

Pymble Parish Covid Update

As you may be aware, the NSW Government has outlined a roadmap to ease Covid restrictions when vaccination rates reach 70% and 80% of the adult population.



Considering the roadmap and all its implications for the Faithful of Broken Bay, Bishop Anthony has announced and determined the following to apply:

- 1. From Monday 11 October our churches will be reopened for private prayer and devotion **only**. It is for our people to be mindful of government requirements for this stage of the Roadmap and to engage this opportunity with a sense of responsibility and COVID safety. During this stage:
 - Our Churches will be open from 9am to 5pm a.
 - Public Masses remain suspended and "private" Masses b. with a congregation will not take place.
 - Confessions will not be publicly scheduled but most с. certainly will be available by personal arrangement with the clergy of the parish.
 - Baptisms, unless in the event of impending death, should d. be delayed until the next stage.
 - Weddings and funerals: up to 50 people may attend. e. These need to be vaccinated.
- From the Monday after 80% vaccination rate has been 2. achieved, public Masses will resume in all our churches according to our usual schedule. In accordance with the government regulation, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified. During this stage:
 - Other rituals such as Baptisms and other services of a. prayer and devotion will resume.
 - Confessions will be publicly scheduled again. b.
 - The number of people who can attend Mass and other с. liturgies and services of prayer is based on the 4 sqm principle (uncapped), including for funerals and weddings.
 - d. Congregational singing will not be possible, but a musician and cantor are possible and will be engaged for the beauty of the liturgy.
 - COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our e. liturgies will be re-introduced including:
 - i. Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for ii. the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple iii. bow or nod of the head.
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the iv. tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession.
 - f. It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask

We will continue to communicate to you our plans in the coming weeks.

Currently, all Church services and events remain cancelled. The Public Health Order allows a priest to go to a house for pastoral care but only the residents of that house can be present.

Funerals and Weddings can be held at both our Churches, with a maximum of 100 people.






