

Pymble Parish COVID Update

As you may be aware, NSW has reached 80% vaccination rate. As such, all public Masses will resume in both Sacred Heart Church and OLPS Church.

Our Churches will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified. During this stage:

- a. Other rituals such as Baptisms and other services of prayer and devotion will resume.
- b. Confessions will be publicly scheduled again.
- The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the 4 sqm principle. This will be 130 for Sacred Heart Church, and 65 for OLPS Church. This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- d. Congregational singing will not be possible, but a musician and cantor are possible and will be engaged for the beauty of the liturgy.
- e. COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be re-introduced including:
 - i. Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - ii. The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - iii. The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head.
 - iv. Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession.
- f. It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

Please note that Bishop Anthony Randazzo has decided that the Broken Bay Sunday Obligation will remain suspended until 1 December 2021.

Given that our parish facilities other than our church buildings will be subject to the status of people's vaccination all face-to-face parish meetings, social gatherings, and use of facilities such meeting rooms and halls will continue to be suspended until after 1 December.

- 3. From 1 December 2021:
 - a. Density for gatherings in our churches will shift to one person per 2 sqm for both indoor and outdoor gatherings.
 - b. Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
 - c. There is no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.



In March 2020, Pope Francis announced that the theme for the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops would be "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation and Mission".

The actual Synod of Bishops gathering will be held in October 2023, however, the journey towards its celebration begins this month. Pope Francis opened the Synod on 9-10 October 2021 in Rome, and the Synod opened for each particular Church around the world on 17 October 2021.

This 2-year process allows a period of wide consultation and walking together as a worldwide Church: "It is precisely this path of synodality which God expects of the Church of the third millennium. This journey, which follows in the wake of the Church's "renewal" proposed by the Second Vatican Council, is both a gift and a task: by journeying together and reflecting together on the journey that has been made, the Church will be able to learn through Her experience which processes can help Her to live communion, to achieve participation, to open Herself to mission. Our "journeying together" is, in fact, what most effectively enacts and manifests the nature of the Church as the pilgrim and missionary People of God."






Annual Salvatorian Seminary Collection 20-21 November 2021



Gospel Reflection

Have you ever encountered a once in a lifetime opportunity you knew you could not pass up? Such a moment came for a blind and destitute man, named Bartimaeus. He was determined to get near the one person who could meet his need. He knew who Jesus was and had heard of his fame for healing, but until now had no opportunity of making direct contact with the Son of David, a clear reference and title for the Messiah.

others. Jesus was on his way to celebrate the Passover in Jerusalem and a band of pilgrims followed him. When the crowd tried to silence the blind man he overpowered them with his emotional outburst and thus caught the attention of Jesus.

Goodness and mercy follows those who put their trust in God

This incident reveals something important about how God interacts with us. The blind man was determined to get Jesus' attention A reading from the holy Gospel according and he was persistent in the face of opposition. Jesus could have ignored or rebuffed him because he was disturbing his conversation and his audience. Jesus showed that acting was more important need and Jesus was ready to respond to his need, not only to empathize with his suffering, but to relieve it as well. A great speaker can command attention and respect, but a man or woman with a helping hand and a big heart is loved more.

Why did Jesus put a question to Bartimaeus - "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus wanted to draw out of him a personal heal and make whole. Jesus commends sight as well. Do you recognize the Lord Jesus with "eyes of faith" as your merciful Lord and healer? Ask the Lord Jesus to strengthen your faith that you may draw near to him and receive his grace and mercy.

Lord Jesus, may I never fail to recognize my need for your grace and mercy. Strengthen my faith and trust in you that I may seek your presence daily and listen to your word with a readiness to follow you who are my All.


