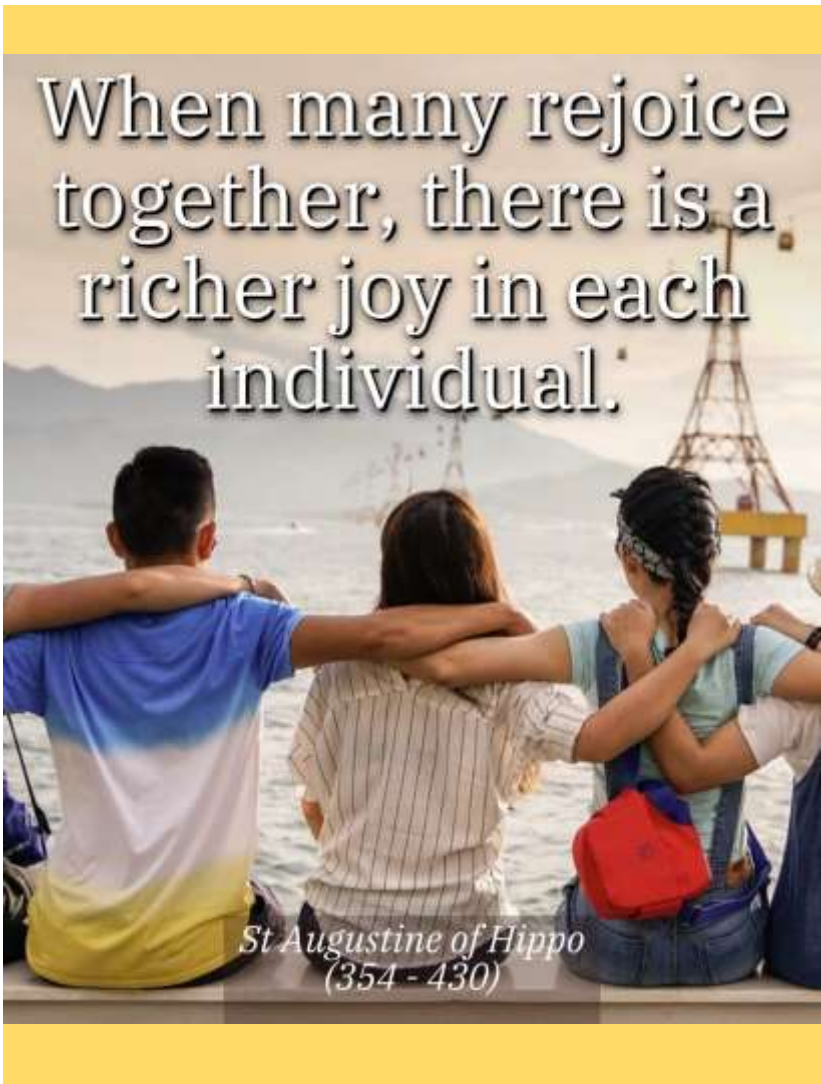

OUR LADY OF PERPETUAL SUCCOUR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION - YEAR 1
<p>Last term Year 1’s unit of work was ‘Jesus Teller of Stories’. This unit explored the role of story in Jesus’ mission as a travelling rabbi. Students learned how Jesus told stories (parables), how he used words that were easy for people to understand and how Jesus used examples from their everyday lives. Students had lots of opportunity to respond to Jesus’ parables, to relate to his stories and look at how these stories are relevant to their lives today.</p> <p>We focussed on the Lost Parables, in particular, The Lost Sheep, The Lost Coin and The Lost Son. Students were given opportunities to discover what these parables teach us and to experience Jesus’ compassion for the lost, the outcast and the sinners. Students responded to this learning in many different ways: illustrating and retelling the parables in their own words, writing their own prayers, making stick figures and dramatizing the parable to each other and to the Kindergarten class, meditating and reflecting on and responding to the parable teachings, discussing similarities and differences and praying to God.</p> <p>This term’s unit of work is ‘Bible Stories in the Old Testament’ with particular focus on Abraham and Sarah, Moses, Joseph, Daniel and Jonah. This unit of work will continue to emphasise the value of prayer in our lives and how we are all deeply connected to God.</p>

World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly

We are encouraged to celebrate the World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly on Sunday, 24 July 2022. In 2021, Pope Francis asked that the day be marked each year around the feast of Sts Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus.

In his 2021 message for the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly, with the theme "I am with you always", Pope Francis said older people, even if "energy is running out", have a "renewed vocation".

"It makes no difference how old you are, whether you still work or not, whether you are alone or have a family, whether you became a grandmother or grandfather at a young age or later, whether you are still independent or need assistance," he said.

"Because there is no retirement age from the work of proclaiming the Gospel and handing down traditions to your family. You just need to set out and undertake something new."

In honouring our grandparents and older people, we honour their lives and experiences, and open up a richness of experience to draw upon. The World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly provides an opportunity to more deeply celebrate the role older people have played in forming us as people and as believers.

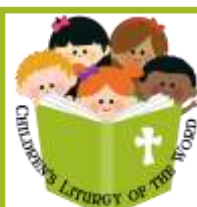


St Vincent de Paul Society

A reading from the book of Genesis

The Lord said, ‘How great an outcry there is against Sodom and Gomorrah! How grievous is their sin! I propose to go down and see whether or not they have done all that is alleged in the outcry against them that has come up to me. I am determined to know.’

The men left there and went to Sodom while Abraham remained standing before the Lord. Approaching him he said, ‘Are you really going to destroy the just man with the sinner? Perhaps there are fifty just men in the town. Will you really overwhelm them, will you not spare the place for the fifty just men in it? Do not think of doing such a thing: to kill the just man with the sinner, treating just and sinner alike! Do not think of it! Will the judge of the whole earth not administer justice?’ The Lord replied, ‘If at Sodom I find fifty just men in the town, I will spare the whole place because of them.’

Abraham replied, ‘I am bold indeed to speak like this to my Lord, I who am dust and ashes. But perhaps the fifty just men lack five: will you destroy the whole city for five?’ ‘No’, he replied ‘I will not destroy it if I find forty-five just men there.’ Again Abraham said to him, ‘Perhaps there will only be forty there.’ ‘I will not do it’ he replied ‘for the sake of the forty.’

Abraham said, ‘I trust my Lord will not be angry, but give me leave to speak: perhaps there will only be thirty there.’ ‘I will not do it’ he replied ‘if I find thirty there.’ He said, ‘I am bold indeed to speak like this, but perhaps there will only be twenty there.’ ‘I will not destroy it’ he replied ‘for the sake of the twenty.’ He said, ‘I trust my Lord will not be angry if I speak once more: perhaps there will only be ten.’ ‘I will not destroy it’ he replied ‘for the sake of the ten.’

He has overridden the Law, and cancelled every record of the debt that we had to pay; he has done away with it by nailing it to the cross.

Gospel

Lk 11: 1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Once Jesus was in a certain place praying, and when he had finished, one of his disciples said, ‘Lord, teach us to pray, just as John taught his disciples.’ He said to them, ‘Say this when you pray:

“Father, may your name be held holy,
your kingdom come;
give us each day our daily bread,
and forgive us our sins,
for we ourselves forgive each one who is in debt to us.
And do not put us to the test.”

He also said to them, ‘Suppose one of you has a friend and goes to him in the middle of the night to say, “My friend, lend me three loaves, because a friend of mine on his travels has just arrived at my house and I have nothing to offer him”; and the man answers from inside the

house, “Do not bother me. The door is bolted now, and my children and I are in bed; I cannot get up to give it to you.” I tell you, if the man does not get up and give it him for friendship’s sake, persistence will be enough to make him get up and give his friend all he wants. ‘So I say to you: Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you. For the one who asks always receives; the one who searches always finds; the one who knocks will always have the door opened to him. What father among you would hand his son a stone when he asked for bread? Or hand him a snake instead of a fish? Or hand him a scorpion if he asked for an egg? If you then, who are evil, know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!’

Reflection

God treats us as his own sons and daughters

What does Jesus’ prayer tell us about God and about ourselves? First, it tells us that God is both Father in being the Creator and Author of all that he has made, the first origin of everything and transcendent authority, and he is eternally Father by his relationship to his only begotten Son who, reciprocally is Son only in relation to his Father (Matthew 11:27). All fatherhood and motherhood is derived from him (Ephesians 3:14-15). In the Lord Jesus Christ we are spiritually reborn and made new, and we become the adopted children of God.

We can approach God confidently as a Father who loves us

Jesus teaches us to address God as "our Father" and to confidently ask him for the things we need to live as his sons and daughters. We can approach God our Father with confidence and boldness because Jesus Christ has opened the way to heaven for us through his atoning death and resurrection. When we ask God for help, he fortunately does not give us what we deserve. Instead, he responds with grace (his favour and blessing) and mercy (pardon and healing). He is kind and forgiving towards us and he expects us to treat our neighbour the same.

Father in heaven, you have given me a mind to know you, a will to serve you, and a heart to love you. Give me today the grace and strength to embrace your holy will and fill my heart with your love that all my intentions and actions may be pleasing to you. Help me to be kind and forgiving towards my neighbour as you have been towards me.

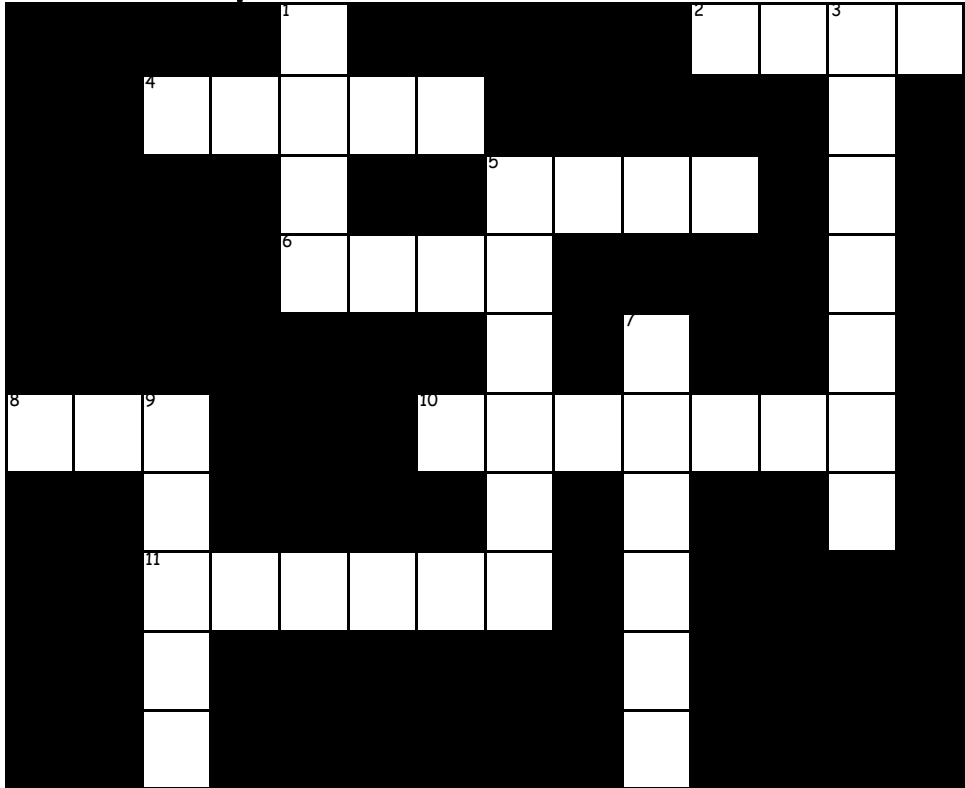

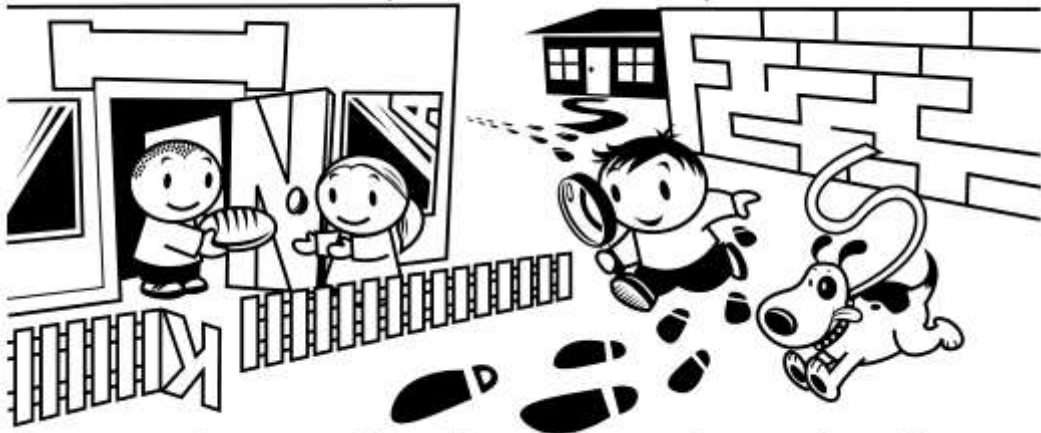
