Shout for joy, daughter of Zion, Israel, shout aloud! Rejoice, exult with all your heart, daughter of Jerusalem! The Lord has repealed your sentence; he has driven your enemies away. The Lord, the king of Israel, is in your midst; you have no more evil to fear. When that day comes, word will come to Jerusalem: Zion, have no fear, do not let your hands fall limp. The Lord your God is in your midst, a victorious warrior. He will exult with joy over you, he will renew you by his love; he will dance with shouts of joy for you as on a day of festival.

Responsorial Psalm

(R.) Cry out with joy and gladness: for among you is the great and Holy One of Israel.

- 1. Truly, God is my salvation, I trust, I shall not fear. For the Lord is my strength, my song, he became my saviour. With joy you will draw water from the wells of salvation. (R.)

When all the people asked John, 'What must person be treated with respect and that we do?' he answered, 'If anyone has two honour be given where honour is due. John tunics he must share with the man who has told the tax collectors that they must not none, and the one with something to eat coerce people to pay more tax money than must do the same.' Gospel Reflection

John brought 'good news' to the people

The people recognized that John was an extraordinary man of God and a true prophet who spoke in God's name. They came out to hear the "good news" which he preached to them. And they willingly submitted to his God's voice and obey his commandments. John wanted the people to be in a good place to receive the Messiah and follow him.

was very practical. He told the people three things: First, every follower of God must share what they possess (their personal goods and resources) with their neighbours, especially with those who lacked the basic necessities of life. John recognized that this was a key duty for every individual and an outward expression of great the commandment to love one's neighbour as oneself.

Second, John pointed out the sacred duty to give each and every person what is their due and to not take from them what rightfully belongs to them. God commands that each them or to rob them of their goods.) John did not tell them to leave their profession,

And thirdly, John exhorted his listeners to be content with what they had and to avoid coveting (wrongfully desiring or acquiring) what belonged to others. John basically called the people to turn back to God and to walk in his way of love and righteousness.

Word of God has power to transform us Whenever the Gospel is proclaimed it has power to awaken faith in people who will listen and turn to God. God, in turn, is always ready to open our eyes to the spiritual reality of his kingdom and to the power and action of the Holy Spirit who transforms us into the likeness of Christ. Do you believe that God's word is "good news" for you? And do you allow his word to take root and grow in you, and bring you the fruit of joy, freedom, and new life in the Holy Spirit?
