



Pymble Parish COVID Update



Covid restrictions have further eased from this week. Both Sacred Heart and OLPS will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who at tend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified.

The following will apply until 15 December:

- The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the 2 sqm principle. This will be 260 for Sacred Heart Church, and 130 for OLPS Church. This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- Congregational singing will not be possible.
 - COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be reintroduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head;
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession;
 - It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

Please note that Bishop Anthony Randazzo has determined that the Broken Bay Sunday Obligation will remain suspended until 1 December 2021.

From 15 December 2021:

- Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- There will be no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.

The Expressions of Interest (EOI) campaign has now been finalised and we are at the point of presenting possible development options to the Parish at a further "consultation forum". Given the continuing restrictions in place, this forum will need to take place online via Zoom. It will be held at 4.00 - 5.00 pm on Tuesday 16 November 2021.

OLPS Religion in Kindy Term Four

It has been so lovely to be back in the classroom and to be able to enjoy our Religious learning through play-based learning! The last couple of weeks Kindy have been learning about what it means to be a good neighbour through the parable of the Good Samaritan. We have looked at the story through Godly play to recreate the event with figurines which the children always enjoy, we have explored words from the scripture as archaeologists in the sand pit and we have discussed how it demonstrates the concepts and actions of Mission and Love.

We have linked this idea of Mission to the Catholic Mission's Socktober outreach program by comparing our lives to those of children in the poorer parts of Thailand. We learned how those that have less, get very creative with what resources they do have to make toys if they can't afford to but them. 

This Week's Gospel Reading (Mk 13:24-32) Thirty-Third Sunday of Ordinary Time

This Sunday is the second to last Sunday of our liturgical year. As we approach the end of the Church year, our Gospel invites us to consider Jesus' predictions and teaching about the end of the world. In the context of Mark's Gospel, Jesus' words about this are spoken to his disciples as he prepares them for his passion and death.

Before we consider Jesus' words, it is important to note the political backdrop against which many think Mark's Gospel was written. Most scholars concur that Mark wrote his Gospel for Christians living in or near Rome about 30 to 40 years after the death of Jesus. This was a time of political turmoil in Rome. Some Christians experienced persecution by the Romans during the reign of the emperor Nero (about 64 A.D.).

Jewish revolutionaries rebelled against the Romans, which led the Romans to destroy the Temple in Jerusalem in 70 A.D. In this time of political turmoil and persecution, many in Mark's community might have wondered if the end times predicted by Jesus were in fact quite near.

Last Sunday we heard Jesus' observation about the contributions being made to the temple treasury and the example of sacrificial giving that he saw in the poor widow's offering. If we had been reading Mark's Gospel continuously, we would have heard Jesus predict the destruction of the Temple, his teaching about the costs of discipleship, and the woes that will accompany the end times. Finally, we would have heard Jesus instruct his disciples about the need for watchfulness so that they will not be caught unprepared for this final day of judgment.

In today's Gospel, Jesus continues this teaching by offering his disciples signs to look for that will indicate that the coming of the Son of Man is near. His words and images draw upon Old Testament imagery, especially images found in the Book of Daniel. Next, Jesus offers the lesson of the fig tree, a parable that teaches that if one knows how to read the signs, one can be prepared for the end times. Jesus also

teaches, however, that no one knows when the end time will come,

except the Father. In the verses that follow this reading in Mark's Gos-

pel, Jesus continues to warn his disciples to be on watch for this end time.

Jesus' words are not spoken to frighten his disciples, nor should they

frighten us. Rather, they are offered to prepare us for the changes we

Jesus' first coming was a rescue mission - to free the human race from slavery to sin and Satan - the father of lies. His second coming will be the final completion of his mission when he will "make all things new" - a new heavens and a new earth - after he has put down the last enemy which is death and restores our lowly bodies to immortality when death will be no more (Daniel 12:2-3).

The sign of the budding fig tree

What lesson does the Lord Jesus want us to learn from the parable of the budding fig tree? The fig tree was a common and important source of food for the Jews. It bore fruit twice a year, in the autumn and in the early spring. The prophet Joel mentions its fruit-bearing as a sign of favor from the Lord (Joel 2:22). The Talmud (a Jewish commentary and instruction on the Torah or Five Books of Moses) said that the first fruit came the day after Passover. The Jews believed that when the Messiah came he would usher in the kingdom of God at Passover time.

This parable foretells the joy of God's kingdom - the joy of new life and the promise of a new age of peace and blessing. The signs of spring are evident for all who can see. Just so are the signs of God's kingdom. The "budding" of God's kingdom begins first in the hearts of those who are receptive to God's word. Those who trust in God's word will bear the fruits of his kingdom. 
