



Pymble Parish COVID Update

As you may be aware, NSW has reached 80% vaccination rate. As such, all public Masses will resume in both Sacred Heart Church and OLPS Church.

Our Churches will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified. During this stage:

- a. Other rituals such as Baptisms and other services of prayer and devotion will resume.
- b. Confessions will be publicly scheduled again.
- c. The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the 4 sqm principle. This will be 130 for Sacred Heart Church, and 65 for OLPS Church. This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- d. Congregational singing will not be possible, but a musician and cantor are possible and will be engaged for the beauty of the liturgy.
- e. COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be re-introduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - ii. The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - iii. The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head.
 - iv. Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession.
- f. It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.

Please note that Bishop Anthony Randazzo has decided that the Broken Bay Sunday Obligation will remain suspended until 1 December 2021.

Given that our parish facilities other than our church buildings will be subject to the status of people's vaccination all face-to-face parish meetings, social gatherings, and use of facilities, such meeting rooms and halls will continue to be suspended until after 1 December.

- 3. From 1 December 2021:
 - a. Density for gatherings in our churches will shift to one person per 2 sqm for both indoor and outdoor gatherings.
 - b. Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
 - c. There is no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.



The Service NSW QR Code check in process has a procedure to allow visitors not using telephones to carry their own personal COVID-19 check-in card. A sample personal COVID-19 check-in card is shown below. The card is provided on paper and can be folded to the size of a credit card.



You are able to make your own individual card at home by following the link below. The link will allow you to produce a card and print it at home for use at any Service NSW check in point. If you have any difficulty producing the card then the Parish office is available to help.



Ministry Symposium: "Fresh Heart, Fresh Hope"

In this one-day symposium, we explore best practices and pitfalls in our efforts to engage our communities and key groups to effectively grow our mission in Jesus Christ.

Our scenario is a fictional parish, planning for 2022. Session 2: Managing Change Managing the tensions, roadblocks, and opportunities for healthy conflict and collaboration as the vision starts to come to life.


Session 3: Making it Happen Determining how to align goals, resource actions, and keep people motivated through safe and healthy processes.

Kindergarten Transition at Sacred Heart in 2021

Recently, we were delighted to welcome our students who will be in Kindergarten in 2022 to a zoom assembly. During our time together, we offered a play-based experience for the students as they explored the Christmas Story through Scriptural Storytelling. This involved the retelling of the story using figurines. We are looking forward to sharing our Scriptural Storytelling experiences live with the children next year. In the meantime, they were able to re-create Jesus' story using pictures, just like Grace has done in the picture above.

Scriptural Storytelling is a component of the Broken Bay early years' student-centred pedagogy in Religious Education. Each child is invited to continue their journey in an experiential learning environment. This approach maintains that the heart and mind will be best developed when children first have experiences of the body: tactile, sensory and hands-on. The experiences of the heart through wonder and awe are in themselves experiences of love and so this approach may also influence a love of learning.

You can select one that interests you or take any one. The Hamper Cards are available at the back of the Churches. Hamper boxes are also available for packing your hampers.

On the weekend of 13-14 **November**, please take a hamper card and return your hamper on the weekend of 4-5 **December**. For Our Lady of Perpetual Succour parishioners, the hampers should be left at the back of the Church. The hampers returned to Sacred Heart should be placed in the Prayer Room.

Please complete the control sheet when taking a Hamper Card for our tracking processes. You should also mark the hamper boxes with the hamper number and the Hamper Card itself should be attached to the first hamper box. If you missed out on a numbered Hamper Card, you can still make up a hamper and attach a card to it marked with the number "oo". Every hamper will find a home.

If your hamper includes more than one box, be sure to mark boxes, in marking pen, with "1 of 2" and "2 of 2", etc so that they can be kept together as a set.

If you are not able to assist with a hamper, then you are invited to make a cash donation. Envelopes for this purpose are an insert in the Parish Bulletin for your convenience. If your details are on the envelope, you will receive a tax deductible receipt.

There used to be a great number of priests under the former covenant, because death put an end to each one of them; but this one, Christ, because he remains for ever, can never lose his priesthood. It follows, then, that his power to save is utterly certain, since he is living for ever to intercede for all who come to God through him.

To suit us, the ideal high priest would have to be holy, innocent and uncontaminated, beyond the influence of sinners, and raised up above the heavens; one who would not need to offer sacrifices every day, as the other high priests do for their own sins and then for those of the people, because he has done this once and for all by offering himself. The Law appoints high priests who are men

Gospel Reflection

What is the purpose of God's law or commandments? The **Pharisees** prided themselves in the knowledge of the law and their ritual requirements. They made it a lifetime practice to study the 613 precepts of the Old Testament along with the numerous rabbinic commentaries. They tested Jesus to see if he correctly understood the law as they did. Jesus startled them with his profound simplicity and mastery of the law of God and its purpose.

Simply that we love as he loves! God is love and everything he does flows from his love for us. God loved us first and our love for him is a response to his exceeding grace and kindness towards us. The love of God comes first and the love of neighbour is firmly grounded in the love of God. The more we


