



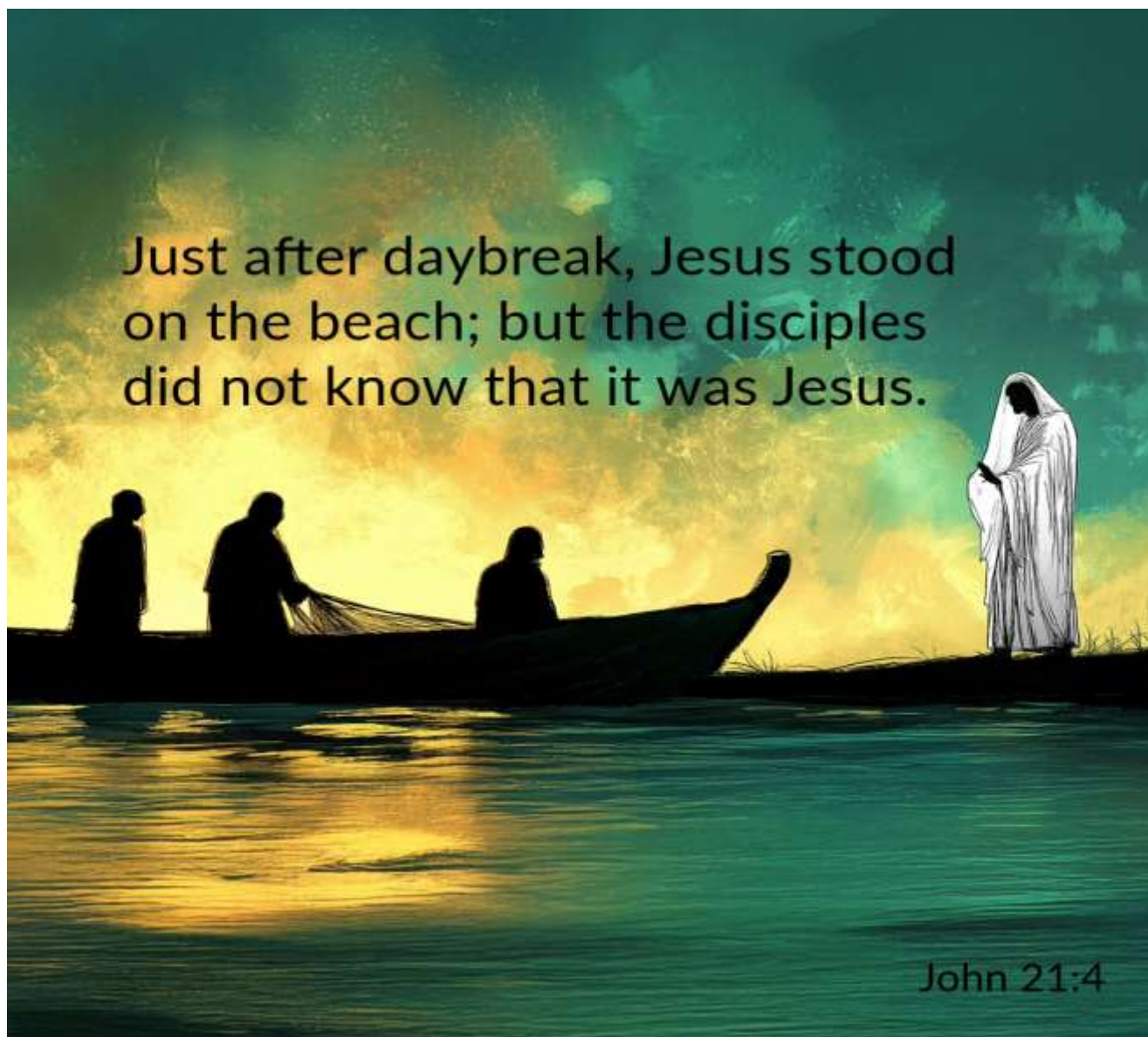

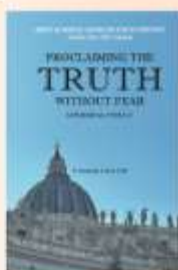

May is a month which the piety of the faithful has long dedicated to Mary, the Mother of God. Our heart rejoices at the thought of the moving tribute of faith and love which will soon be paid to the Queen of Heaven in every corner of the earth. For this is the month during which Christians, in their churches and their homes, offer the Virgin Mother more fervent and loving acts of homage and veneration; and it is the month in which a greater abundance of God's merciful gifts comes down to us from our Mother's throne.

We are delighted and consoled by this pious custom associated with the month of May, which pays honour to the Blessed Virgin and brings such rich benefits to the Christian people. Since Mary is rightly to be regarded as the way by which we are led to Christ, the person who encounters Mary cannot help but encounter Christ likewise. For what other reason do we continually turn to Mary except to seek the Christ in her arms, to seek our Saviour in her, through her, and with her? To Him men are to turn amid the anxieties and perils of this world, urged on by duty and driven by the compelling needs of their heart, to find a haven of salvation, a transcendent fountain of life.

Because the month of May is a powerful incentive to more frequent and fervent prayers, and because our petitions more readily find access to her compassionate heart during it, it has been a favourite custom of Our predecessors to choose this month, dedicated to Mary, for urging the Christian people to offer up public prayers whenever the needs of the Church demanded it or some grave crisis threatened the human race. This year, Venerable Brothers, We in turn feel compelled to call for such prayers from the whole Catholic world. Looking at the present needs of the Church and the status of world peace, We have sound reasons to believe that the present hour is especially grave and that a plea for concerted prayer on the part of all Christians is a matter of top priority.

May she who experienced the cares and hardships of earthly life, the weariness of daily toil, the hardships and trials of poverty, and the sorrows of Calvary, come to aid the needs of the Church and the human race. May she graciously lend an ear to the devout pleas of those all over the world who beg her for peace. May she enlighten the minds of those who rule nations. And finally, may she prevail on God, who rules the winds and storms, to calm the tempests in men's warring hearts and grant us peace in our day.

Celebrating the Charismatic Renewal at the Vatican

A Joyful Pilgrimage of our parishioner

It was a glorious spring sunny day in the inner courtyard, *Cortile di San Damaso*, of the Vatican in Rome.

A sea of colourful flags and dress surrounded me. We were of all ages, colours, sizes, and languages—nearly 2,000 of us. The air was full of joy, excitement, and expectation!

A special day had been organised by CHARIS for those attending the Charismatic Renewal Conference for Prayer. It was approved by Pope Francis who (before his illness) had planned to give a brief audience to us. This was to be followed by the walk through the Holy Door for the Jubilee Year of Hope, a private tour of St. Peter's Basilica, and Mass. The conference was "live-in," and there were keynote presenters from all over the world on specific aspects of intercessory prayer and the gifts and charisms of the Holy Spirit.

Praise and worship are essential parts of charismatic prayer, and so each session began with praise and prayer. Mass was celebrated every day. Over 67 countries were represented (both laypeople and clergy), and therefore the talks were interpreted into various languages via headphones. There were 15 Australians from NSW, VIC, QLD, and WA, and three of our New Zealand neighbours.

The week was culminating in our special day at the Vatican. We left the retreat centre at 6:30am, and here we were in the inner courtyard of the Vatican.

The music began on the speakers. We cheered and joined in singing at the top of our voices: **"Alabaré, alabaré, alabaré a mi Señor!"** (Spanish for "I will praise, I will praise, I will praise my Lord!") It was the most exhilarating and uplifting experience, singing and praising God as we wound our way through the beautiful Vatican gardens, knowing that we were part of something far greater than ourselves.

We were the Lord's people—Easter people, full of love, peace, and joy. The day culminated in the Charismatic Mass, concelebrated by archbishops, bishops, and priests from around the world. It will stay with me forever.

First Reading

Acts of the Apostles 5: 27-32, 40-41

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

The high priest demanded an explanation of the apostles. ‘We gave you a formal warning,’ he said ‘not to preach in this name, and what have you done? You have filled Jerusalem with your teaching, and seem determined to fix the guilt of this man's death on us.’ In reply Peter and the apostles said, ‘Obedience to God comes before obedience to men; it was the God of our ancestors who raised up Jesus, but it was you who had him executed by hanging on a tree. By his own right hand God has now raised him up to be leader and saviour, to give repentance and forgiveness of sins through him to Israel. We are witnesses to all this, we and the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him.’ They warned the apostles not to speak in the name of Jesus and released them. And so they left the presence of the Sanhedrin glad to have had the honour of suffering humiliation for the sake of the name

strength, honour, glory and blessing.’ Then I heard all the living things in creation – everything that lives in the air, and on the ground, and under the ground, and in the sea, crying, ‘To the One who is sitting on the throne and to the Lamb, be all praise, honour, glory and power, for ever and ever.’ And the four animals said, ‘Amen’; and the elders prostrated themselves to worship.

Gospel John 21: 1-19

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. Jesus showed himself again to the disciples. It was by the Sea of Tiberias, and it happened like this: Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael from Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee and two more of his disciples were together. Simon Peter said, ‘I’m going fishing.’ They replied, ‘We’ll come with you.’ They went out and got into the boat but caught nothing that night.

It was light by now and there stood Jesus on the shore, though the disciples did not realise that it was Jesus. Jesus called out, ‘Have you caught anything, friends?’ And when they answered, ‘No’, he said, ‘Throw the net out to starboard and you’ll find something.’ So they dropped the net, and there were so many fish that they could not haul it in. The disciple Jesus loved said to Peter, ‘It is the Lord.’ At these words ‘It is the Lord’, Simon Peter, who had practically nothing on, wrapped his cloak round him and jumped into the water. The other disciples came on in the boat, towing the net and the fish; they were only about a hundred yards from land.

As soon as they came ashore they saw that there was some bread there, and a charcoal fire with fish cooking on it. Jesus said, ‘Bring some of the fish you have just caught.’ Simon Peter went aboard and dragged the net to the shore, full of big fish, one hundred and fifty-three of them; and in spite of there being so many the net was not broken. Jesus said to them, ‘Come and have breakfast.’ None of the disciples was bold enough to ask, ‘Who are you?’; they knew quite well it was the Lord. Jesus then stepped forward, took the bread and gave it to them, and the same with the fish. This was the third time that Jesus showed himself to the disciples after rising from the dead.

After the meal Jesus said to Simon Peter, ‘Simon son of John, do you love me more than these others do?’ He answered, ‘Yes Lord, you know I love you.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Feed my lambs.’

A second time he said to him, ‘Simon son of John, do you love me?’ He replied, ‘Yes, Lord, you know I love you.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Look after my sheep.’ Then he said to him a third time, ‘Simon son of John, do you love me?’ Peter was upset that he asked him the third time, ‘Do you love me?’ and said, ‘Lord, you know everything; you know I love you.’ Jesus said to him, ‘Feed my sheep.

*‘I tell you most solemnly,
when you were young
you put on your own belt
and walked where you liked;
but when you grow old
you will stretch out your hands,
and somebody else will put a belt round you
and take you where you would rather not go.’*

In these words he indicated the kind of death by which Peter would give glory to God. After this he said, ‘Follow me.’

The Gospel of the Lord.

Gospel Reflection

After Jesus’ resurrection, the apostles didn’t recognize him right away at the Sea of Galilee, especially Peter, who had gone back to fishing out of discouragement and uncertainty about the future. Jesus met them there after a fruitless night of work, guiding them to a miraculous catch of fish—just as he had done when he first called Peter to follow him. This repeat of the miracle served as a powerful reminder of Peter’s original mission: to become a “fisher of people” and lead others to Christ. When Peter realized it was Jesus, he ran to him, showing a renewed eagerness to be near the Lord.

Later, around a shared breakfast, Jesus asked Peter three times if he loved him, echoing Peter’s three earlier denials. Each time, Peter affirmed his love, and Jesus called him to feed and care for his followers. This was a moment of deep healing and recommissioning, not just for Peter, but symbolically for all believers who feel they’ve failed or lost their way. Jesus’ appearance reveals that he seeks us out in our weakness, forgives us, and invites us again into relationship and purpose. His love and grace are always greater than our doubts or past mistakes.

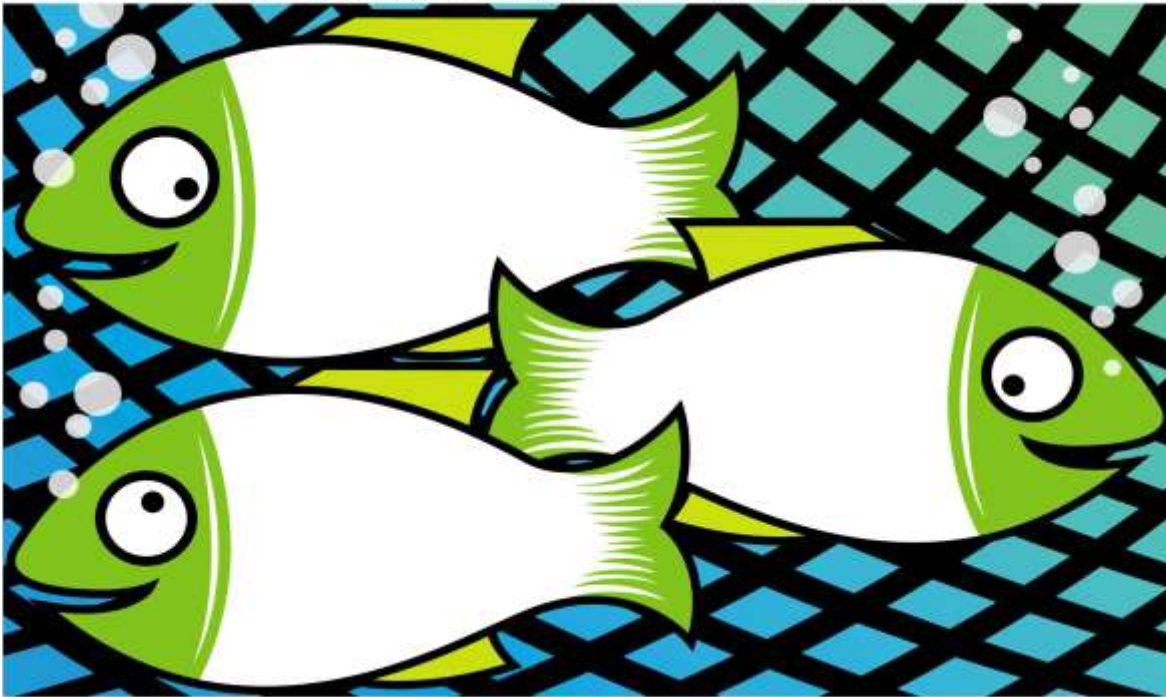
