COVID Return to School Protocols

The 2022 School Year officially starts on 28 January with students commencing a staggered start onsite from Monday, 31 January.

Once again, we will be following all necessary protocols to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our students, their families and our staff. Many of the protocols for Term 4 will continue, including masks for all staff and students Year 7 and above, cohorting and physical distancing to minimise transmission, limiting visitors on school sites, and maximising natural ventilation and use of outdoor spaces. Attendance on site will continue to be restricted to those who are fully vaccinated (with some minor exceptions) and the Public Health Order requiring staff to be fully vaccinated will be extended to include the requirement for a booster.

In addition, the NSW Government will supply students and staff with rapid antigen tests (RATs) to support their ongoing operations in the first four weeks of term. Use of RATs will be recommended for all students and staff, twice a week, on Monday and Wednesday mornings. These are being delivered to schools now and will be distributed to families as soon as possible.

CSBB (Catholic Schools Broken Bay) remains in contact with CSNSW (Catholic Schools NSW) who is working with NSW Health and the Department of Education to align schools and community settings. If you have any questions about how return to school will work with the parish, please contact your principal.



Liturgy of the Word Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Entrance Antiphon

Save us, O Lord our God! and gather us from the nations, to give thanks to your holy name and make it our glory to praise you.

First Reading

Jer 1:4-5, 17-19

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

I have appointed you as prophet to the nations.

In the days of Josiah, the word of the Lord was dressed to me, saying,

'Before I formed you in the womb I knew you;

before you came to birth I consecrated you; I have appointed you as prophet to the nations.

So now brace yourself for action. Stand up and tell them

all I command you.

Do not be dismayed at their presence, or in their presence I will make you dismayed.

I, for my part, today will make you into a fortified city, a pillar of iron, and a wall of bronze to confront all this land: the kings of Judah, its princes, its priests and the country people. They will fight against you but shall not overcome you, for I am with you to deliver you – it is the Lord who speaks.'

Second Reading Cor 13:4-13

A reading from the first letter to St Paul to the Corinthians

Love is always patient and kind; it is never jealous; love is never boastful or conceited; it is never rude or selfish; it does not take offence, and is not resentful. Love takes no pleasure in other people's sins but delights in the truth; it is always ready to excuse, to trust, to hope, and to endure whatever comes.

Love does not come to an end. But if there are gifts of prophecy, the time will come when they must fail; or the gift of languages, it will not continue for ever; and knowledge – for this, too, the time will come when it must fail. For our knowledge is imperfect and our prophesying is imperfect; but once perfection comes, all imperfect things will disappear. When I was a child, I used to talk like a child, and think like a child, and argue like a child, but now I am a man, all childish ways are put behind me. Now we are seeing a dim reflection in a mirror; but then we shall be seeing face to face. The knowledge that I have now is imperfect; but then I shall know as fully as I am known.

In short, there are three things that last: faith, hope and love; and the greatest of these is love.

Gospel Acclamation

Alleluia, alleluia! The Lord send me to bring Good News to the poor and freedom to prisoners. Alleluia!

Gospel Lk **4:**21-30

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus, like Elijah and Elisha, was not sent only to the jews.

Jesus began to speak in the synagogue, 'This text is being fulfilled today even as you listen.' And he won the approval of all, and they were astonished by the gracious words that came from his lips. 'There were many widows in Israel, I can assure you, in Elijah's day, when heaven remained shut for three years and six months and a great famine raged throughout the land, but Elijah was not sent to any one of these: he was sent to a widow at Zarephath, a Sidonian town. And in the prophet Elisha's time there were many lepers in Israel, but none of these was cured, except the Syrian, Naaman.'

When they heard this everyone in the synagogue was enraged. They sprang to their feet and hustled him out of the town; and they took him up to the brow of the hill their town was built on, intending to throw him down the cliff, but he slipped through the crowd and walked away.

Gospel Reflection

Do you believe that God wants to act with power in your life today? Power to set you free from sin and hurtful desires, fear and oppression. Throughout the Scriptures we see God performing mighty acts to save his people from death and destruction - from Noah's ark that spared his family from the flood of wickedness that had spread across the land to Moses and the Israelites who crossed through the parting waters of the Red Sea as they fled the armies of Pharoah their slave Master and oppressor.

Throughout the Gospel accounts Jesus praised individuals who put their faith in God as they remembered the great and wonderful deeds he had performed time and again. Jesus even praised outsiders - non-Jews and pagans from other lands who had heard about the mighty deeds of the God of Israel. One example Jesus mentioned was Naaman the pagan army commander from Syria who was afflicted with leprosy - a debilitating skin disease that slowly ate away the flesh (2 Kings 5:1-15). Naaman's slave-girl was a young Jewish woman who had faith in God and compassion for Naaman her master. She urged him to seek healing from Elisha, the great prophet of Israel. When Naaman went to the land of Israel to seek a cure for his leprosy, the prophet Elisha instructed him to bathe seven times in the Jordan river. Namaan was indignant at first, but then repented and followed the prophet's instructions. In doing so he was immediately restored in body and spirit.


