Religious Education in Class 3/4 W at Sacred Heart

This term Stage Two has been learning about our Parish. We have spent time exploring the history of our parish and we have been fascinated by some of our discoveries.

Many knew the building on Pacific Highway, yet had not realised that it had previously been Sacred Heart Church. We were really interested to see photos of what the church looked like inside when the building was our Parish Church.

Our Parish has had a very interesting history and we spent a lot of time researching on the Parish website some of the facts that we discovered were:

- In 1930 Fr Patrick Crowley was appointed Parish Priest of Pymble and he was the Parish Priest for an astounding 45 years.
- In 1989 Sacred Heart Parish celebrated its centenary. This was also the year that the building on Pacific Highway was sold to Ku-Ring-Gai Council. The last Mass was celebrated there on 1 December. Following the Mass the congregation processed with Bishop Patrick Murphy carrying the Blessed Sacrament, to the Marian Hall as the Marian Hall became the interim church.
- If we fast forward to 2001 Bishop Walker invited the Society of the Divine Saviour, commonly known as Salvatorians, a Religious Community, founded in Rome in 1881, to take responsibility for the Parish. Fr Tadeusz Seremet was installed as Parish Priest.
- In 2006 the churches of Sacred Heart Pymble and Our Lady of Perpetual Succour West Pymble came together to become the Pymble Catholic Parish.
- A more recent event in our Parish history occurred this year with the end of Fr Boguslaw Loska and Fr Christopher Kowalczyk's time with us and the arrival of our new Parish Priest Fr Ireneusz Czech in March, and then in July Fr Paul Tran joined the Parish as Assistant Parish Priest.

Our Parish has such a rich history and continues to reach out to others in so many ways. Thank you to all who have contributed over many years to this special Catholic community.

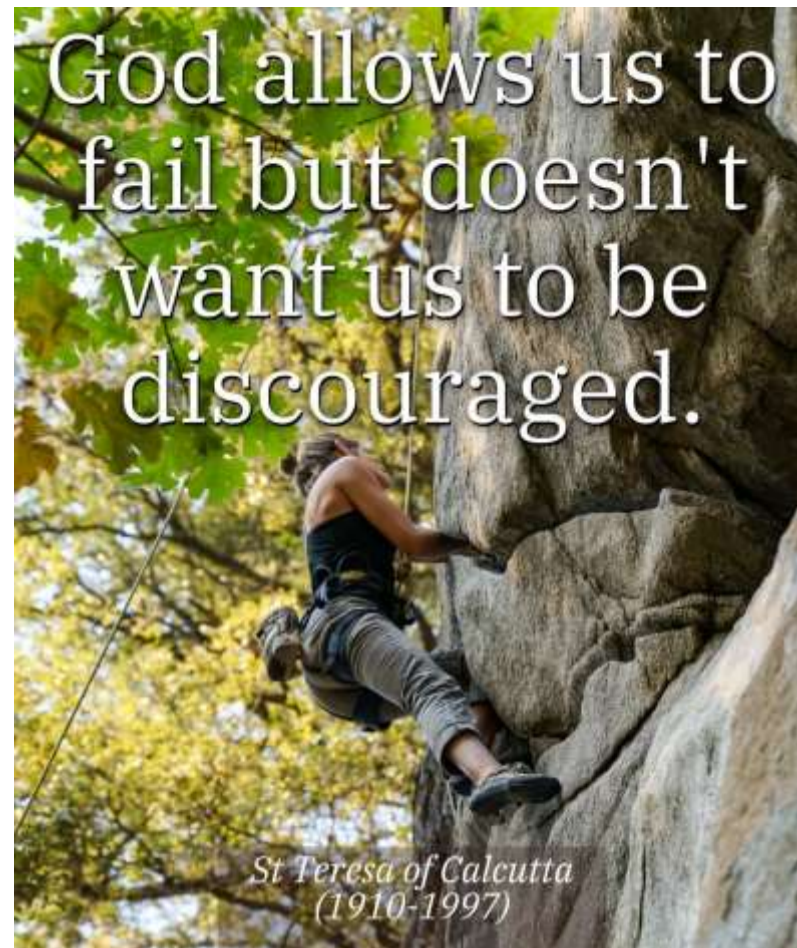



Gospel

Lk 23: 35-43

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The people stayed there before the cross watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. 'He saved others,' they said, 'let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.' The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, 'If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.' Above him there was an inscription: 'This is the King of the Jews.'

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. 'Are you not the Christ?' he said. 'Save yourself and us as well.' But the other spoke up and rebuked him. 'Have you no fear of God at all?' he said. 'You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong, Jesus,' he said, 'remember me when you come into your kingdom.' 'Indeed, I promise you,' he replied, 'today you will be with me in paradise.'

Gospel Reflection

God is King and Ruler over all

What is the significance and meaning of Jesus' kingship for us? Kingship today seems outdated and useless, especially in democratic societies where everyone is supposed to be treated equal and free. Many rulers in past ages claimed they had sovereign authority to rule by divine edict. But God did not give his people Israel a king at first. Why? Because God alone was their King and they needed no other. Nonetheless, God relented and chose David as King over Israel with the promise that God would raise up

through David's royal line a Saviour who would establish an everlasting kingdom of righteousness and peace that would endure for all ages.

The Jews understood that the Messiah ("Anointed One") would come as God's anointed King to restore paradise and establish God's reign of peace for them. They wanted a Messianic King who would free them from strife and division and from foreign oppression. Many had high hopes that Jesus would be the Messiah and Ruler for Israel. Little did they understand what kind of kingship Jesus claimed to possess.

Jesus' claim to kingship

Jesus came to deliver his people, and the whole world, from the worst kind of tyranny possible - from bondage to sin, guilt and condemnation, and from the wages of sin which is death (Romans 6:23) and separation from an all-merciful and just Father who gave us his son to set us free and to adopt us as his beloved sons and daughters. Jesus came to conquer hearts and souls for an imperishable kingdom - a kingdom ruled not by force or fear - but by the power of God's righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit.

Jesus came to restore Paradise for us - everlasting life with God

As Jesus was crucified on the cross alongside two criminals who were thieves, one mocked him for his claim to divine kingship. But the other thief recognized through the eyes of faith that Jesus was truly God's Anointed King and Savior. He petitioned Jesus to treat his poor soul with mercy and pardon, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). Jesus not only granted him forgiveness, but a place with him in his everlasting kingdom. "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Jesus died not only as King of the Jews, but as King of all nations and Lord of the universe. His victory over the power of sin, Satan, and the world was accomplished through his atoning death on the cross and his resurrection on the third day. Jesus exchanged a throne of glory for a cross of shame to restore us from slavery to sin to glory with God as his adopted sons and daughters. That is why the Father exalted his Son and raised him in glory over the heavens and the earth. In the Book of Revelation Jesus is called *King of kings and Lord of lords* (Revelation 19:16). He now sits in glory at the right hand of the Father in heaven - and from his throne he rules as Lord over all. Do you recognize Jesus Christ as your Sovereign King and Redeemer?

Lord Jesus Christ, you are my King and there is no other. Be the Lord and Master of my heart, mind, body, and soul. May I always seek to do your will and to serve your kingdom above all else.
