Pymble Parish COVID Update

Based on the current Public Health Orders, both Sacred Heart and OLPS will be open to all, and in accordance with the health regulations, the vaccination status of our people who attend our churches, or who undertake a ministry in them, will not need to be verified.

The following will apply **until 15 December**:

- The number of people who can attend Mass and other liturgies and services of prayer is based on the **2 sqm principle**. **This will be 260 for Sacred Heart Church, and 130 for OLPS Church.** This applies to funerals and weddings where all attendees are fully vaccinated.
- Congregational singing will not be possible.
- COVID safe practices related to the celebration of our liturgies will be re-introduced including:
 - Avoiding the handling of objects by multiple persons;
 - The Chalice will not be shared; Holy Communion for the Faithful is to be under one species only;
 - The Sign of Peace should only be given by a simple bow or nod of the head;
 - Those who wish to receive Holy Communion on the tongue will be asked to wait until the end of the Communion Procession;
 - **It is essential that anyone visiting our churches use the QR code to register their visit, sanitize, and always wear a mask.**

Please note that Bishop Anthony Randazzo has determined that the Broken Bay Sunday Obligation will remain suspended until 1 December 2021.

From 15 December 2021:

- Congregational singing will be possible at our liturgies.
- There will be no restriction on the use of other parish facilities such as meeting rooms and halls.

Salvatorian Fathers Foundation day 8th December 1881



The Salvatorian Family consists of the members of the Society of the Divine Saviour (Societas Divini Salvatoris), members of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour (Sorores Divini Salvatoris) and Lay Salvatorians. Fr Francis Jordan was the Founder of the Salvatorian Family. Here is a little about Fr Jordan's life.

His Family of Origin

John Baptist Jordan was born in a family of modest means on 16 June 1848, in Gurtwell, a village in southern Germany close to the Swiss border. Together with his family, he led a simple life, not without economic difficulties and sacrifices.

His Youth

The young John Baptist Jordan was an indefatigable worker, who dedicated himself totally to the support of his family. And although he did not have time for study because of his work, he had the opportunity to travel and make himself familiar with the reality of his country.

His Vocation

Adverse circumstances did not allow John Baptist Jordan to study at the best moment. However, at the same time, they gave him the opportunity to foster his vocation. Later he was able to take up studies with diligence and many talents, above all learning very quickly foreign languages. This way he widened his vision of the world and of the Church, always in need of renewal.

The Time of Discernment

On 21 January 1880 John Baptist Jordan left for his trip to the Middle East. It was a kind of a pilgrimage to the holy places. It was also useful for perfecting the languages and for exploring the amazing missionary horizons through direct discussion with the persons important for the project he had in his heart and which at this point he did not keep secret.

The Start of the Work

On 8 December 1881 Jordan officially founded the First Grade of the Apostolic Teaching Society together with Fathers von Leonhardi and Luthen in the St Brigit Chapel.

The Female Branch

To include all people in his project was a dream of Francis Jordan. As such, he started the new branch of his missionary work to include his spiritual daughters in 1882.

Sending out the First Missionaries

One of the convictions of Francis Jordan was that "the works of God flourish only in the shadow of the Cross." After so many sacrifices and desertions because of the interventions of the Church, the work flourished and took up the mission of announcing salvation, sowing the seed of life and of hope in every corner of the world.

His final years

Fr Francis Jordan carried his cross until the end. Despite the difficulties in his life, he was marked by obedience to the will of God until the final abandonment of himself into God's arms.

A reading from the prophet Baruch

Jerusalem, take off your dress of sorrow and distress,

Every time I pray for all of you, I pray with joy, remembering how you have helped to spread the Good News from the day you first heard it right up to the present. I am quite certain that the One who began this good work in you will see that it is finished when the Day of Christ Jesus comes. God knows how much I miss you all, loving you as Christ Jesus loves you. My prayer is that your love for each other may increase more and more and never stop improving your knowledge and deepening your perception so that you can always recognise what is best. This will help you to become pure and blameless, and prepare you for the Day of Christ, when you will reach the perfect goodness which Jesus Christ produces in us for the glory and praise of God.

Gospel Lk 3:1-6

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

In the fifteenth year of Tiberius Caesar's reign, when Pontius Pilate was governor of Judaea, Herod tetrarch of Galilee, his brother Philip tetrarch of the lands of Ituraea and Trachonitis, Lysanias tetrarch of Abilene, during the pontificate of Annas and Caiaphas, the word of God came to John son of Zechariah, in the wilderness. He went through the whole Jordan district proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins, as it is written in the book of the sayings of the prophet Isaiah:

A voice cries in the wilderness;
Prepare a way for the Lord,
Make his paths straight.
Every valley will be filled in,
Every mountain and hill be laid low,
Winding ways will be straightened
And rough roads made smooth.
And all mankind shall see the salvation of God.

Gospel Reflection

John was filled and led by the Spirit

John's prophetic calling and mission preceded his conception and birth. The angel had announced to Zechariah that his barren

wife will conceive a son, and "you shall call his name John," and "he will be filled with the Holy Spirit even from his mother's womb". When John received his name shortly after birth, his father prophesied that he would be "called the prophet of the Most High who will go before the Lord to prepare his ways". John was called to be a prophet, a spokesman for God.

Luke tells us when John appeared on the world scene. Luke lists a few of the key reigning rulers in John's era, including Tiberius Caesar of Rome. These rulers pale in reference to the man who now stood at the door of a new era of grace and salvation for the world. John's mission was to prepare the way for God's Anointed King who would come to establish God's rule above all other kings and authorities. Luke emphasizes the universal call of the Gospel to all peoples without distinction. He quotes from the prophet Isaiah that "all flesh shall see the salvation of God".

John was a servant of God's Word

Luke tells us that "the word of God came to John" when he was dwelling in the wilderness of Judea (Luke 3:2). John was called from an early age to devote himself to prayer and to the word of God. John not only took the Scriptures to heart, he moulded his life according to them, and made himself a servant of the Word of God. John was led by the Spirit into a barren and lonely place away from the noise and distractions of everyday life. There God taught John in the solitude of the desert and prepared him for a prophetic ministry that would turn the hearts of his people to receive their long-awaited Messiah.

In the ancient world when a king decided to tour his kingdom, he first sent his courier ahead to prepare the way. John is the courier and great herald of the Messiah King who proclaims to all the peoples that the impending reign of God is now very close at hand. Isaiah had long ago prophesied the role of the Forerunner of the Messiah (Isaiah 40:3-5). John undoubtedly took this word to heart as he searched the Scriptures and reflected on the word of God in the wilderness. When John began his public ministry he travelled throughout the region of Judea and preached a "baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins".

Do you allow God's Word to transform your life?

John the Baptist tells us that the first step is conversion and repentance. Conversion involves receiving God's word into our heart and mind and allowing his Word to change our attitudes and wrong ways of thinking and judging. Repentance is the deliberate turning away from sin (wrong-doing) and turning to God to receive his pardon, healing, and strength to do what is good and reject what is wrong.

Are you hungry for the Word of God and do you allow God's word to transform the way you think, speak, and live your life?
