



Solemnity of Mary MacKillop 8th August

Mary was an Australian woman, of Scottish descent, born in Melbourne in 1842. As a young woman she became concerned that



so many children in rural Australia could not afford to be educated. Mary knew that education was a key to freedom and that it was unfair that so many children should be denied access to education.

She also knew that God's love was the greatest freedom of all, and that through the right sort of education children could come to learn about God's love.

Together with her friend, Fr Julian Tennison Woods, she developed a plan for starting up schools for children caught in the poverty trap. Her dream was to tap their human potential and draw them closer to Jesus Christ.

She gathered other like-minded girls and young women and put her plan into action. These women became the community of religious sisters known as the Sisters of St. Joseph.

Their work had marvellous results. But it also aroused opposition. Like Jesus, Mary was persecuted and criticised. Sometimes by malicious gossip in the press. Sometimes by her own friends. Sometimes by people in high places. At one point, a bishop wrongfully excommunicated her! Mary and her companions were shattered. But they patiently endured the ordeal and after six months the bishop realised his mistake and withdrew the excommunication.

We honour Mary MacKillop because she was a courageous Australian who, at great cost to herself, followed her dream to spread the Good News to the children of Australia.

Mary MacKillop taught us to always look out for people. Even if they're not your friends or family, you must help out. Mary McKillop showed me to care for everyone around me. You should not just think about yourself, but think about others. *Charles*

Mary Mackillop is an inspiring role-model who has shown that everyone deserves a right to go to school and receive an education. She and the Josephites founded many schools for children who hadn't received an education. Her amazing work started when she was around 18 by providing a basic education for her cousins in Penola. She loved working with them so much that soon she extended the offer to the poor children in town. A young priest encouraged Mary to continue doing this as it was a thoughtful way to serve God. But this was only the beginning of her journey, as she was canonized in 2010. Today, she is recognised as Australia's first saint and she is our patron saint. She continues to inspire others, especially with her motto, "Never see a need without doing something about it". *Charlotte*

Due to the current Covid-19 lockdown, the Office of Children's Guardian (OCG) has


extended the expiry dates for those Working with Children Checks (WWCCs) due to expire between 19 July 2021 and 26 September 2021.

For you alone are the Holy One, you alone are the Lord, you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

Spend some time in silence, receiving the word of God. If you are in a group you may like to invite others to share the fruits of their reflection.

4. Profession Of Faith

I believe in God, the Father almighty, Creator of heaven and earth, and in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried; he descended into hell; on the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God the Father almighty; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

Entrance Antiphon

Come, you blessed of my Father, says the Lord:

I was sick and you visited me. Amen, I say to you: whatever you did for one of the least of my brethren, you did it for me.

First Reading 1 Kgs 17:7-16

A reading from the first book of Kings

And then the word of the Lord came to Elijah, 'Up and go to Zarephath, a Sidonian town, and stay there. I have ordered a widow there to give you food.' So he went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks. Addressing her he said, 'Please bring a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please,' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God Gospel Acclamation of Israel:

"Jar of meal shall not be spent, Jug of oils shall not be emptied, Before the day when the Lord sends Rain on the face of the earth."

The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her Gospel son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug Mt 6:25-34 of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

Over all these clothes, to keep them together and complete them, put on love. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

Jesus said to his disciples:

(R.) My soul clings toyou; your right hand I am telling you not to worry about your life and what you are to eat,

nor about your body and what you are to

Surely life is more than food, and the body more than clothing!

Look at the birds in the sky. They do not sow or reap or

gather into barns; yet your heavenly Father feeds them.

Are you not worth much more than they are? Can any of you, however much you worry, add one single cubit to your span of life? And why worry about clothing? Think of the flowers growing in the fields; they never have to work or spin: yet I assure

you that

not even Solomon in all his royal robes was clothed like one of these.

Now if that is how God clothes the wild flowers growing in the field

which are there today and thrown into the furnace tomorrow,

will he not much more look after you, you have so little faith?

So do not worry: do not say, "What are we to eat?

What are we to drink? What are we to wear?"

It is the gentiles who set their hears on all these things.

Your heavenly Father knows you need them

Set your hearts on his kingdom first, and on God's saving justice,

and all these other things will be given you as well.

So do not worry about tomorrow: tomorrow will take care of itself.

Each day has enough trouble of its own.

Gospel Reflection

This Gospel does not say we should not worry about what others eat or drink or have to wear. In fact we will be judged on whether we gave 'the Least' food, shelter, companionship in illness or in prison (Mt 25).

In the mid-late 19th century, a young woman was very concerned with the plight of the poor and the marginalised in the colonies which later became Commonwealth of Australia. Amongst the most obvious necessities of life for these 'least' was schooling of the young, as education is a proven path out of poverty.

So, this woman, whose most famous saying was 'never see a need without trying to do something about it', set about remedying that situation. Mary McKillop established the Sisters of St Joseph of the Sacred Heart principally to educate the poor.

She suffered excommunication for revealing sexual abuse of youngsters by a paedophile priest. That was reversed five months later, but this all took its toll on her fragile health.




