







## **Homelessness Week:** 1 August—8 August



In Australia there are over 116,000 people experiencing homelessness on any given night. Homelessness Week aims to raise awareness of the impact of homelessness on Australia via national and local community events, including providing information on the importance of housing as a solution and educating communities on how they can make a difference.

Homelessness Week 2022 will be taking place from Monday 1 to Sunday 7 August.

Few people choose to be homeless and the longer a person remains homeless, the more difficult it is to return to mainstream society. Just like Mary MacKillop saw a need and did something about it, at CatholicCare we work tirelessly to support people who are homeless or needing a helping hand. We offer a raft of services to help.

CatholicCare provide a women's refuge, transitional accommodation options, young parent's homelessness services and street sleeping outreach supports. We also operate Dom's Place in Hornsby and Mary Mac's in Woy Woy where we provide meals, a place to shower and wash clothes, and somewhere for people who are homeless or transient to come and to connect with supports and community.

Many people who access our services are lonely, and when they walk through our doors they are simply after a listening ear.

#### **CALL FOR NEW PARISH PASTORAL COUNCIL MEMBERS**

The purpose of our Parish Pastoral Council (PPC) is to promote and support the evangelising mission of the Parish, working in collaboration with the Parish Priest to foster the spiritual and pastoral life of the parish community. The traditional hallmarks of Christianity – Word, Worship, Community and Service – guide the Council in the evaluation of needs and the parish's response to them.

#### THE PPC:

- Meets regularly with Fr, Ireneusz, usually monthly
- Reflects on the life of the parish community
- Acts as the body in the Parish from which Fr. Ireneusz seeks advice about the pastoral life and strategic direction of the Parish community
- Discerns key pastoral priorities and initiatives as part of parish pastoral planning
- Reflects on the 'signs of the times and the context of the Parish and considers how the Parish can best carry out its mission, as in our vision and purpose statements.
- Brings forth issues and considerations from the members of the Parish community which might shape the life and future of the Parish community

#### THE PARISH COUNCIL IS COMPRISED OF 12 PERSONS

- 10 members are appointed to the Council, by recommendation or by direct appointment
- The Principals of Sacred Heart and Our Lady of Perpetual Succour (OLPS) Primary Schools, are ex officio members of the Parish Pastoral Council

#### Recommendations for 4-5 new members are now invited from the community

The terms of membership of each of the new members will be a maximum of 4 years (membership is normally 2 years with a further 2-year option). This means, therefore, that the membership of our Parish Pastoral Council rotates with new members every 2 years.

#### **THE PROCESS**

Until Monday 22nd August recommendations for positions on the Parish Pastoral Council are called. Recommendations need to be of those who show:

- A commitment to the practice of the faith, to the parish community, and to the purpose and vision of Pymble Catholic Parish:
- Ability to commit to attending monthly meetings and actively participating
- To collaborate, consult and discern with others for the mission of the Church;
- Good communication and interpersonal skills;
- A capacity to think strategically toward the development of Parish Pastoral Plans.

#### A reading from the book of Eccleasistes

Vanity of vanities, the Preacher says. Vanity of vanities. All is vanity!

For so it is that a man who has laboured wisely, skilfully and successfully must leave what is his own to someone who has not toiled for it at all. This, too, is vanity and great injustice; for what does he gain for all the toil and strain that he has undergone under the sun? What of all his laborious days, his cares of office, his restless nights? This, too, is vanity.

#### **Responsorial Psalm**

#### (R.) In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

- 1. You turn men back into dust and say: 'Go back, sons of men.' To your eyes a thousand years are like yesterday, come and gone, no more than a watch in the night. (R.)
- You sweep men away like a dream, like grass which springs up in the morning. In the morning it springs up and flowers: by evening it withers and fades. (R.)

Col 3: 1-5, 9-1

#### A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Colossians

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. Let your thoughts be on heavenly things, not on the things that are on the earth, because you have died, and now the life you have is hidden with Christ in God. But when Christ is revealed – and he is your life – you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

#### Gospel

Lk 12: 13-21

## A reading from the holy Gospel according to

A man in the crowd said to Jesus, 'Master, tell my brother to give me a share of our inheritance.' 'My friend,' he replied, 'who appointed me your judge, or the arbitrator of your claims?' Then he said to them, 'Watch, and be on your guard against avarice of any kind, for a man's life is not made secure by what he owns, even when he has more than he needs.'

Then he told them a parable: 'There was once a rich man who, having had a good harvest from his land, thought to himself, "What am I to do? I have not enough room to store my crops." Then he said, "This is what I will do; I will pull down my barns and build bigger ones, and store all my grain and my goods in them, and I will say to my soul: My soul, you have plenty of good things laid by for many years to come; take things easy, eat, drink, have a good time." But God said to him, "Fool! This very night the demand will be made for your soul; and this hoard of yours, whose will it be then?" So it is when a man stores up treasure for himself in place of making himself rich in the sight of God.'

#### Reflection

Have you ever tried to settle a money dispute or an inheritance issue? Inheritance disputes are rarely ever easy to resolve, especially when the relatives or close associates of the deceased benefactor cannot agree on who should get what and who should get the most. Why did Jesus refuse to settle an inheritance dispute between two brothers? He saw that the heart of the issue was not justice or fairness but rather greed and possessiveness.

#### Loving possessions rather than loving my neighbour

The ten commandments were summarized into two prohibitions - do not worship false idols and do not covet what belongs to another. It's the flip side of the two great commandments - love

God and love your neighbour. Jesus warned the man who wanted half of his brother's inheritance to "beware of all covetousness." To covet is to wish to get wrongfully what another possesses or to begrudge what God has given to another. Jesus restates the commandment "do not covet", but he also states that a person's life does not consist in the abundance of his or her possessions.

August of Hippo (354-430 AD) comments on Jesus' words to the brother who wanted more:

Greed wants to divide, just as love desires to gather. What is the significance of 'guard against all greed,' unless it is 'fill yourselves with love?' We, possessing love for our portion, inconvenience the Lord because of our brother just as that man did against his brother, but we do not use the same plea. He said, 'Master, tell my brother to divide the inheritance with me.' We say, 'Master, tell my brother that he may have my inheritance.' (Sermon 265.9)

#### The fool who was possessed by his riches

Jesus reinforces his point with a parable about a foolish rich man (Luke 12:16-21). Why does Jesus call this wealthy landowner a fool? Jesus does not fault the rich man for his industriousness and skill in acquiring wealth, but rather for his egoism and selfishness - it's mine, all mine, and no one else's. This parable is similar to the parable of the rich man who refused to give any help to the beggar Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31). The rich fool had lost the capacity to be concerned for others. His life was consumed with his possessions and his only interests were in himself. His death was the final loss of his soul! What is Jesus' lesson on using material possessions? It is in giving that we receive. Those who are rich towards God receive ample reward - not only in this life but in eternity as well.

#### Where is your treasure?

In this little parable Jesus probes our heart where is your treasure? Treasure has a special connection to the heart, the place of desire and longing, the place of will and focus. The thing we most set our heart on is our highest treasure. What do you treasure above all else?

Lord Jesus, free my heart from all possessiveness and from coveting what belongs to another. May I desire you alone as the one true treasure worth possessing above all else. Help me to make good use of the material blessings you give me that I may use them generously for your glory and for the good of others.




