



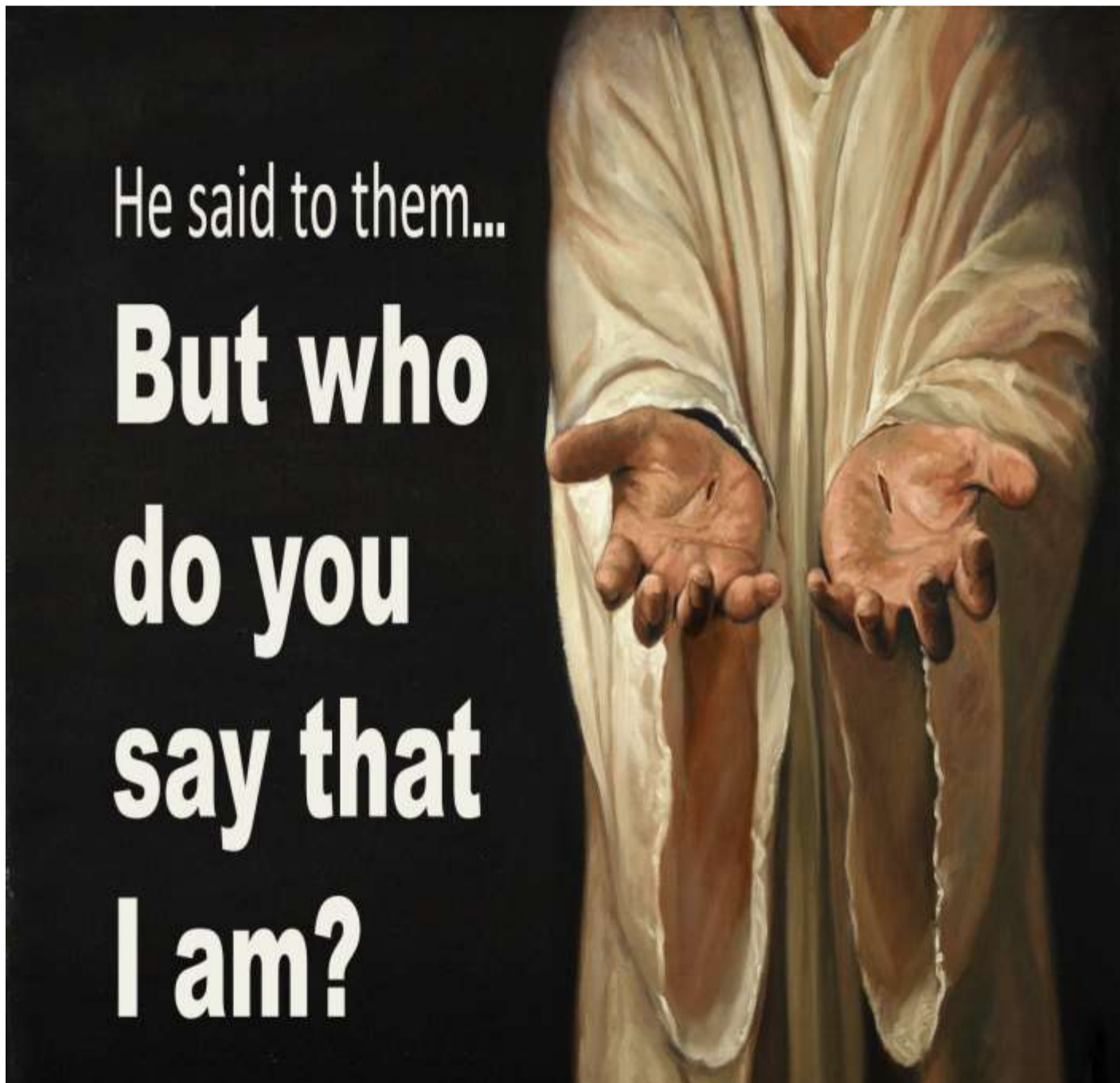

1. Introductory Rites

Find lyrics to a hymn online, or on YouTube

Leader: In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen

Leader: We place ourselves before the Lord, beginning with an act of contrition.

All: My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart. In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good, I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things. I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more, and to avoid whatever leads me to sin. Our Saviour Jesus Christ suffered and died for us. In his name, my God, have mercy.

2. Gloria

The Gloria is recited on Sundays outside of the Season of Lent and Advent

All: Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.

Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son, Lord God, Lamb of God, Son of the Father, you take away the sins of the world, have mercy on us; you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer; you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us. For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

3. Liturgy Of The Word

Readings

Readings are found in a Sunday missal. Or on this parish bulletin on the following pages.

Homily

Spend some time in silence, receiving the word of God. If you are in a group you may like to invite others to share the fruits of their reflection.

4. Profession Of Faith

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting.
Amen.

5. Prayers Of The Faithful

Pray for the Church, the world, our leaders, families, those suffering, the sick, the lonely special needs.

<State prayer intention>... Lord, hear us.

All: Lord, hear our prayer.

All: Merciful God, hear our fervent prayer for all who suffer from the coronavirus. May those who are infected receive the proper treatment and the comfort of your healing presence. May their caregivers, families and neighbours be shielded from the onslaught of the virus. Give solace to those who grieve the loss of loved ones. Protect and guide those who strive to find a cure, that their work may conquer the disease and restore communities to wholeness and health. Help us to rise above fear. Amen.

6. Our Father

Leader: At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

All: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

7. Spiritual Communion

8. Concluding Rites

Leader: May the Lord bless us, keep us from all evil and bring us to everlasting life.

All: Amen.

Finish with a final hymn or pray together a Hail Mary seeking the Blessed Virgin's intercession during this time.

you well; keep yourself warm and eat plenty,'
without giving them these bare necessities of
life, then what good is that? Faith is like that:

Gospel

Mk 8:27-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus and his disciples left for the villages
round Caesarea Philippi. On the way he put
this question to his disciples, 'Who do people
say I am?' And they told him. 'John the
Baptist,' they said, 'others Elijah; others again,
one of the prophets.' 'But you,' he asked,
'who do you say I am?' Peter spoke up and
said to him, 'You are the Christ.' And he gave
them strict orders not to tell anyone about
him.

And he began to teach them that the Son of
Man was destined to suffer grievously, to be
rejected by the elders and the chief priests
and the scribes, and to be put to death, and
after three days to rise again; and he said all
this quite openly. Then, taking him aside,
Peter started to remonstrate with him. But,
turning and seeing his disciples, he rebuked
Peter and said to him, 'Get behind me, Satan!
Because the way you think is not God's way
but man's.'

He called the people and his disciples to him
and said, 'If anyone wants to be a follower of
mine, let him renounce himself and take up
his cross and follow me. For anyone who
wants to save his life will lose it; but anyone
who loses his life for my sake, and for the
sake of the gospel, will save it.'

Gospel Reflection

**Jesus begins to explain the mission he was
sent to accomplish**

silent about his identity as the anointed Son
of God? They were, after all, appointed to
proclaim the good news to everyone. Jesus
knew that they did not yet fully understand
his mission and how he would accomplish it.
Cyril of Alexandria (376-444 AD), an early
church father, explains the reason for this
silence:

*There were things yet unfulfilled which must
also be included in their preaching about
him. They must also proclaim the cross, the
passion, and the death in the flesh. They must
preach the resurrection of the dead, that
great and truly glorious sign by which
testimony is borne him that the Emmanuel is
truly God and by nature the Son of God the
Father. He utterly abolished death and wiped
out destruction. He robbed hell, and
overthrew the tyranny of the enemy. He took
away the sin of the world, opened the gates
above to the dwellers upon earth, and united
earth to heaven. These things proved him to
be, as I said, in truth God. He commanded
them, therefore, to guard the mystery by a
seasonable silence until the whole plan of the
dispensation should arrive at a suitable
conclusion.*

God's Anointed Son must suffer and die to atone for our sins

Jesus told his disciples that it was necessary
for the Messiah to suffer and die in order
that God's work of redemption might be
accomplished. How startled the disciples
were when they heard this word. How
different are God's thoughts and ways from
our thoughts and ways (Isaiah 55:8). It was
through humiliation, suffering, and death on
the cross that Jesus broke the powers of sin
and death and won for us eternal life and
freedom from the slavery of sin and from
the oppression of our enemy, Satan, the
father of lies and the deceiver of humankind.

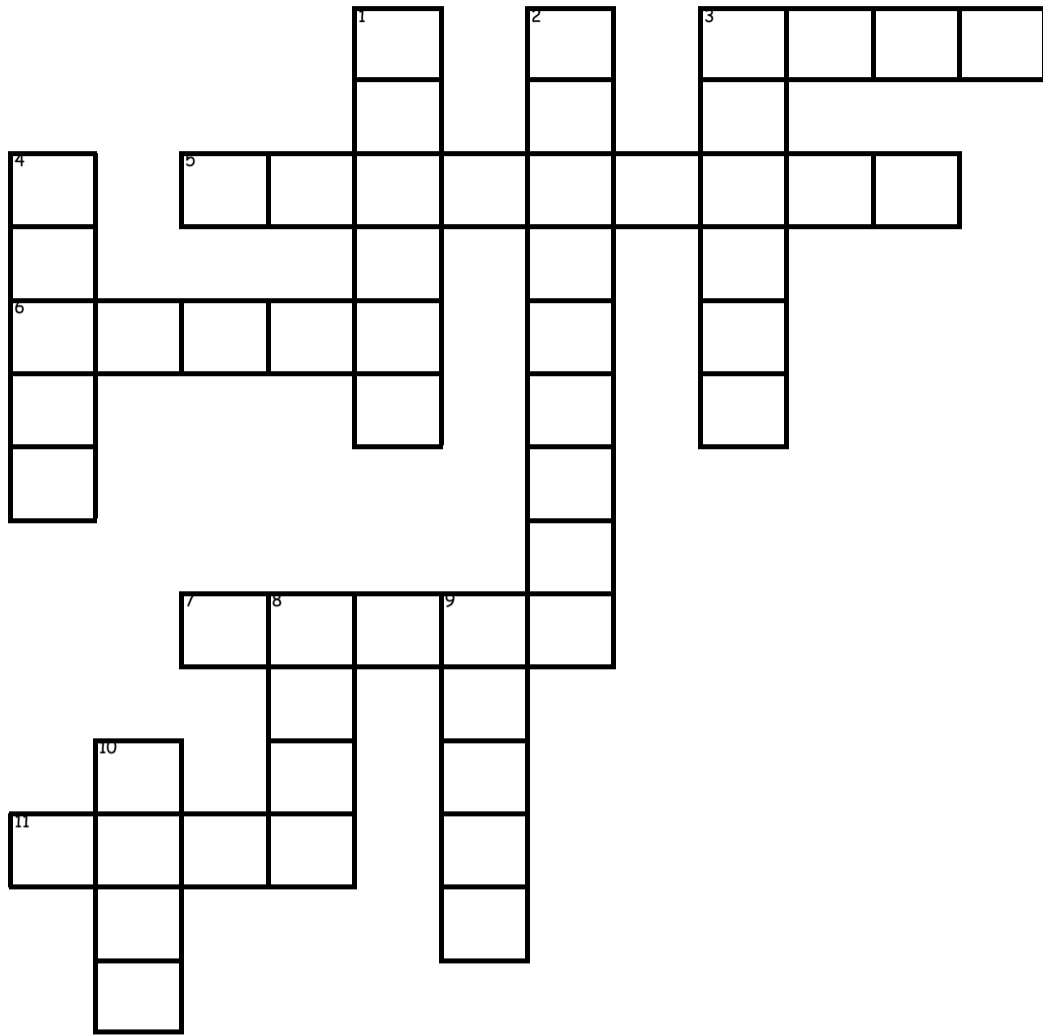
We, too, have a share in the mission and victory of Jesus Christ

If we want to share in the victory of the Lord
Jesus, then we must also take up our cross
and follow where he leads us. What is the
"cross" that you and I must take up each
day? When my will crosses with God's will,
then his will must be done. To know Jesus
Christ is to know the power of his victory on
