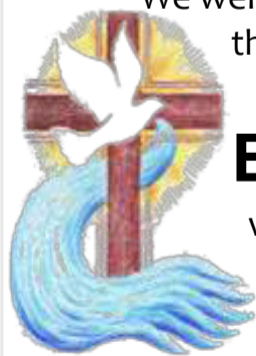

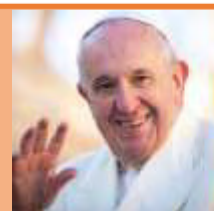
Prayer for the Intercession of Blessed Francis Jordan

SACRED HEART PRIMARY SCHOOL YEAR 6 RELIGIOUS EDUCATION

This term, Year 6 has been looking at what can be learned from the wisdom writings of the Old Testament.

Throughout the unit, students have looked to develop an understanding of what made something wise. After much debate, students decided that a statement is wise when it draws on experience and knowledge from the past to influence others to live better lives.

Students have discovered that the psalms, the writing of the prophets and the wisdom sayings such as proverbs were intended to impart wisdom to God's people in their time and instil valuable sources of encouragement and guidance in our walks today.

As part of their studies, Year 6 listened to a series of influential songs from modern times such as 'Imagine' by John Lennon and explored the way they were written to influence the views of others on world issues. In the same way, psalms and proverbs were written in the Old Testament to teach and guide people to live lives that brought honour to God.

Students were challenged to write their own poem or song that encouraged others to live for Jesus and love the world and those around them. Here are some of their responses.

These children have completed the faith formation program within our Parish. Their families have made the commitment to actively engage with their faith and attend mass regularly.

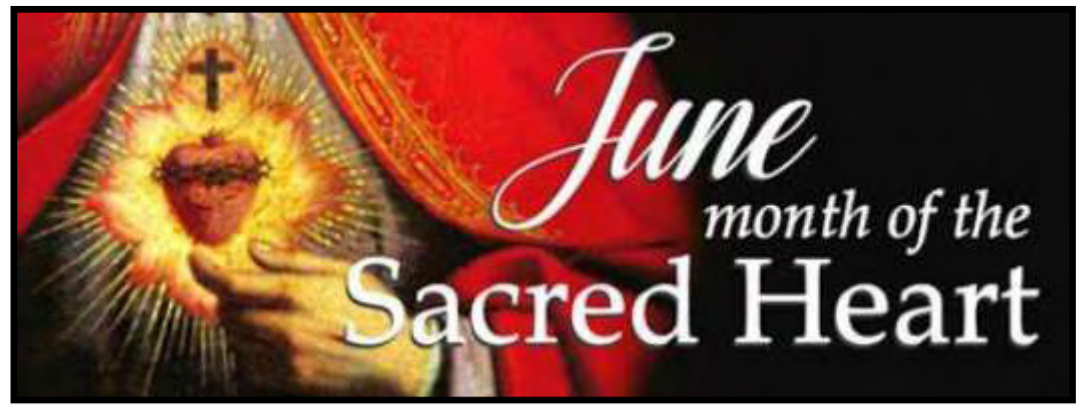
The Sacrament of Reconciliation, commonly known as confession, or the Sacrament of Penance, is open to children who are also preparing to receive their first Holy Communion.


The importance of becoming sensitive to right and wrong and making responsible choices begins at an early age: children are encouraged to form the habit of frequent confession.

There are four steps in the Sacrament of Reconciliation:

- 1) We feel contrition for our sins and a conversion of heart to change our ways.
- 2) We confess our sins and human sinfulness to a priest.
- 3) We receive and accept forgiveness (absolution) and are absolved of our sins.
- 4) We celebrate God's everlasting love for us and commit to live out a Christian life.

First Reconciliation celebrations are being held next Tuesday and Wednesday at Sacred Heart and OLPS churches respectively.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, by faith we are judged righteous and at peace with God, since it is by faith and through Jesus that we have entered this state of grace in which we can boast about looking forward to God's glory. But that is not all we can boast about; we can boast about our sufferings. These sufferings bring patience, as we know, and patience brings perseverance, and perseverance brings hope, and this hope is not deceptive, because the love of God has been poured into our hearts by the Holy Spirit which has been given us.

Gospel

Jn 16: 12-15

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples:

'I still have many things to say to you
But they would be too much for you now.
But when the Spirit of truth comes
He will lead you to the complete truth,
Since he will not be speaking as from himself
But will say only what he has learnt;
And he will tell you of the things to come.
He will glorify me,
Since all he tells you
Will be taken from what is mine.
Everything the Father has is mine;
That is why I said:
All he tells you
Will be taken from what is mine.'

Reflection

How can we know God personally and grow in our understanding of his wisdom, truth, and love for us? Jesus made a claim which only God can make - he knows all things - the present and the past, as well as the future. Jesus not only claims to speak the truth, he calls himself the very source of truth when he proclaims that he is the way, the truth and the life (John 14:6). Now Jesus promises to send his disciples the Spirit of truth who will guide them in understanding all that Jesus came to say and do! Jesus tells his disciples that it is the role of the Holy Spirit to reveal what is true. It is through the gift and working of the Holy Spirit, who enlightens our hearts and minds, that we come

to understand that the Godhead is a trinity of persons - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

One Father, One Son, and One Holy Spirit perfectly united

The Jews understood God as Creator and Father of all that he made (Deuteronomy 32:6) and they understood Israel (the promised son and his heirs) as God's firstborn son (Exodus 4:22). Jesus reveals the true nature of God the Father in an unheard of sense. He is eternally Father by his relationship to his eternal and only-begotten Son, who, reciprocally, is Son only in relation to his Father (see Matthew 11:27). The Spirit, likewise, is inseparably one with the Father and the Son. Jesus reveals the triune nature of God and the inseparable union of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

The mission of Jesus and the Spirit is one

The mission of Jesus and of the Holy Spirit are the same - to reveal the glory of God and to share that glory with us by uniting us in a community of love with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. That is why Jesus tells his disciples that the Spirit will reveal the glory of the Father and the Son and will speak what is true. Before his Passover, Jesus revealed the Holy Spirit as the 'Paraclete' and Helper who will be with Jesus' disciples to teach and guide them "into all the truth" (John 14:17,26; 16:13). The ultimate end, the purpose for which God created us, is the entry of God's creatures into the perfect unity of the blessed Trinity. In baptism we are called to share in the life of the Holy Trinity here on earth in faith and after death in eternal light.

Clement of Alexandria (150-215 AD), an early church father and teacher at the catechetical school in Alexandria, wrote: "What an astonishing mystery! There is one Father of the universe, one Logos (Word) of the universe, and also one Holy Spirit, everywhere one and the same; there is also one virgin become mother, and I should like to call her 'Church'."

Jesus, through the Holy Spirit, unites us with the Father

How can we personally know the Father and his Son, our Lord Jesus Christ? It is the Holy Spirit who reveals the Father and the Son to us and who gives us the gift of faith to know and understand the truth of God's word. Through the Holy Spirit, we proclaim our ancient faith in the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ until he comes again. The Lord gives us his Holy Spirit as our divine Teacher and Helper that we may grow in the knowledge and wisdom of God. Do you seek the wisdom that comes from above and do you eagerly listen to God's word and obey it?

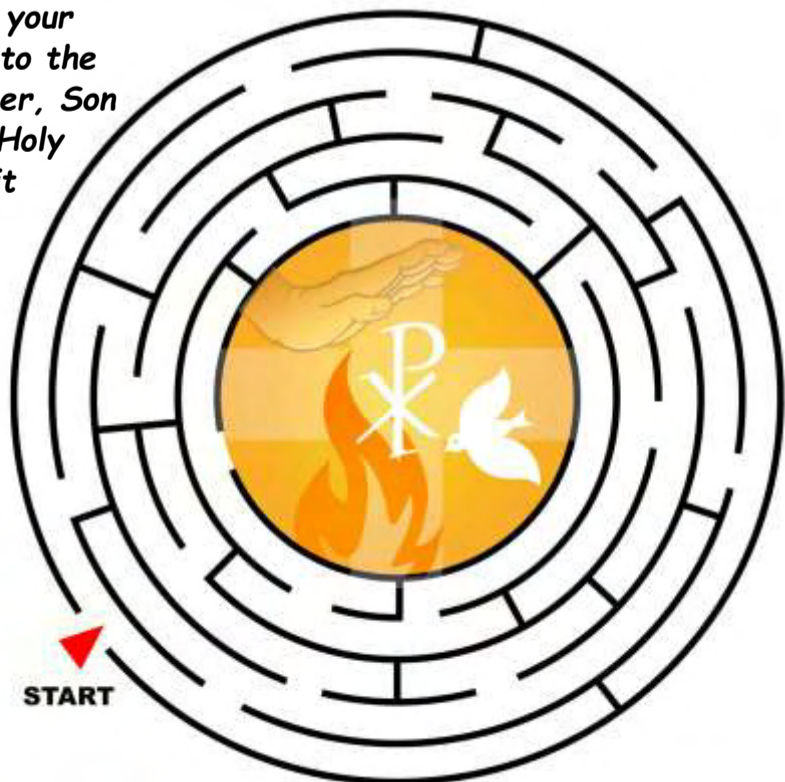

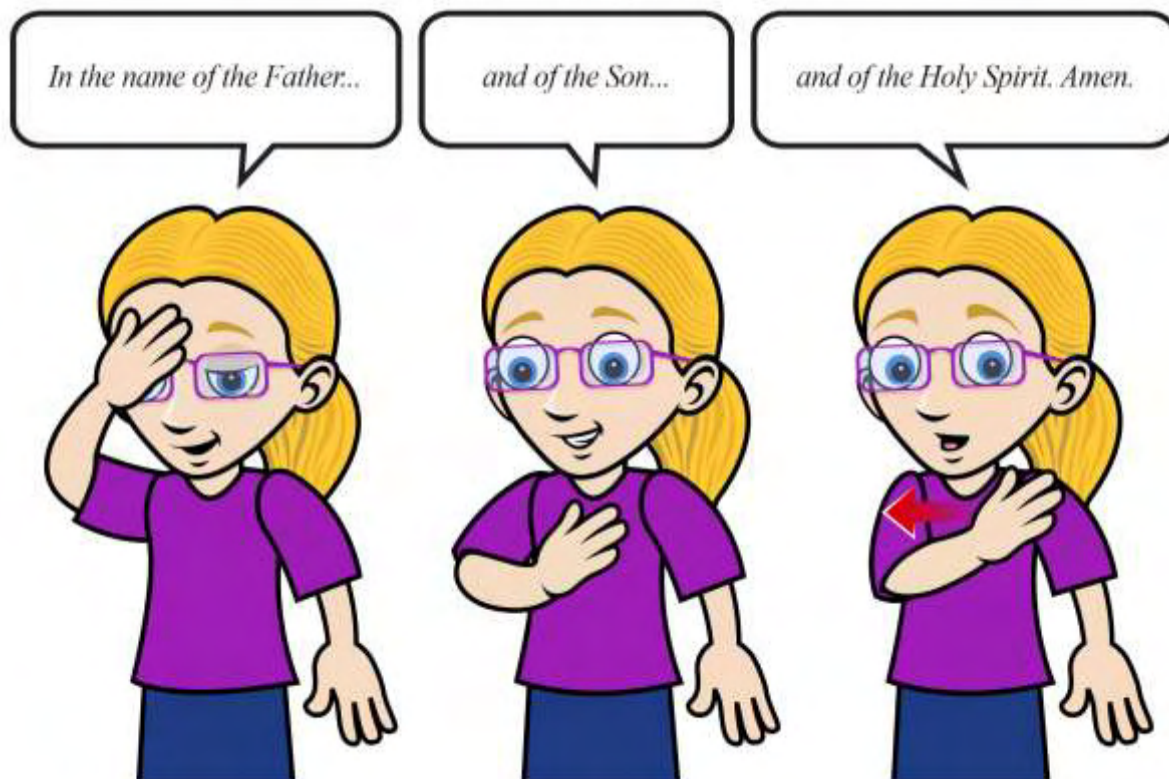
Children's Liturgy at Pymble Parish
