




Religious Education in Yr 1 at Our Lady of Perpetual Succour


Term 4's Stage 1 Religious Education unit is, "Mission – Loving God and Others Like Jesus'.

As part of this unit, Year 1 viewed the video 'We Are Still Here" from Catholic Mission. They responded to a call from Pope Francis, inspired by Acts 4:20: "For we cannot keep from speaking about what we have seen and heard."



Shrine of St John Paul II

The St John Paul II Shrine and Pastoral Centre are open to welcome visitors. Two first class relics are on display in the Shrine at St Patrick's Catholic Church, East Gosford. St John Paul II, born Karol Józef Wojtyla, was the 264th Catholic Pope. From humble beginnings in occupied Poland during World War II, he went on to become the leader of the Catholic Church.

The St John Paul II Shrine was opened on Saturday, 22 October 2022 at St Patrick's Catholic Church, East Gosford together with the installation of two first-class relics. Broken Bay Bishop Anthony Randazzo dedicated the Shrine and installed the relics.

A painting by a Polish artist of St John Paul II commissioned for the event was also unveiled along with a 3.5 metre statue of the saint which now stands outside the main entrance to the church.

Lk 19: 1-10

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus entered Jericho and was going through the town when a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance; he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd; so he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: 'Zacchaeus, come down. Hurry, because I must stay at your house today.' And he hurried down and welcomed him joyfully. They all complained when they saw what was happening. 'He has gone to stay at a sinner's house' they said. But Zacchaeus stood his ground and said to the

"uninvited" - the poor, the lame, and even public sinners like Zacchaeus, the tax collector! Tax collectors were despised and treated as outcasts, no doubt because they over-charged people and accumulated great wealth at the expense of others.

Zacchaeus was a chief tax collector and was much hated by all the people. Why would Jesus single him out for the honour of staying at his home? Zacchaeus needed God's merciful love and forgiveness. In his encounter with Jesus he found more than he imagined possible. He shows the depth of his repentance by deciding to give half of his goods to the poor and to use the other half for making restitution for fraud. Zacchaeus' testimony included more than words. His change of heart resulted in a change of life, a change that the whole community could experience as genuine.

Faith welcomes Christ in our heart and home

Saint Augustine of Hippo (354-430 AD) urges us to climb the sycamore tree like Zacchaeus that we might see Jesus and embrace his cross for our lives:.

The Lord Jesus is always ready to make his home with each one of us. Do you make room for him in your heart and in every area of your life?

Lord Jesus, come and stay with me. Fill my life with your peace, my home with your presence, and my heart with your praise. Help me to show kindness, mercy, and goodness to all, even to those who cause me ill-will or harm.
