Pymble Parish COVID Update

Covid restrictions have further eased from this week. Both Sacred Heart and OLPS will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified.

The following will apply **until 15 December:**

- The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the **2 sqm principle**. **This will be 260 for Sacred Heart Church, and 130 for OLPS Church.** This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- Congregational singing will not be possible.
- COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be re-introduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head;
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession;
 - **It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.**

Please note that Bishop Anthony Randazzo has determined that the Broken Bay Sunday Obligation will remain suspended until 1 December 2021.

From 15 December 2021:

- Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- There will be no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.

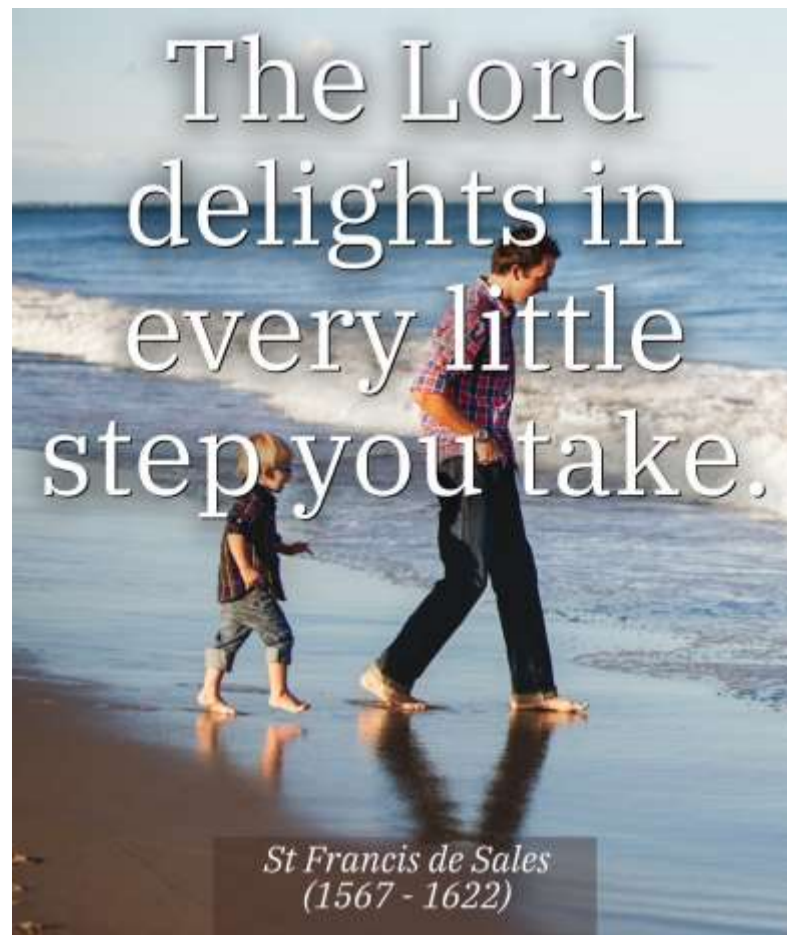

Gospel

Jn 18:33-37

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

'Are you the king of the Jews?' Pilate asked.
Jesus replied, 'Do you ask this of your own
accord, or have others spoken to you about
me?' Pilate answered, 'Am I a Jew? It is your
own people and the chief priests who have
handed you over to me: what have you
done?' Jesus replied, 'Mine is not a kingdom
of this world; if my kingdom were of this
world, my men would have fought to prevent
my being surrendered to the Jews. But my
kingdom is not of this kind.' 'So you are a
king then?' said Pilate. 'It is you who say it'
answered Jesus. 'Yes, I am a king. I was born
for this, I came into the world for this: to bear
witness to the truth; and all who are on the
side of truth listen to my voice.'

Gospel Reflection

'God is King and Ruler over all

What is the significance or meaning of Jesus'
kingship for us? Kingship today seems
antiquated, especially in democratic societies
where everyone is treated equal and free.
God at first did not want to give his people
Israel a king. Why? Because God alone was
their King and they needed no other.
Nonetheless, God relented and promised his
people that through David's line he would
establish a Ruler and a Kingdom that would
last for eternity (Psalm 89:29).

The Jews understood that the Messiah
("Anointed One") would come as God's
anointed King to restore paradise and
establish God's reign of everlasting peace for
them. They wanted a Messianic King who
would free them from strife and division and
from foreign oppression. Many had high
hopes that Jesus would be the Messiah and
Ruler for Israel. Little did they understand
what kind of kingship Jesus claimed to
possess.

Jesus' claim to kingship

Jesus came to deliver his people, and the
whole world, from the worst kind of tyranny
possible - from bondage to sin,
condemnation and death, and to free us from
Satan's kingdom of deception, oppression,
and destruction. Jesus came to conquer
hearts and souls for an unshakeable kingdom
- a kingdom ruled not by force or fear - but
by the power of God's righteousness, peace,
and joy in the Holy Spirit (Romans 14:17).

When Satan tempted Jesus during his forty
day fast in the wilderness, he offered Jesus all
the kingdoms of the world (Matthew 4:8-9)
Jesus knew that the world was in Satan's
power. And this was precisely why Jesus came
- to overthrow Satan's power and deception
over the earth.

Jesus knew that the way to victory was
through submission to his Father's will and
strategy for overcoming sin and Satan in the
world. The Father sent his only begotten Son
into the world, not to condemn it, but to
save it through the atoning sacrifice which
Jesus would make for us through the
shedding of his blood on the cross of
Calvary.

As Jesus was dying on the cross, he was
mocked for his claim to kingship.
Nonetheless, he died not only as King of the
Jews, but King of all the nations as well. His
victory over the power of sin, Satan, and the
world, was accomplished through his death
on the cross and his rising from the tomb on
the third day - never to die again. Jesus
exchanged a throne of glory for a cross of
shame to restore us from slavery to sin to
glory with God as his adopted sons and
daughters. In the Book of Revelations Jesus
is called King of kings and Lord and lords.
Do you recognize Jesus Christ as your King
and Lord?

Which ruler and kingdom will you serve?

The Scriptures tell us that there are
ultimately only two kingdoms in this world
which are opposed to one another - the
kingdom of light and the kingdom of
darkness. Each kingdom is ruled by one lord
or master - the Lord Jesus Christ who is the
true "Light of the World" - or the false
messiah and ruler who is called the "anti-
Christ" and an "angel of light" who rules by
lies and deception.

If we follow the Lord Jesus Christ he will
open our eyes to the light of his truth and
guide us on the course that leads to our true
homeland and security with God. If we
follow the course which is set by the world -
a world which is opposed to Christ and
blinded by the Deceiver who is Satan - then
we will discover that sin, pride, and greed
will lead us down a path of destruction,
division, and death rather than life,
community, and freedom.

Which kingdom will you serve - today and
for all eternity? The kingdom of this present
world which passes away or God's kingdom
which can never be broken or defeated and
which endures forever? If we accept Jesus
Christ as our Lord and King we become
citizens of an everlasting kingdom which is
governed by God's righteousness, peace,
and love. Is your life submitted to the
Lordship of Jesus Christ who reigns now and
forever in the glory of his eternal Father in
heaven?

***Lord Jesus Christ, you are my King and
there is no other. Be the Lord and Master
of my heart, mind, body, and soul. May I
always seek to do your will and to serve
your kingdom above all else.***

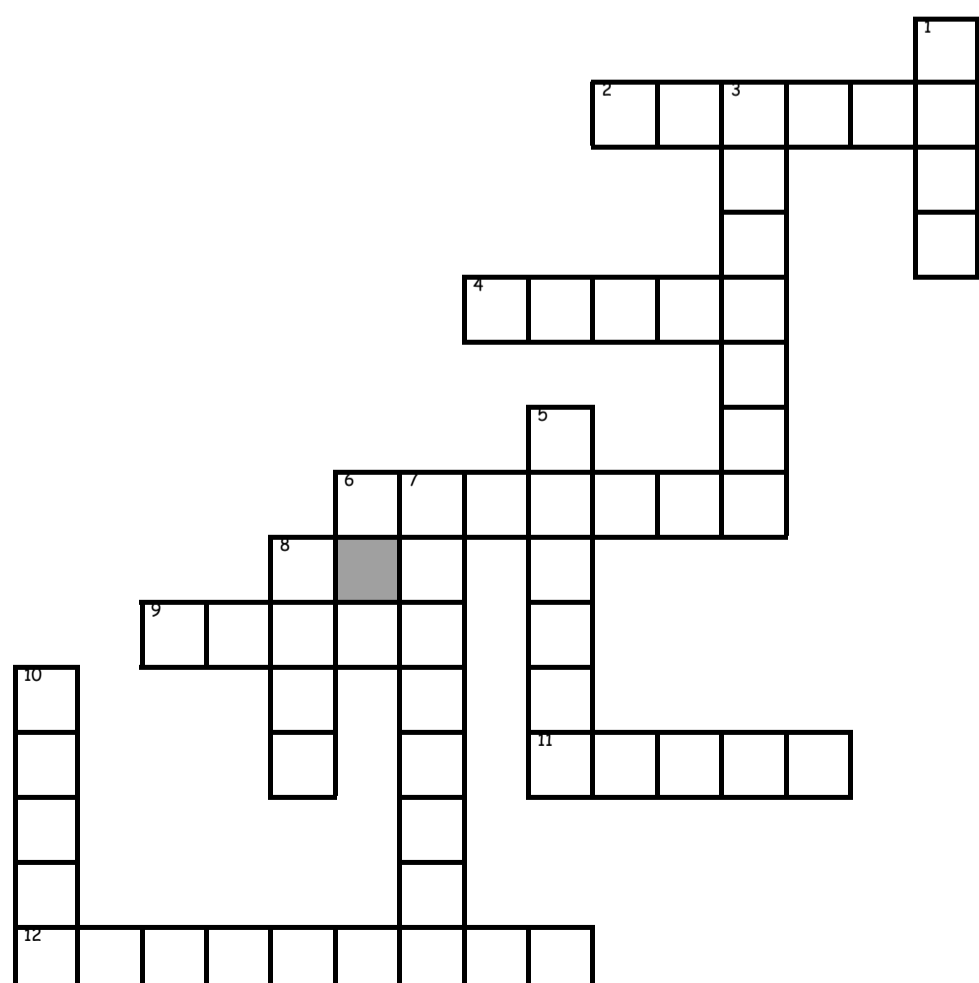
