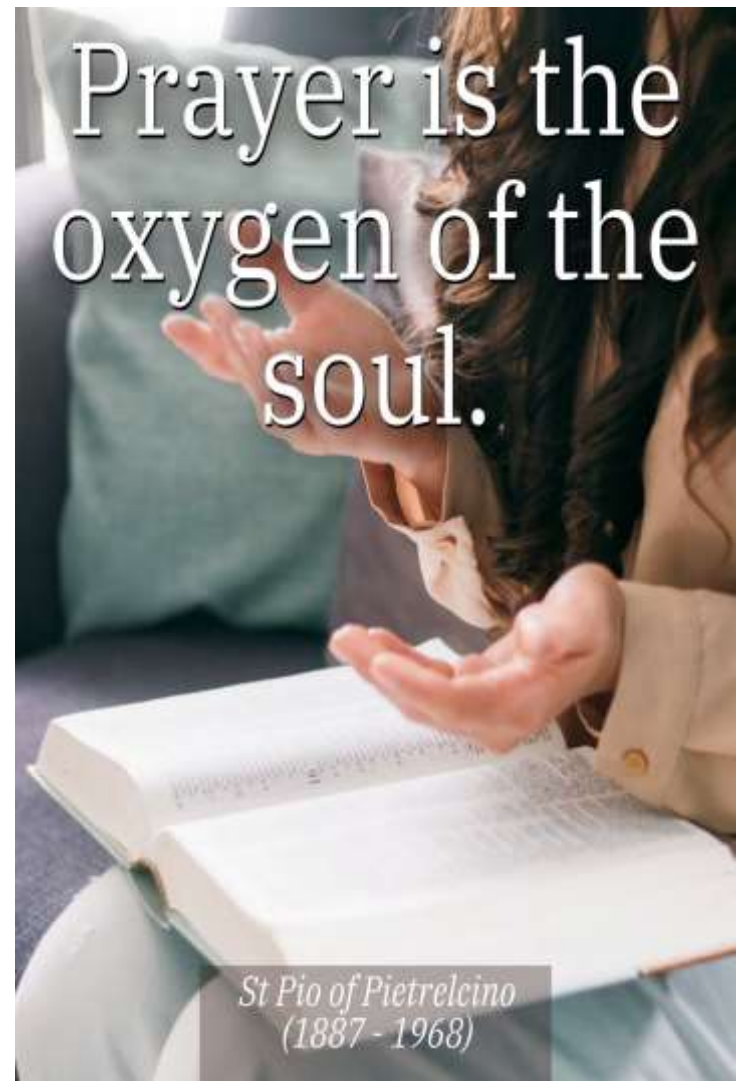

What is a Confirmation name?

A Confirmation name is best thought of as a name that God – and only God – calls you by. It is not a name that other people call you by, like a baptismal name. Ideally, a Confirmation name should be the name of a Saint whom you know something about, or who inspires you, or whose virtues you want to imitate. It is the name of a saint who will accompany you through life. It is a reminder of the day of your Confirmation, when you were anointed with the oil of the Holy Spirit.

RCIA Testimony My Journey to Catholicism Joshua Knox



Prior to my conversion, I was part of the Anglican church, but despite considering myself a devout Christian, in hindsight, my relationship then with God was rather tenuous. I rarely prayed and read my Bible outside of church, and even then, my primary focus at church was to socialize with my peers, with my devotion to God merely incidental.

However, in late September 2021, I felt a compelling call to convert to the Catholic Church, and so for about one year, I devoted myself to an in-depth study of Catholic doctrines and practices, especially the more challenging teachings such as Indulgences, Purgatory, the Marian dogmas, Transubstantiation, and Papal Infallibility. Further, I sought the counsel of the early Church Fathers, to evaluate whether the Catholic Church is truly authentic to the early church, further enriched through the RCIA program, about one year later.

The journey was met with numerous difficulties; I was unsure how my family and friends would react, and numerous times I doubted whether the Catholic Church was the true church established by the Apostles, or if I should convert to the Eastern Orthodox church instead. In the end, I chose the Catholic Church, based on my observation that it is the only church acting as a 'mother church' for all Christians, seeking to reverse the terrible schisms through history, through the establishment of the Eastern Catholic Churches, and the Personal Ordinariate.

My Confirmation this year at the Easter Vigil was one of the most joyful moments of my life, and now that I am a Catholic, my relationship with God has greatly flourished. My prayer life has become enriched by the great treasury of prayers and devotions, including the Liturgy of the Hours, the Holy Rosary, and the Chaplet of Divine Mercy; I have finally finished reading the New Testament, and am about half-way through the Old Testament; and all I desire is to worship God through the sacrifice of the Mass. My only concern now is that there are too many prayers and devotions in the Church's rich treasury. I have not yet reached full maturity in my faith, I doubt I will until the day I die, but I look forward to deepening my relationship with God as part of the one, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church.

Liturgy of the Word

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Entrance Antiphon

Proclaim a joyful sound and let it be heard;
proclaim to the ends of the earth:
The Lord has freed his people, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 8: 5-8, 14-17

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations

that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Gospel

Jn 14: 15-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Gospel Reflection

Meditation: What makes us both fully human and truly like God? Is it not unconditional love which is unselfish, undying, and wholly directed to the good of others? The love of God unites us in an unbreakable bond of fidelity, friendship, and community with others. Jesus loved his own until the very end of his passion and death on the cross (John 13:1).

The nature of love

From the very beginning of creation God said: it is not good that man should be alone (Genesis 2:18). We were created in love for love - to be a community of loving persons, just as the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are inseparably united in a community of unbreakable love.

John Henry Newman (1801-1890) said: We love because it is our nature to love, and it is our

nature because God the Holy Spirit has made it our nature. Jesus speaks to his disciples of the inseparable bond of love between himself and the Father, and of their love for humankind. In Jesus we see the fulness of God's love and how God's love is directed to our well-being. In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might have life through him (1 John 4:9).

Knowing God's love

How do we know that God truly loves each one of us? In the cross we see the proof of God's love for each of us and the incredible price God was willing to pay to redeem us from slavery to sin, death, and Satan. Jesus gave up his life that we might have life - abundant, everlasting life with God - a life of love and unity with the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit forever.

Through the cross Jesus opened a new way of relationship for us as the adopted sons and daughters of God - his beloved children (Romans 8:14-17). Jesus calls his disciples to walk in his way of love through obedience to the will of the Father. True love is more than sentiment, emotion, or good intention. As important as these may be they are not the proof of sincere love. True love for God is expressed in obedience and obedience is expressed in love.

Jesus' best gift for us

Jesus promised to give his followers the best of gifts, the Holy Spirit as their Counselor and Helper. How does the Holy Spirit help us as the counselor? Counselor is a legal term for one who defends someone against an adversary and who guides that person during the ordeal of trial. The Holy Spirit is our Advocate and Helper who guides and strengthens us and brings us safely through the challenges and adversities we must face in this life.

The Holy Spirit is also the Giver of life - the abundant life which comes from God and which sustains us forever. The Holy Spirit also guides us in the way of truth, wisdom, and goodness. We can never stop learning because the Spirit leads us more and more into the knowledge of God's love, truth, and goodness. Jesus also promised his followers the gift of peace. Peace is more than the absence of conflict or trouble. Peace includes everything which makes for our highest good. Trust in God, faith in his promises, and obedience to his word lead us to peace and security in God's presence. That is why a Christian need not fear or be troubled by anything. The love of Christ brings immeasurable joy and consolation even in the midst of our trials and suffering. Paul the Apostle states,

Ask the Holy Spirit to fill you with the knowledge of Christ's immense love and with his gift of peace. © SERVANTS OF THE WORD 2023
