Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School

Religious Education in 1/2W

Students are learning to know Christ and grow in their faith



This term in Religious Education, our Year 1/2 students have been deepening their understanding of important moments in the Mass and the life of Jesus through prayerful reflection, Scripture and hands-on learning experiences.

A special focus has been placed on The Offering during Mass. Students explored the priest's actions and listened to the words spoken during this sacred moment. They explored the significance of the epiclesis, when the priest calls down the Holy Spirit over the bread and wine, and reflected on how this reminds us that God is present with us in a special way during the Eucharist. Students also cognised the moment the priest raises the chalice and the paten as a reminder that Jesus rose from the dead and brings us new life.



Students have also explored The Ascension of Jesus through Scripture and shared reflection. They listened closely to the words Jesus spoke to His apostles before returning to Heaven and considered what His message means for us today. Through these presentations, students are developing a deeper understanding that although Jesus ascended to Heaven, He remains with us always through the Holy Spirit.

Through discussion, role play, artwork and prayer, students have been able to wonder about and respond in meaningful ways. It has been wonderful to see students engage so thoughtfully with these important teachings as they continue to grow in faith and in their relationship with God.

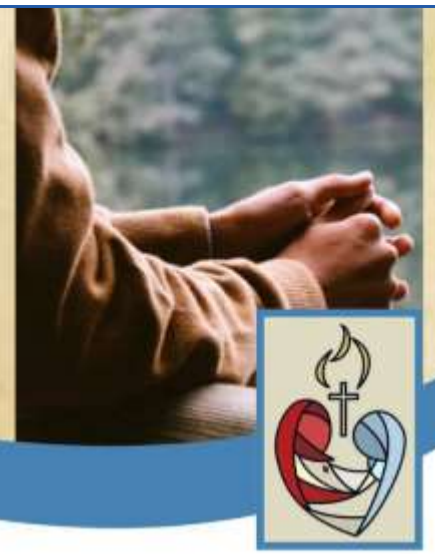

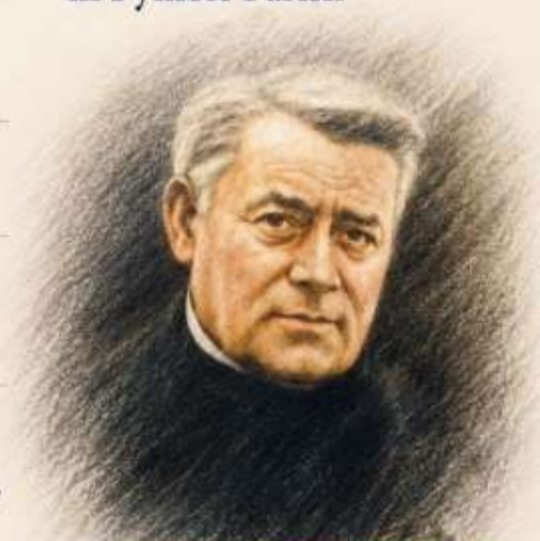

Since 1995 she has been engaged in adult faith enrichment, in various teacher education programs in NSW and in Josephite rural women's support projects in NSW and SA.



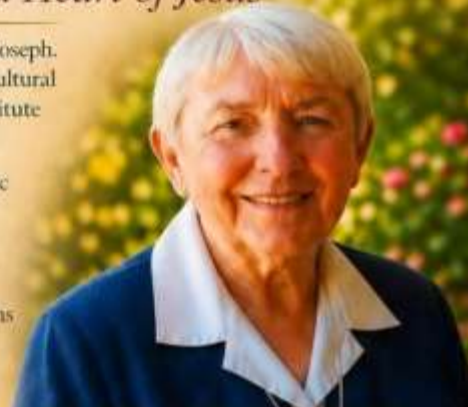
Virginia is a Sacramental theologian with a commitment to exploring God's Self-Revealing in human experience.

Liturgy of the Word

The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

Year A

Entrance Antiphon Cf Psalm 80: 17

He fed them with the finest wheat
and satisfied them with honey from the rock.

First Reading Deuteronomy 8: 2-3, 14-16

A reading from the book of Deuteronomy

Moses said to the people: ‘Remember how the Lord your God led you for forty years in the wilderness, to humble you, to test you and know your inmost heart – whether you would keep his commandments or not. He humbled you, he made you feel hunger, he fed you with manna which neither you nor your fathers had known, to make you understand that man does not live on bread alone but that man lives on everything that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

‘Do not then forget the Lord your God who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery: who guided you through this vast and dreadful wilderness, a land of fiery serpents, scorpions, thirst; who in this waterless place brought you water from the hardest rock; who in this wilderness fed you with manna that your fathers had not known.’

Second Reading 1 Corinthians 10: 16-17

A reading from the first letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

The blessing-cup that we bless is a communion with the Blood of Christ, and the bread that we break is a communion with the Body of Christ. The fact that there is only one loaf means that, though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf.

Gospel Acclamation John 6: 51-52

Gospel John 6: 51-58

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to the Jews:

‘I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.’

Then the Jews started arguing with one another: ‘How can this man give us his flesh to eat?’ they said. Jesus replied:

‘I tell you most solemnly, if you do not eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you will not have life in you. Anyone who does not eat my flesh and drink my blood has eternal life, and I shall raise him up on the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood lives in me and I live in him. As I, who am sent by the living Father, myself draw life from the Father, so whoever eats me will draw life from me. This is the bread come down from heaven; not like the bread our ancestors ate: they are dead, but anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.’

Gospel Reflection

Meditation: What is God's call on your life? Jesus chose Matthew to be his follower and friend, not because Matthew was religious or learned, popular or saintly. Matthew appeared to be none of those. He chose to live a life of wealth and ease. His profession was probably the most corrupted and despised by everyone because tax collectors made themselves wealthy by over-charging and threatening people if they did not hand over their money to them.

God searches our heart

What did Jesus see in Matthew that others did not see? When the prophet Samuel came to the house of Jesse to anoint the future heir to the throne of Israel, he bypassed all the first seven sons and chose the last! "God looks at the heart and not at the appearance of a man" he declared (1 Samuel 16:7-13). David's heart was like a compass looking for true north - it pointed to God. Matthew's heart must have yearned for God, even though he dare not show his face in a synagogue - the Jewish house of prayer and the study of Torah - God's law. When Jesus saw Matthew sitting at his

tax office - no doubt counting his day's profit - Jesus spoke only two words - "follow me". Those two words changed Matthew from a self-serving profiteer to a God-serving apostle who would bring the treasures of God's kingdom to the poor and needy.

Jesus- the divine physician
When the Pharisees challenged Jesus' unorthodox behaviour in eating with public sinners, Jesus' defence was quite simple. A doctor doesn't need to visit healthy people; instead he goes to those who are sick. Jesus likewise sought out those in the greatest need. A true physician seeks healing of the whole person - body, mind, and spirit. Jesus came as the divine physician and good shepherd to care for his people and to restore them to wholeness of life. The orthodox were so preoccupied with their own practice of religion that they neglected to help the very people who needed spiritual care. Their religion was selfish because they didn't want to have anything to do with people not like themselves. Jesus stated his mission in unequivocal terms: I came not to call the righteous, but to call sinners. Ironically the orthodox were as needy as those they despised. All have sinned and fall short of the glory of God (Romans 3:23).

On more than one occasion Jesus quoted the saying from the prophet Hosea: For I desire mercy and not sacrifice (Hosea 6:6). Do you thank the Lord Jesus for the great mercy he has shown to you? And do you show mercy to your neighbour as well?

Lord Jesus, our Saviour, let us now come to you: Our hearts are cold; Lord, warm them with your selfless love. Our hearts are sinful; cleanse them with your precious blood. Our hearts are weak; strengthen them with your joyous Spirit. Our hearts are empty; fill them with your divine presence. Lord Jesus, our hearts are yours; possess them always and only for yourself. (Prayer of Augustine, 354-430)

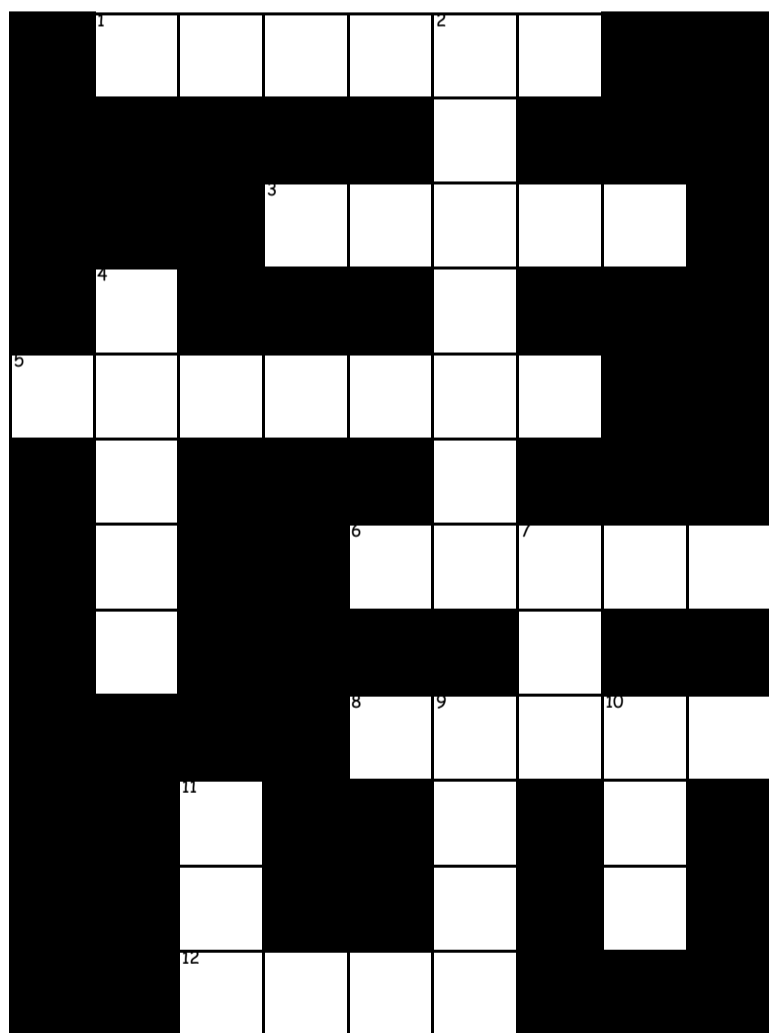
