

Pymble Parish COVID Update

Based on the current Public Health Orders, both Sacred Heart and OLPS will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who at tend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified.

The following will apply until 15 December:

- The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the <u>2 sqm principle</u>. This will be <u>260 for Sacred Heart Church</u>, and <u>130 for OLPS Church</u>. This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- Congregational singing will not be possible.
- COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be reintroduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head:
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession;
 - It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

Please note that Bishop Anthony Randazzo has determined that the Broken Bay Sunday Obligation will remain suspended until 1 December 2021.

From 15 December 2021:

- Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- There will be no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.

Blessing of the Wreath and Lighting of the First Candle

Blessing: Lord God, your Church joyfully awaits the coming of its Saviour, who enlightens our hearts and dispels

the darkness of ignorance and sin. Pour forth your blessings upon us as we light the candles of this

wreath; may their light reflect the splendour of Christ, who is Lord, for ever and ever.

Meditation: "So be on the watch. Pray constantly for the strength to...stand secure before the Son of Man." (Luke 21:36)

Priest: In the First Week of Advent, we prepare ourselves for the Lord's coming into our world and into our lives. We ask, "In what

area of my life do I stand at a distance from God?" We examine our relationships with family, friends, classmates, business associates, and neighbours. Is our faith reflected in each experience of human contact? Is love of God and neighbour the basis

for our interaction with others?

Light the first purple candle



Avoiding the commercialisation of Christmas is a real challenge. For Catholics, the liturgical season of Advent helps us focus on the spiritual preparation for Christmas and on the coming of Our Lord. (Advent comes from the Latin adventus, meaning "coming.") Here are some suggestions to prepare for Christmas.

1. Make an Advent wreath

The wreath is a circle, which has no beginning or end: God is eternal, and His love for us is everlasting. The three purple candles symbolise penance, preparation and sacrifice; the pink candle symbolises the same but highlights the third Sunday of Advent, Gaudete Sunday, when we rejoice because our preparation is half-way. The light represents Christ. The progression of lighting candles shows our increasing readiness to meet Our Lord. Make the Advent wreath the centrepiece of the dinner table. Light it at dinner time, and say the special prayers along with grace before meals. This daily practice will help each member of the family keep focused on the true meaning of Christmas.

2. Pray

Schedule a regular time for prayer. Also, pray the rosary, individually or as a family. Ponder the various events in the life of Our Lord, and the example of Mary, "the handmaid of the Lord," who gave of herself to receive the gift of the Saviour. For little children, maybe just pray a decade each night, looking at one mystery; over the four weeks of Advent, all the mysteries will have been prayed.

3. Read the Scripture

This liturgical year, the Sunday Gospel passages will be taken primarily from St. Luke. Spend a few minutes reflecting upon it, inserting oneself into the passage, and allowing the Holy Spirit to speak in the quiet of one's heart.

4. Take time out for confession

Do a thorough examination of conscience. If it has been a while since the last confession, find a good examination of conscience, praying for help from the Holy Spirit, write down those sins that come to mind. Bring that examination to confession, receive absolution, and do the prescribed penance.

5. Teach

Teach children especially, read to them the stories of St. Francis and the first Christmas crèche, St. Boniface and the first Christmas tree, or St. Nicholas who is Santa Claus.

6. Give

Give of yourself by doing good works. Good works help heal the hurts caused by sin, including our own. Clean out the closets of old clothes or toys, and give them to a charity. St. Francis said, "It is in giving that we receive," and through our charitable works, we will receive the love of Christ Himself.






