



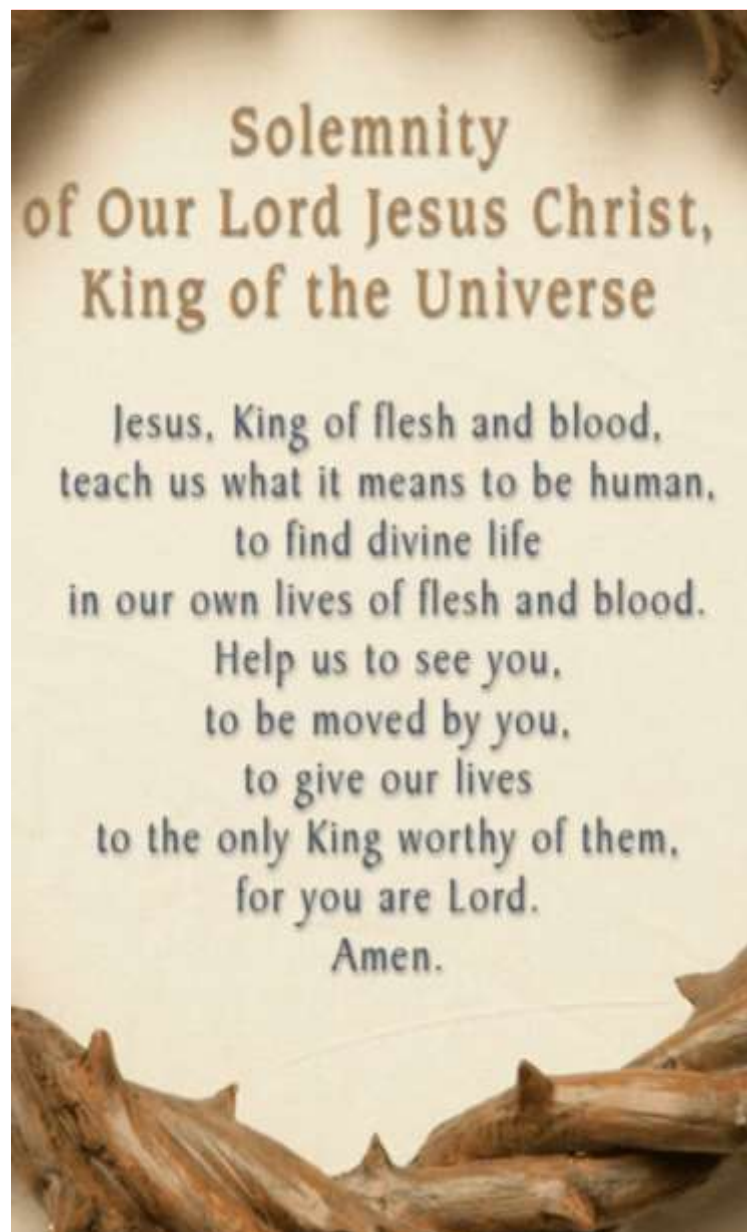
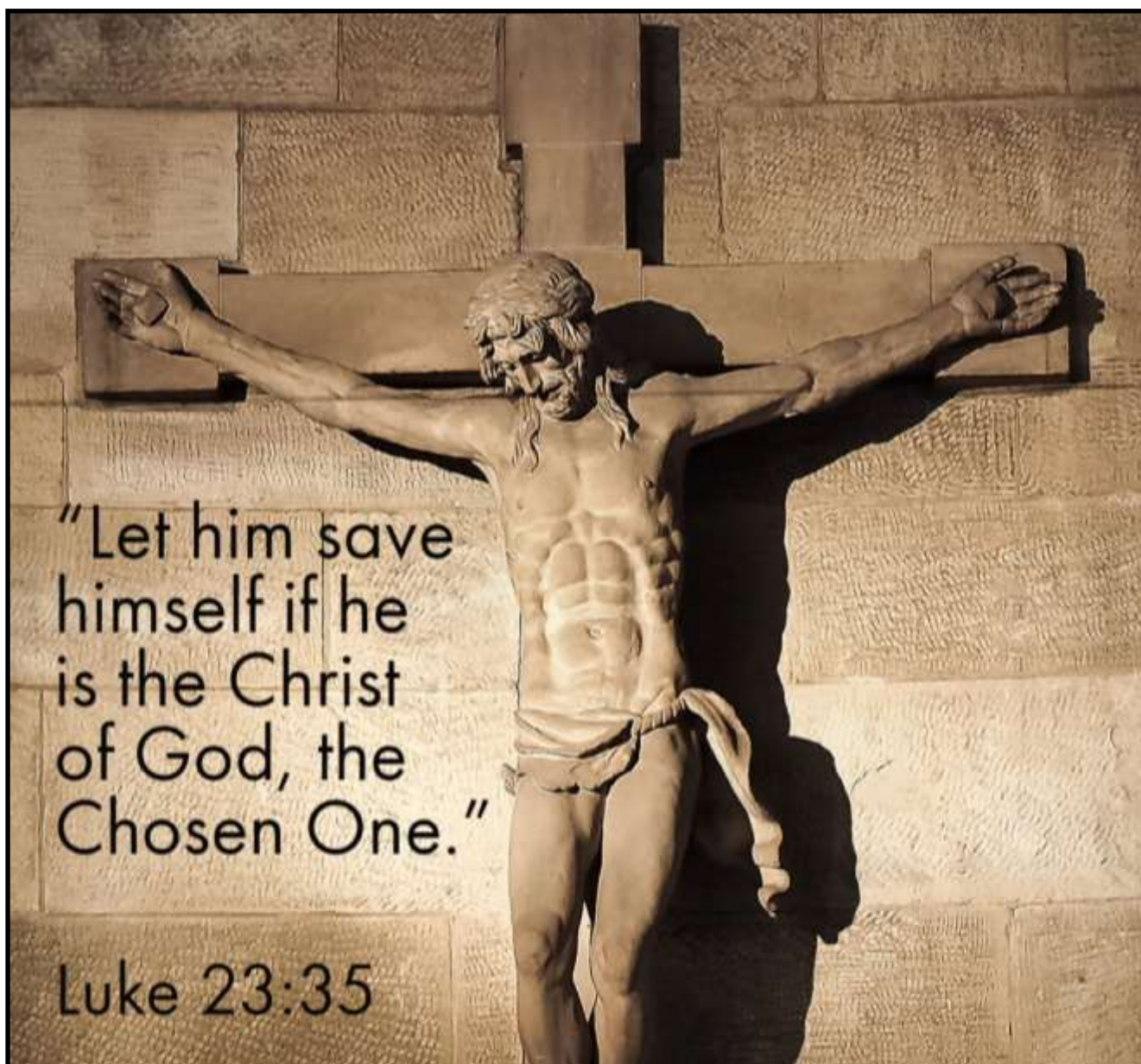

Religious Education in 1W at Sacred Heart, Pymble

Students are learning to know Christ and grow in their faith

Our Year 1 students are deeply engaged in exploring and reflecting on the Bible stories leading up to and including the Birth of Jesus. This is always such a special and joy-filled time of year for us as we prepare our hearts for Christmas.



We began the term by learning about *The Annunciation* and *The Visitation of Mary to Elizabeth*. Students were captivated by these moments of hope and faith, and have since been immersed in presentations focusing on the special night when Jesus was born.

After each presentation, students have opportunities to grow in their understanding of the events and their meaning through creative expression—drawing, painting, reading Scripture, and performing short plays. These activities help them to connect more deeply with the stories and explore any questions or wonderings they may have.



Through these rich experiences, our students are developing their personal relationship with God and growing in faith. As they reflect on the Birth of Jesus, they come to understand that He is our Saviour and the Light of the World, bringing hope, peace, and love to all.

This weekend we launch the **Annual Vinnies Christmas Appeal**. The Appeal is for Christmas hampers for our clients in Pymble, Wyong, Chatswood and Glebe, or a cash donation.

1. Food hampers for Pymble, Wyong and Chatswood families

We are requesting food hampers for our clients in Pymble, Wyong and Chatwood. Please take a numbered card for a recipient family from the back of the Church and fill in your details on the sheet provided, and take some boxes. Members will be available to assist with this. When you return your hamper, please ensure you clearly label it (each box) with this number, so it can go to the correct family.

The hampers not only provide some welcome celebration at Christmas but also some staples to help support the family. Suggestions for the hamper include:

Christmas fare such as Christmas cake, puddings, mince pies, shortbread, nuts, custard and jelly
Christmas stockings and sweets for children

Pantry staples such as pasta, rice, pasta sauce, jams and spreads, tinned food (baked beans, tuna etc), noodles,

Drinks such as long life milk, tea, coffee, cordial or Milo

Toiletries such as shampoo and soap

No alcohol or chocolate please

You are welcome to include a gift for children if you would like

2. Gift bags for Glebe families

We are requesting for our Glebe clients a small Christmas bag, which will contain the following:

- 2-5 small single serve Christmas fare items (ie a cake or pudding serve, ginger bread or sweets)
- Vouchers for Coles and KMart, which can be purchased at the back of the church. The amount varies depending on how many people are in the recipient family (receipts can be supplied for tax purposes)
- A card for the client, extending them Christmas wishes

Please take a numbered card and a bag from the back of the church and purchase vouchers from our members. Please prepare the bag and when you return it, the vouchers will be added to your bag. Please ensure your card is tied to your bag so it can go to the correct family.

3. Aged care residents

We also request small gifts for aged care residents (e.g. soap or handkerchiefs) who do not have any family, to ensure they receive something for Christmas. Cards are also supplied for this at the back of the church. Please return the gift with the card.

- **To Sacred Heart by Sunday, 7 December at 6pm.**

First Reading 2 Samuel 5: 1-3

A reading from the second book of Samuel

All the tribes of Israel came to David at Hebron. ‘Look’ they said ‘we are your own flesh and blood. In days past when Saul was our king, it was you who led Israel in all their exploits; and the Lord said to you, “You are the man who shall be shepherd of my people Israel, you shall be the leader of Israel.”’ So all the elders of Israel came to the king at Hebron, and King David made a pact with them at Hebron in the presence of the Lord, and they anointed David king of Israel.

Second Reading Colossians 1: 12-20

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

We give thanks to the Father who has made it possible for you to join the saints and with them to inherit the light.

Because that is what he has done: he has taken us out of the power of darkness and created a place for us in the kingdom of the Son that he loves, and in him, we gain our freedom, the forgiveness of our sins.

He is the image of the unseen God and the first-born of all creation, for in him were created all things in heaven and on earth: everything visible and everything invisible, Thrones, Dominations, Sovereignities, Powers - all things were created, he existed, and he holds all things in unity. Now the Church is his body, he is its head.

As he is the Beginning,
he was first to be born from the dead,
so that he should be first in every way;
because God wanted all perfection
to be found in him
and all things to be reconciled through him
and for him,
everything in heaven and everything on earth,
when he made peace
by his death on the cross.

Gospel Acclamation Mark 11: 9, 10

Alleluia, alleluia!

Gospel Luke 23: 35-43

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The people stayed there before the cross watching Jesus. As for the leaders, they jeered at him. ‘He saved others,’ they said, ‘let him save himself if he is the Christ of God, the Chosen One.’ The soldiers mocked him too, and when they approached to offer him vinegar they said, ‘If you are the king of the Jews, save yourself.’ Above him there was an inscription: ‘This is the King of the Jews.’

One of the criminals hanging there abused him. ‘Are you not the Christ?’ he said. ‘Save yourself and us as well.’ But the other spoke up and rebuked him. ‘Have you no fear of God at all?’ he said. ‘You got the same sentence as he did, but in our case we deserved it: we are paying for what we did. But this man has done nothing wrong. Jesus,’ he said, ‘remember me when you come into your kingdom.’ ‘Indeed, I promise you,’ he replied, ‘today you will be with me in paradise.’

Gospel Reflection

God is King and Ruler over all

What is the significance and meaning of Jesus’ kingship for us? Kingship today seems outdated and useless, especially in democratic societies where everyone is supposed to be treated equal and free. Many rulers in past ages claimed they had sovereign authority to rule by divine edict. But God did not give his people Israel a king at first. Why? Because God alone was their King and they needed no other. Nonetheless, God relented and chose David as King over Israel with the promise that God would raise up through David’s royal line a Saviour who would establish an everlasting kingdom of righteousness and peace that would endure for all ages (Psalm 89:29).

The Jews understood that the Messiah ("Anointed One") would come as God's anointed King to restore paradise and establish God's reign of peace for them. They wanted a Messianic King who would free them from strife and division and from foreign oppression. Many had high hopes that Jesus would be the Messiah and Ruler for Israel. Little did they understand what kind of kingship Jesus claimed to possess.

Jesus' claim to kingship

Jesus came to deliver his people, and the whole world, from the worst kind of tyranny possible - from bondage to sin, guilt and condemnation, and from the wages of sin which is death and separation from an all-merciful and just Father who gave us his son to set us free and to adopt us as his beloved sons and daughters. Jesus came to conquer hearts and souls for an imperishable kingdom - a kingdom ruled not by force or fear - but by the power of God's righteousness, peace, and joy in the Holy Spirit (Romans 14:17).

When Satan tempted Jesus during his forty day fast in the wilderness, he offered Jesus all the kingdoms of the world (Matthew 4:8-9). Jesus knew that the world was in Satan's power. And this was precisely why Jesus came - to overthrow Satan's power and deception over the earth. Jesus knew that the way to victory was through submission to his Father's will and plan to lay down his life for us and reverse the curse of sin and death for us. The Father sent his only begotten Son into the world, not to condemn it, but to save it through the atoning sacrifice which Jesus would make for us through the shedding of his blood on the cross of Calvary.

Jesus came to restore Paradise for us - everlasting life with God

As Jesus was crucified on the cross alongside two criminals who were thieves, one mocked him for his claim to divine kingship. But the other thief recognized through the eyes of faith that Jesus was truly God's Anointed King and Savior. He petitioned Jesus to treat his poor soul with mercy and pardon, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom" (Luke 23:42). Jesus not only granted him forgiveness, but a place with him in his everlasting kingdom. "Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise."

Lord Jesus Christ, you are my King and there is no other. Be the Lord and Master of my heart, mind, body, and soul. May I always seek to do your will and to serve your kingdom above all else.

We take our responsibility to safeguard the vulnerable, whether they be children, the young, the elderly or the disabled very seriously. We work to ensure that no one is taken advantage of within our Parish.
