#### Why I became a Catholic - Yolandi le Roux

I come from a Protestant background, and faith has always been a part of my life. But even from a young age, I found myself drawn to the Catholic Church in ways I couldn't always explain. One of my earliest experiences of this was in Catholic preschool - it left a lasting impression on me. I remember it not just as a place of education, but as something deeply spiritual and beautiful.

That quiet pull toward Catholicism stayed with me. Over the years, it became stronger, especially as I started thinking about the kind of spiritual foundation I wanted for my family. When it came time to choose schools for my children, we decided on Catholic high schools. That decision, along with my own growing interest and curiosity, prompted me to begin the RCIA process and formally enter into the Catholic Church.

Another important chapter in my journey was walking the Camino de Santiago. That pilgrimage was a deeply spiritual experience - one that helped me reconnect with the guiet voice of God and with the idea of faith as a journey, not just a destination. It reminded me that God meets us on the road, in the stillness, and in the steps we take every

Since becoming Catholic, I've felt a real shift spiritually. I feel closer to God now, in a daily and intentional way. Practices like praying the rosary have become part of my rhythm, helping me stay centred and connected. The richness of Catholic tradition - the liturgy, the sacraments, the saints, the art and music - has added a depth and beauty to my faith that I had always been searching for.

What has stood out most, though, is the sense of community. There's something about the Catholic Church that feels like home - a place for everyone, no matter where they're coming from. After completing RCIA, I felt not just welcomed, but encouraged. I found myself wanting to give back, to contribute, to serve - whether it's assisting the elderly or finding other ways to be involved in my parish and local community.

That sense of purpose and belonging has been one of the most unexpected and fulfilling gifts of journey.

Becoming Catholic wasn't just about changing denominations - it was about stepping into something larger than myself. It was about embracing mystery, tradition, service, and communion with God and others. And in doing so, I've found a faith that feels not only rooted, but alive.





# Liturgy of the Word The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

#### Entrance Antiphon Cf Psalm 80:17

He fed them with the finest wheat and satisfied them with honey from the rock. The Gloria in excelsis (Glory to God in the highest) is said.

#### First Reading Genesis 14:18-20

#### A reading from the book of Genesis

Melchizedek king of Salem brought bread and wine; he was a priest of God Most High. He pronounced this blessing: 'Blessed be Abraham by God Most High, creator of heaven and earth, and blessed be God Most High for handing over your enemies to you.' And Abraham gave him a tithe of everything.

#### Responsorial Psalm Ps 109:1-4. R. v.4

#### (R.) You are a priest for ever, in the line of Melchisedek

- 1. The Lord's revelation to my Master: 'Sit on my right: I will put your foes beneath your feet.' (R.)
- 2. The Lord will send from Zion your sceptre of power: rule in the midst of all your foes (R.)
- 3. A prince from the day of your birth on the holy mountains; from the womb before the daybreak I begot you. (R.)
- 4. The Lord has sworn an oath he will not change. 'You are a priest for ever, a priest like Melchizedek of old.' (R.)

#### Second Reading 1 Corinthians 11:23-26

#### A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

This is what I received from the Lord, and in turn passed on to you: that on the same night that he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread, and thanked God for it and broke it, and he said, 'This is my body, which is for you; do this as a memorial of me.' In the same way he took the cup after supper, and said, 'This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Whenever you drink it, do this as a memorial of me.' Until the Lord comes, therefore, every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are proclaiming his death.

#### Sequence

Behold the bread of angels, sent For pilgrims in their banishment, The bread for God's true children meant, That may not unto dogs be given: Oft in the olden types foreshowed; In Isaac on the altar bowed, And in the ancient paschal food, And in the manna sent from heaven.

O thou, the wisest, mightiest, best, Our present food, our future rest, Come, make us each thy chosen guest, Co-heirs of thine, and comrades blest With saints whose dwelling is with thee.

#### Gospel Luke 9:11-17

#### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus made the crowds welcome and talked to them about the kingdom of God; and he cured those who were in need of healing.

It was late afternoon when the Twelve came to him and said, 'Send the people away, and they can go to the villages and farms round about to find lodging and food; for we are in a lonely place here.' He replied, 'Give them something to eat yourselves.' But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people.' For there were about five thousand men. But he said to his disciples, 'Get them to sit down in parties of about fifty.' They did so and made them all sit down. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. They all ate as much as they wanted, and when the scraps remaining were collected they filled twelve baskets.

#### **Gospel Reflection**

Meditation: Who is Jesus for you - and what difference does he make in your life? Many in Israel recognized Jesus as a mighty man of God, even comparing him with the greatest of the prophets. Peter, always quick to respond whenever Jesus spoke, professed that Jesus was truly the "Christ of God" - "the Son of the living God" (Matthew 16:16). No mortal being resurrection. The Holy Spirit gives each of us could have revealed this to Peter, but only God. Through the "eyes of faith" Peter discovered who Jesus truly was. recognized that Jesus was much more than a great teacher, prophet, and miracle worker. gospel faithfully, and the courage to witness Peter was the first apostle to publicly declare that Jesus was the Anointed One, consecrated by the Father and sent into the world to redeem a fallen human race enslaved to sin and cut off from eternal life with God (Luke 9:20, Acts 2:14-36). The word for "Christ" in Greek is a translation of the Hebrew word for "Messiah" - both words literally mean the Anointed One.

#### Jesus begins to explain the mission he was sent to accomplish

Why did Jesus command his disciples to be silent about his identity as the anointed Son of God? They were, after all, appointed to proclaim the good news to everyone. Jesus knew that they did not yet fully understand his mission and how he would accomplish it. Cyril of Alexandria (376-444 AD), an early church father, explains the reason for this silence:

There were things yet unfulfilled which must also be included in their preaching about him. They must also proclaim the cross, the passion, and the death in the flesh. They must preach the resurrection of the dead, that great and truly glorious sign by which testimony is borne him that the Emmanuel is truly God and by nature the Son of God the Father. He utterly abolished death and wiped out destruction. He robbed hell, and overthrew the tyranny of the enemy. He took away the sin of the world, opened the gates above to the dwellers upon earth, and united earth to heaven. These things proved him to be, as I said, in truth God. He commanded them, therefore, to guard the mystery by a seasonable silence until the whole plan of the dispensation should arrive at a suitable conclusion. (Commentary on Luke, Homily 49)

#### God's Anointed Son must suffer and die to atone for our sins

Jesus told his disciples that it was necessary for the Messiah to suffer and die in order that God's work of redemption might be accomplished. How startled the disciples were when they heard this word. How different are God's thoughts and ways from our thoughts and ways (Isaiah 55:8). It was through humiliation, suffering, and death on the cross that Jesus broke the powers of sin and death and won for us eternal life and freedom from the slavery of sin and from the oppression of our enemy, Satan, the father of lies and the deceiver of humankind.

#### We, too, have a share in the mission and victory of Jesus Christ

If we want to share in the victory of the Lord Jesus, then we must also take up our cross and follow where he leads us. What is the "cross" that you and I must take up each day? When my will crosses (does not align) with God's will, then his will must be done. To know Jesus Christ is to know the power of his victory on the cross where he defeated sin and conquered death through his the gifts and strength we need to live as sons and daughters of God. 


### Children's Liturgy


