Pymble Parish COVID Update

Based on the current Public Health Orders, both Sacred Heart and OLPS will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified.

The following apply to our Churches:

- There will not be a density limit on our Churches, Parish office or meeting rooms.
- Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies have been re-introduced as follows:

- Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
- The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
- The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head;
- Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession.

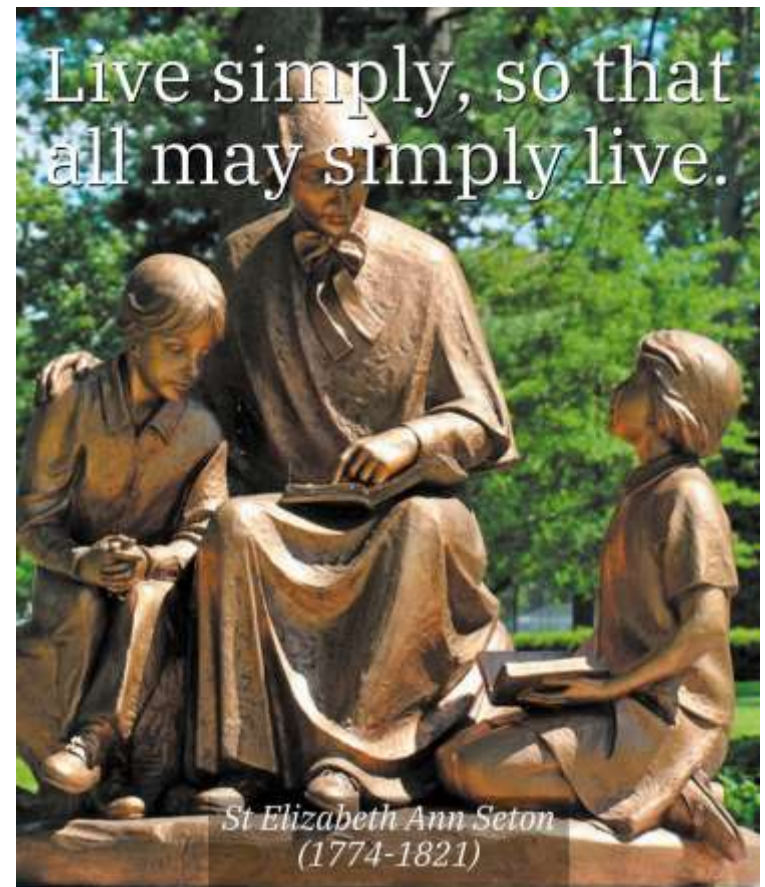

Cana Marriage Formation

About Cana Marriage Formation

Today, Christian spouses are in great need of a path that leads them to respond to the universal call to holiness as addressed to them by the Second Vatican Council. In Lumen Gentium, through the sacrament of marriage, spouses receive an abundance of grace to assist them in fulfilling their vocation to holiness. However, unless they cultivate the seeds of grace that they receive, these seeds remain hidden and will not bear fruit.

Cana Marriage Formation provides an insight into a path which can serve as a means of cooperating with grace. It is based on the writings of Pope Benedict XVI on "Transformation" and it involves the couple's encounter with the person of Christ who comes to transform them in such a profound way that they are gradually changed into his likeness from one degree of glory to another (2Cor 3:18).

For Pope Benedict, to be transformed, one needs to abandon oneself to Christ with the attitude of a child who is certain of his mother's love. This abandonment must reach what is most personal and intimate in one's being: it requires inner conversion, leaving one's own view of reality, self-sufficiency and independency to enter into a relationship of trust with God who grants the certitude of eternal love and meaning.

In the Sermon on the Mount Jesus said: "Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house upon the rock and the rain fell, and the floods came, and the winds blew and beat upon that house, but it did not fall, because it had been founded on the rock" (Matt 7:24-25). Marriage is one of the most important houses anyone can build. It contributes to the good of the spouses, of their children and of the whole of society. It is their way to happiness here and hereafter, their pathway to heaven. At the present time, marriage is buffeted powerfully by the winds and rains of a secularised, pagan culture. To survive, and thrive, it must be founded on the rock of a strong spiritual life, on a personal relationship with Jesus Christ, nourished by prayer and the reception of the Sacraments.

The "Cana Marriage Formation" program is designed to help couples grow in this relationship and to be transformed by it. I am confident it will be a powerful help in strengthening many marriages.

I wholeheartedly endorse the program and I pray that many couples will avail themselves of it.

Liturgy of the Word

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Year C

Entrance Antiphon

O sing a new song to the Lord;
sing to the Lord, all the earth.
In his presence are majesty and splendour,
strength and honour in his holy place

First Reading

Neh 8:2-6, 8-10

A reading from the book of Nehemiah

Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly, consisting of men, women, and children old enough to understand. This was the first day of the seventh month. On the square before the Water Gate, in the presence of the men and women, and children old enough to understand, he read from the book from early morning till noon; all the people listened attentively to the Book of the Law.

Ezra the scribe stood on a wooden dais erected for the purpose. In full view of all the people - since he stood higher than all the people - Ezra opened the book; and when he opened it all the people stood up. The Lord blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people raised their hands and answered Amen! Amen! ; then they bowed down and, face to the ground, prostrated themselves before the Lord. And Ezra read from the Law of God, translating and giving the sense, so that the people understood what was read.

Then Nehemiah - His Excellency - Ezra, priest and scribe (and the Levites who were instructing the people) said to all the people, 'This day is sacred to the Lord your God. Do not be mournful, do not weep'. For the people were all in tears as they listened to the words of the Law.

He then said, 'Go, eat the fat, drink the sweet wine, and send a portion to the man who has nothing prepared ready. For this day is sacred to our Lord. Do not be sad: *the joy of the Lord is your stronghold.*'

Cor 12:12-30

A reading from the first letter to St Paul to the Corinthians

Together you are Christ's body; but each of you is a different part of it

Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks, slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

Nor is the body to be identified with any one of its many parts. Now you together are Christ's body; but each of you is a different part of it.

Gospel

Lk 1:1-4, 4:14-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Seeing that many others have undertaken to draw up accounts of the events that have taken place among us, exactly as these were handed down to us by those who from the outset were eyewitnesses and ministers of the word, I in my turn, after carefully going over the whole story from the beginning, have decided to write an ordered account for you, Theophilus, so that your Excellency may learn how well founded the teaching is that you have received.

Jesus, with the power of the Spirit in him, returned to Galilee; and his reputation spread throughout the countryside. He taught in their synagogues and everyone praised him.

He came to Nazara, where he had been brought up, and went into the synagogue on the sabbath day as he usually did. He stood up to read, and they handed him the scroll of the prophet Isaiah. Unrolling the scroll he found the place where it is written:

The spirit of the Lord has been given to me, for he has anointed me.

He has sent me to bring the good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives

*and to the blind new sight,
to see the downtrodden free,
to proclaim the Lord's year of favour.*

He then rolled up the scroll, gave it back to the assistant and sat down. And all eyes in the synagogue were fixed on him. Then he began to speak to them, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.'

Gospel Reflection

What does the Gospel of Luke tell us about Jesus and his mission and what he came to do for us? Many skeptics question the reliability and accuracy of the Gospel accounts of Jesus. Luke tells us that his account is utterly believable because it comes from firsthand witnesses (Luke 1:2) who knew Jesus personally, heard him teach, saw his miracles, and witnessed his atoning death on the cross and his rising from the tomb to everlasting life.

Luke begins his account by addressing his friend, Theophilus, a name which means "beloved of God" (Luke 1:3). In so many words Luke tells his friend (and us as well), I am writing to you the most incredible story humankind has known - and which many witnesses and messengers of God's word have openly explained on many occasions. Luke wants his friend and all who read his account to "know the truth" (Luke 1:4) concerning Jesus of Nazareth who was sent from the Father in heaven and anointed by the Holy Spirit to bring us the good news and power of God's kingdom.

The "good news" of Jesus brings new life and freedom

The word "gospel" literally means "good news." The Gospel is the Good News of Jesus Christ and the new life and freedom he has won for us through his atoning death on the cross for our sins and his resurrection to everlasting life and glory with the Father in heaven. The Gospel is the all-powerful and all-merciful word of God for us today as much as it was for the people who first heard it in Jesus' time. It's a life-giving word that has supernatural power to change, transform, and bring freedom and healing to those who accept it as the living word of God. Are you hungry for God's word of truth and mercy, love and forgiveness? And do you want to grow in the knowledge of God and what he has accomplished for us through his Son, Jesus Christ?

Lord Jesus, you are the fulfillment of all our hopes and dreams. Through the gift of your Holy Spirit you bring us truth, freedom, and abundant life. Fill me with the joy of the Gospel and inflame my heart with a burning love for you and a deep thirst for your word.

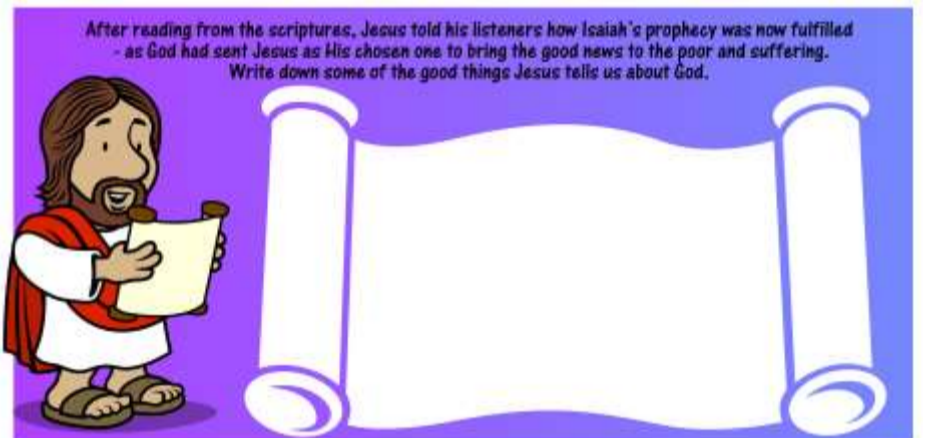
