


What is a Confirmation name?

A Confirmation name is best thought of as a name that God – and only God – calls you by. It is not a name that other people call you by, like a baptismal name. Ideally, a Confirmation name should be the name of a Saint whom you know something about, or who inspires you, or whose virtues you want to imitate. It is the name of a saint who will accompany you through life. It is a reminder of the day of your Confirmation, when you were anointed with the oil of the Holy Spirit.



RCIA Testimony My Journey to Catholicism Edward Man

My name is Ed. I'm turning 39 in May this year and wanted to share my journey on becoming a Catholic.

My path has been unusual as I spent my formative years at a Catholic Jesuit school (St Aloysius' College) from years 5 to 12, so I've

always been surrounded by the Catholic community and I've always subconsciously adhered to core Catholic values.

Serendipitously most of my friends and colleagues are Catholics, so it was inevitable at some stage I would formalise my conversion.

Growing up, I didn't realise it that I was one of a handful of non-Catholics to attend Aloysius, but I suspect it had something to do with the late Father Anthony Smith SJ wanting to give opportunities to kids from lower socio economic backgrounds from different walks of life an opportunity to succeed in life, so I've always had time for the Catholic Church and admired their social justice values and helping those in need.

The plan was to convert to Catholicism after school, but life got in the way (e.g. university studies, marriage, kids, busy career). It also didn't help when a couple of close friends from school passed away in their early 20s, so I was an angry young man that was skeptical about the existence of God.

Despite a successful career in the IT industry and ticking off a number of "material" goals, there was a big void in my life that was missing and after realising the errors of my way, I signed up for the RCIA program at Sacred Heart (Pymble Parish).

Throughout the RCIA program, the journey has been a salient reminder of what I was taught during my time at high school and the well crafted Symbolon videos were extremely effective in explaining the Catholic Faith.

After becoming a Catholic, I felt complete and it's inspired me to become a better person and place a bigger importance on helping others in need and serving the community.

It's also reminded me not to become fixated on material wealth and individual goals. Rather there's a renewed focus more on serving others and having a positive impact on those around me.

Liturgy of the Word Fifth Sunday of Easter

Entrance Antiphon

O sing a new song to the Lord, for he has worked wonders; in the sight of the nations he has shown his deliverance, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 6: 1-7

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

About this time, when the number of disciples was increasing, the Hellenists made a complaint against the Hebrews: in the daily distribution their own widows were being overlooked. So the Twelve called a full meeting of the disciples and addressed them, 'It would not be right for us to neglect the word of God so as to give out food; you, brothers, must select from among yourselves seven men of good reputation, filled with the Spirit and with wisdom; we will hand over this duty to them, and continue to devote ourselves to prayer and to the service of the word.' The whole assembly approved of this proposal and elected Stephen, a man full of faith and of the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus of Antioch, a convert to Judaism. They presented these to the apostles, who prayed and laid their hands on them.

The word of the Lord continued to spread: the number of disciples in Jerusalem was greatly increased, and a large group of priests made their submission to the faith.

1 Pt 2: 4-9

A reading from the first letter of St Peter

The Lord is the living stone, rejected by men but

chosen by God and precious to him; set yourselves close to him so that you too, the holy priesthood that offers the spiritual sacrifices which Jesus Christ has made acceptable to God, may be living stones making a spiritual house. As scripture says: See how I lay in Zion a precious cornerstone that I have chosen and the man who rests his trust on it will not be disappointed. That means that for you who are believers, it is precious; but for unbelievers, the stone rejected by the builders has proved to be the keystone, a stone to stumble over, a rock to bring men down. They stumble over it because they do not believe in the word; it was the fate in store for them.

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a consecrated nation, a people set apart to sing the praises of God who called you out of the darkness into his wonderful light.

Jn 14: 1-12

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jesus said to his disciples:

'Do not let your hearts be troubled.
Trust in God still, and trust in me.
There are many rooms in my Father's house;
if there were not, I should have told you.
I am now going to prepare a place for you,
and after I have gone and prepared you a place,
I shall return to take you with me;
so that where I am
you may be too.
You know the way to the place where I am
going.'

Thomas said, 'Lord, we do not know where you are going, so how can we know the way?' Jesus said:

'I am the Way, the Truth and the Life. No one can come to the Father except through me.

If you know me, you know my Father too. From this moment you know him and have seen him.'

Philip said, 'Lord, let us see the Father and then we shall be satisfied.' 'Have I been with you all this time, Philip,' said Jesus to him 'and you still do not know me?

'To have seen me is to have seen the Father, so how can you say, "Let us see the Father"? Do you not believe

That I am in the Father and the Father is in me?

The words I say to you I do not speak as from myself;

it is the Father, living in me, who is doing this work.

You must believe me when I say that I am in the Father and the Father is in me; believe it on the evidence of this work, if for no other reason.

'I tell you most solemnly, whoever believes in me will perform the same works as I do myself, he will perform eve n greater works, because I am going to the Father.'

Gospel Reflection

Mutual Indwelling

The disciples are full of premonitions that their beloved leader was about to be cruelly done to death, leaving them abandoned. Yet he tells them: 'Let not your hearts be troubled.'

Why shouldn't their hearts, our hearts, be troubled by the disappearance of Our Lord's physical presence? The answer is because there is a purpose to his passage through death. It was to bring about a situation where our Risen Lord could share his life in ever more intimate fashion with his followers.

How does this come about?

At every Mass, after the gifts are brought to the altar, I pour a little water into the chalice of wine, saying: 'By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to *share* in the divinity of Christ, who humbled himself to *share* in our humanity.'

What a powerful verb! By grace, we can participate in the Divine Life of the Risen Lord.

As the Greek saints of the early church used to say in very daring fashion: 'God became human so that humans might become God.'

We anticipate this at every Holy Communion when, as Pope John Paul II used to say: 'We digest, as it were, the secret of the Resurrection.'

We could pause for a moment after Communion to reverence the Divine Life dwelling in us, a truly Holy Communion!

Alleluia!






