Salvatorian Fathers Foundation day 8th December 1881

The Salvatorian Family consists of the members of the Society of the Divine Saviour (Societas Divini Salvatoris), members of the Congregation of the Sisters of the Divine Saviour (Sorores Divini Salvatoris) and Lay Salvatorians. Fr Francis Jordan was the Founder of the Salvatorian Family. Here is a a little about Fr Jordan's life.

His Family of Origin

John Baptist Jordan was born in a family of modest means on 16 June 1848, in Gurtwell, a village in southern Germany close to the Swiss border. Together with his family, he led a simple life, not without economic difficulties and sacrifices.

His Youth

The young John Baptist Jordan was an indefatigable worker, who dedicated himself totally to the support of his family. And although he did not have time for study because of his work, he had the opportunity to travel and make himself familiar with the reality of his country.

His Vocation

Adverse circumstances did not allow John Baptist Jordan to study at the best moment. However, at the same time, they gave him the opportunity to foster his vocation. Later he was able to take up studies with diligence and many talents, above all learning very quickly foreign languages. This way he widened his vision of the world and of the Church, always in need of renewal.

The Time of Discernment

On 21 January 1880 John Baptist Jordan left for his trip to the Middle East. It was a kind of a pilgrimage to the holy places. It was also useful for perfecting the languages and for exploring the amazing missionary horizons through direct discussion with the persons important for the project he had in his heart and which at this point he did not keep secret.

The Start of the Work

On 8 December 1881 Jordan officially founded the First Grade of the Apostolic Teaching Society together with Fathers von Leonhardi and Luthen in the St Brigit Chapel.

The Female Branch

To include all people in his project was a dream of Francis Jordan. As such, he started the new branch of his missionary work to include his spiritual daughters in 1882.

Sending out the First Missionaries

One of the convictions of France Jordan was that "the works of God flourish only in the shadow of the Cross." After so many sacrifices and desertions because of the interventions of the Church, the work flourished and took up the mission of announcing salvation, sowing the seed of life and of hope in every corner of the world.

His final years

Fr Francis Jordan carried his cross until the end. Despite the difficulties in his life, he was marked by obedience to the will of God until the final abandonment of himself into God's arms.

All: Amen**.**




PASTORAL WORKS Broken

Liturgy of the Word Second Sunday of Advent

Entrance Antiphon

O people of Sion, behold, the Lord will come to save the nations, and the Lord will make the glory of his voice heard

in t he joy of your heart.

First Reading Isaiah 11: 1-10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

A shoot springs from the stock of Jesse, a scion thrusts from his roots: on him the spirit of the Lord rests, a spirit of wisdom and insight, a spirit of counsel and power, a spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord.

(The fear of the Lord is his breath,)
He does not judge by appearances,
he gives no verdict on hearsay,
but judges the wretched with integrity,
and with equity gives a verdict for the poor of
the land.

His word is a rod that strikes the ruthless, his sentences bring death to the wicked.

Integrity is the loincloth round his waist, faithfulness the belt about his hips.

The wolf lives with the lamb, the panther lies down with the kid, calf and lion cub feed together with a little boy to lead them.

The cow and the bear make friends, their young lie down together.

The lion eats straw like the ox.

The infant plays over the cobra's hole; into the viper's lair the young child puts his hand.

They do no hurt, no harm, on all my holy mountain, for the country is filled with the knowledge of the Lord as the waters swell the sea.

That day, the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples. It will be sought out by the nations and its home will be glorious.

Responsorial Psalm <u>Ps 71: 1-2, 7-8, 12-13 R. cf</u> <u>v.7</u>

(R.) Justice shall flourish in his time, and fullness of peace for ever.

- 1. O God, give your judgement to the king, to a king's son your justice, that he may judge your people in justice and your poor in right judgement. (R.)
- In his days justice shall flourish and peace till the moon fails.
 He shall rule from sea to sea, from the Great River to the earth's bounds. (R.)
- 3. For he shall save the poor when they cry And the needy who are helpless.

Second Reading Romans 15: 4-9

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

Everything that was written long ago in the scriptures was meant to teach us something about hope from the examples scripture gives of how people who did not give up were helped by God. And may he who helps us when we refuse to give up, help you all to be tolerant with each other, following the example of Christ Jesus, so that united in mind and voice you may give glory to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

It can only be to God's glory, then, for you to treat each other in the same friendly way as Christ treated you. The reason Christ became the servant of circumcised Jews was not only so that God could faithfully carry out the promises made to the patriarchs, it was also to get the pagans to give glory to God for his mercy, as scripture says in one place: For this I shall praise you among the pagans and sing your name.

Gospel Acclamation Luke 3: 4, 6

Alleluia, alleluia!

Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths:

all people shall see the salvation of God. *Alleluia!*

Gospel <u>Matthew 3: 1-12</u>

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

In due course John the Baptist appeared; he preached in the wilderness of Judaea and this was his message: 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.' This was the man the prophet Isaiah spoke of when he said:

A voice cries in the wilderness: Prepare a way for the Lord, make his paths straight.

This man John wore a garment made of camelhair with a leather belt round his waist, and his wild honey. food was locusts and Then Jerusalem and all Judaea and the whole Jordan district made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. But number when he saw of Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism he said to them, 'Brood of vipers, who warned you to fly from the retribution that is coming? But if you are repentant, produce the

appropriate fruit, and do not presume to tell yourselves, "We have Abraham for our father," because, I tell you, God can raise children for Abraham from these stones. Even now the axe is laid to the roots of the trees, so that any tree which fails to produce good fruit will be cut down and thrown on the fire. I baptise you in water for repentance, but the one who follows me is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to carry his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand; he will clear his threshing-floor and gather his wheat into the barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.'

Gospel Reflection Isaiah's prophecy of the Messiah

Isaiah prophesied that the Messiah would be equipped with the gifts of the Spirit - with wisdom, understanding, counsel, might, knowledge, and fear of the Lord (Isaiah 11:2 for an explanation of the gifts see this helpful article). This king would establish the kingdom of God, not by force of human will and military power, but by offering his life as the atoning sacrifice for the sin of the world. Through his death on the cross, Jesus, the true Messiah King, would defeat Satan, overcome death, and win pardon and reconciliation for sinners. God's plan of redemption included not only the Jewish people but all the nations of the earth as well. Through his death and resurrection Jesus makes us citizens of heaven and friends of God. The Lord Jesus wants us to live in joyful hope and confident expectation that he will come again to fully establish his kingdom of righteousness and peace.

A new era of God's restoration begins

Jesus tells us that John the Baptist was more than a prophet (Luke 7:26). John was the voice of the Consoler who is coming (John 1:23; Isaiah 40:1-3). He completed the cycle of prophets begun by Elijah (Matthew 11:13-14). What the prophets had carefully searched for and angels longed to see, now came to completion as John made the way ready for the coming of the Messiah, God's Anointed Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. With John the Baptist, the Holy Spirit begins the restoration to the human race of the "divine likeness", prefiguring what would be achieved with and in the Lord Jesus.

Lord, let your light burn brightly in my heart that I may know the joy and freedom of your kingdom. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and empower me to witness the truth of your Gospel and to point others to Jesus Christ.

Children's Liturgy at Sacred Heart

Last Sunday was the first day of Advent.

At children's liturgy, the children were taught that Advent is the time to prepare for the coming of someone very significant and important - Jesus Christ.

The different parts of the Advent wreath were explained. For example we discussed that the shape and the colour of the Advent wreath symbolises God's everlasting love for us all. We also discussed each of the candles, and the meaning of each one; the candle to be lit on the third Sunday of Advent is the Shepherd's candle and that it represents joy, being pink, rejoicing for the near arrival of Baby Jesus.

The children were also presented with an advent calendar for them to put heart stickers on or colour in whenever they do something

loving or kind in preparation for Christmas, and a paper model of the candles, which is also a cootie catcher, and a wreath to colour so that they can make their own wreath at home.
