



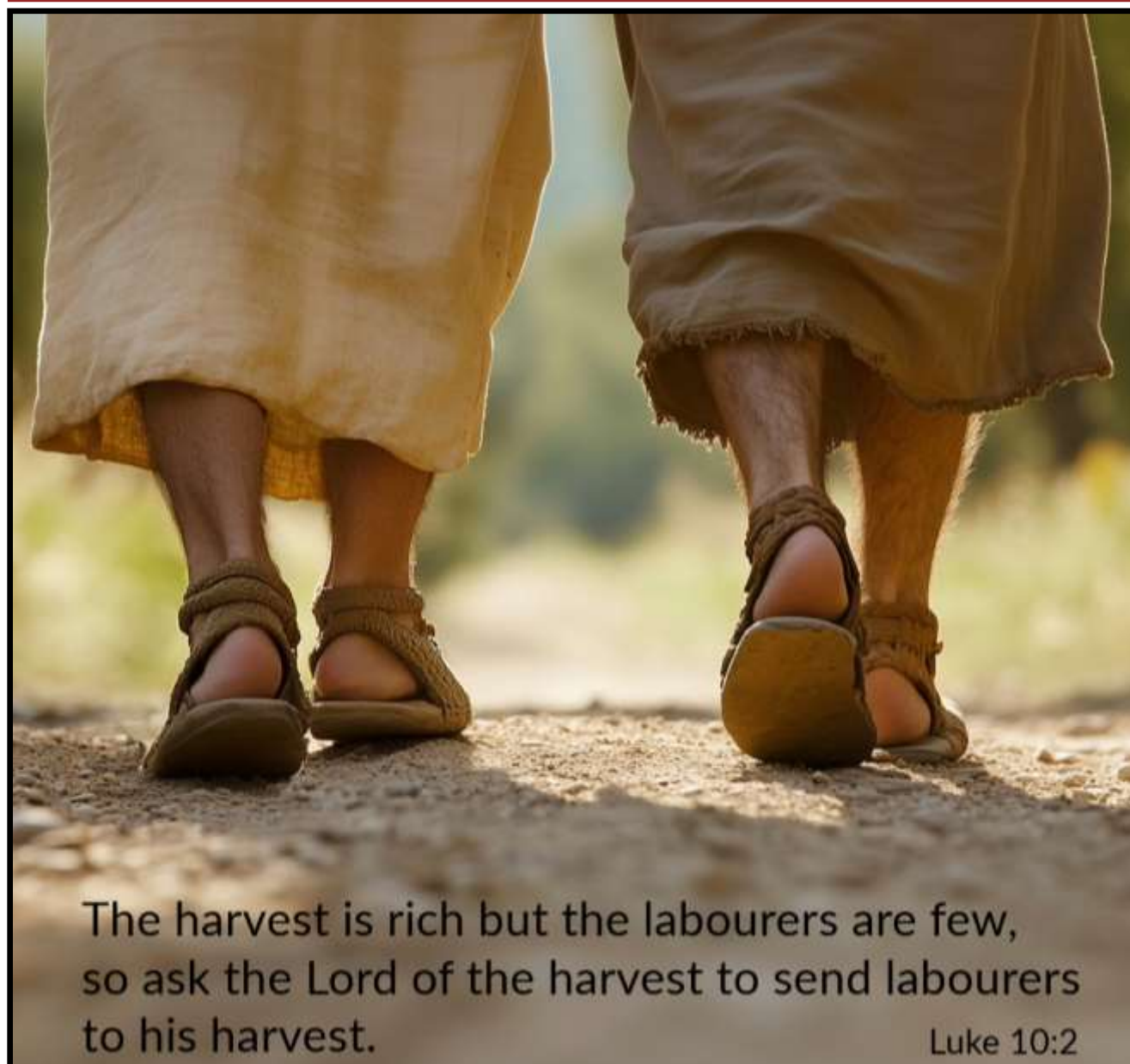

Pentecost and The Gifts of the Holy Spirit

This term in Religious Education lessons the children have focused on Pentecost and the significance of the Holy Spirit. The children have been examining the following reading, Acts 2:1-8, 12. This reading has given the children an understanding of Pentecost and the gifts the Holy Spirit gave to the apostles.


This term the Year 3 children made their Confirmation and received the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit: wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety and fear of the Lord. These gifts help the children to strengthen their faith and be followers of Jesus throughout their lives. The children have created an artwork to remind them of the gifts they have been given.



Children’s Liturgy at Sacred Heart

On Sunday at Children’s Liturgy, the children learnt about Saints Peter and Paul. While Paul went to spread the Gospel, Jesus instructed Peter to build the church by saying “So now I say to you: You are Peter and, on this rock, I will build my Church.”

We spoke about Peter being our first leader of the Church, our Pope, and Pope LeoXIV leading us today. The children each had a rock which had ‘Peter → Leo XIV’ written on one side and then they drew a picture of the Church on the other side of their rock. The rock symbolises the strong foundation of the Church. We also discussed the symbols on the Coat of Arms of Pope Leo XIV.

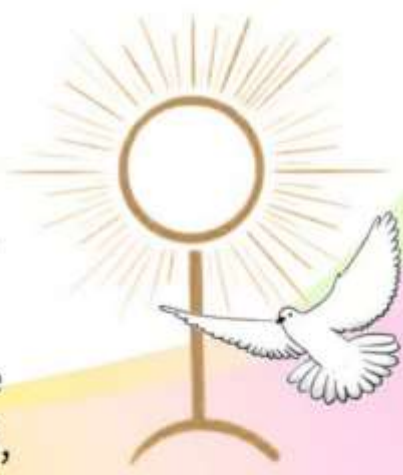

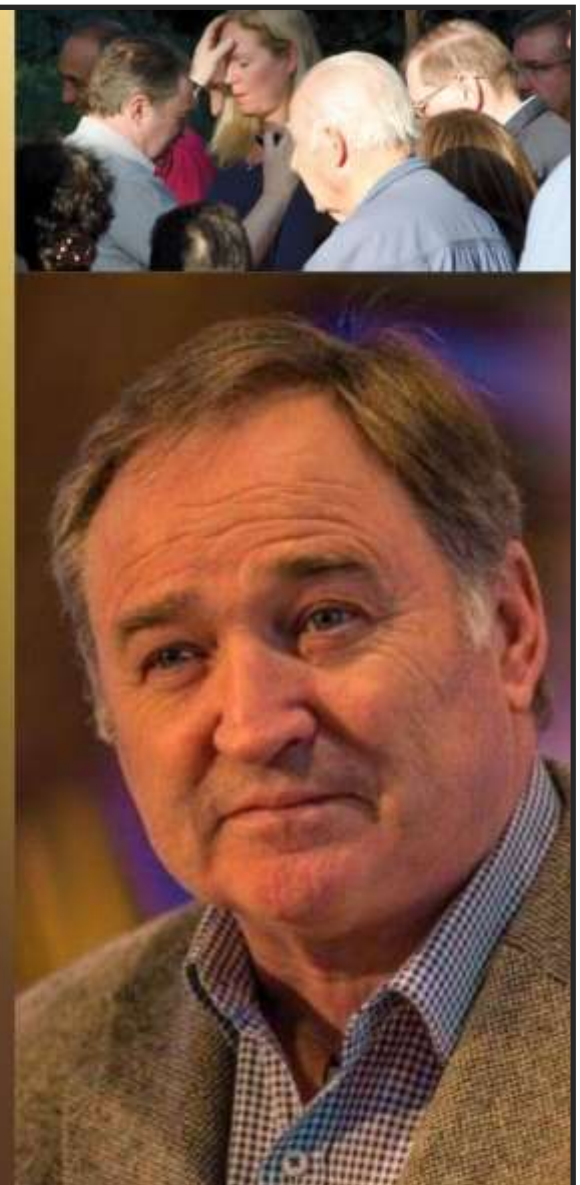

our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom the
world is crucified to me, and I to the world. It
does not matter if a person is circumcised or

not; what matters is for him to become an
altogether new creature. Peace and mercy to
all who follow this rule, who form the Israel of
God.

**I want no more trouble from anybody after
this; the marks on my body are those of Jesus.
The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with
your spirit, my brothers. Amen.**

Gospel Luke 10: 1-12, 17-20

**A reading from the holy Gospel according to
Luke**

The Lord appointed seventy-two others and
sent them out ahead of him, in pairs, to all the
towns and places he himself was to visit. He
said to them, ‘The harvest is rich but the
labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the
harvest to send labourers to his harvest. Start
off now, but remember, I am sending you out
like lambs among wolves. Carry no purse, no
haversack, no sandals. Salute no one on the
road. Whatever house you go into, let your
first words be, “Peace to this house!” And if a
man of peace lives there, your peace will go
and rest on him; if not, it will come back to
you. Stay in the same house, taking what food
and drink they have to offer, for the labourer
deserves his wages; do not move from house
to house. Whenever you go into a town where
they make you welcome, eat what is set
before you. Cure those in it who are sick, and
say, “The kingdom of God is very near to you.”
But whenever you enter a town and they do
not make you welcome, go out into its streets
and say, “We wipe off the very dust of your
town that clings to our feet, and leave it with
you. Yet be sure of this: the kingdom of God is
very near.” I tell you, that on that day it will
not go as hard with Sodom as with that town.’

The seventy-two came back rejoicing. ‘Lord,’
they said, ‘even the devils submit to us when
we use your name.’ He said to them, ‘I
watched Satan fall like lightning from heaven.
Yes, I have given you power to tread
underfoot serpents and scorpions and the
whole strength of the enemy; nothing shall
ever hurt you. Yet do not rejoice that the
spirits submit to you; rejoice rather that your
names are written in heaven.’

Gospel Reflection

God's word grows like a seed within us
In like manner, the word of God is sown in the
hearts of receptive men and women who hear
his word, accept it with trust and obedience,
and then share the abundant fruit of God's
word in their life with others. The harvest
Jesus had in mind was not only the gathering
in of the people of Israel, but all the peoples
(and nations) of the world. John the Evangelist

tells us that "God so loved the world that he
gave his one and only Son, that whoever
believes in him shall not perish but have
eternal life" (John 3:16).

Be a sower of God's word of peace and mercy
What does Jesus mean when he says his
disciples must be "lambs in the midst of
wolves"? The prophet Isaiah foretold a time
when wolves and lambs will dwell in peace
(Isaiah 11:6 and 65:25). This certainly refers to
the second coming of the Lord Jesus when all
will be united under the Lordship of Jesus
after he has put down all of his enemies and
established the full reign of God over all the
heavens and the earth. In the meantime, the
disciples must expect opposition and
persecution from those who would oppose
the Gospel. Jesus came to set us free from the
power of sin, Satan, and death by laying down
his life for us as our sacrificial lamb (John
1:29), to atone for our sins and the sins of the
world. We, in turn, must be willing to offer our
lives with gratitude and humble service for
our Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ.

**We are called to speak and witness in God's
name**
What is the significance of Jesus appointing
seventy disciples to the ministry of the word?
Seventy was a significant number in biblical
times. Moses chose seventy elders to help
him in the task of leading the people through
the wilderness. The Jewish Sanhedrin, the
governing council for the nation of Israel, was
composed of seventy members. In Jesus'
times seventy was held to be the number of
nations throughout the world. Jesus
commissioned the seventy to a two-fold task -
to speak in his name and to act with his
power.

**Our true source of joy comes from God who
saves us**
Why does Jesus tell his disciples to not take
joy in their own successes, even spiritual
ones? Jesus makes clear that the true source
of joy is God, and God alone (he created us in
his own image and likeness - Genesis 1:26-27).
Regardless of the circumstances, in good
times and bad times, in success or loss, God
always assures us of victory in the Lord Jesus
Christ (1 Corinthians 15:57). Jesus assures his
disciples that he has all power over evil,
including power over Satan and the evil spirits
or fallen angels who conspire against us.
Scripture tells us that Jesus came into the
world to overthrow the evil one (John 12:31).
We, too, as disciples of the Lord Jesus have
been given spiritual authority and power for
overcoming the works of darkness and evil.

**Lord Jesus, may the joy and truth of the Gospel
transform my life that I may witness it to
those around me. Grant that I may spread your
truth and merciful love wherever I go.**

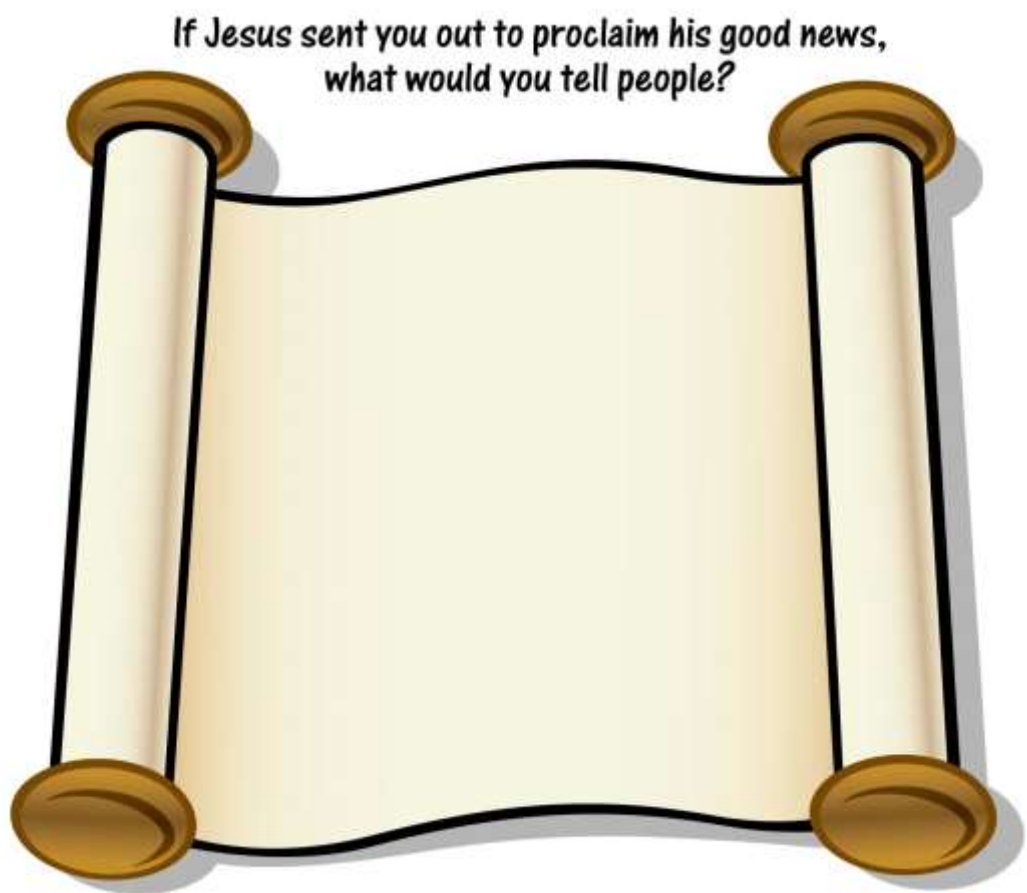
