

Religious Education in 1M at Sacred Heart





Youth off the Streets Meals Program

A 30 year parish program supporting the disadvantaged has ended

3 June 2025

In the early 1990s, Fr Chris Riley started the Youth off the Streets charity. Their initial work was a Food Van that went out every night and provided meals and other services to disadvantaged youth in central Sydney. To support the Food Van, Fr Riley called for meal donations.

In those early days 30 years ago, a group associated with our Pymble parish started a program to collect home cooked frozen meals and deliver them to Youth off the Streets on a monthly basis. Other organisations did the same. Over those 30 years, the Pymble meal donors have delivered hundreds of meals annually to Youth off the Streets in Marrickville.

Youth off the Streets have made a strategic decision to redirect their youth outreach toward the south-west and away from frozen meals. There are now many "food van" services in and about central Sydney. As time went on, the Youth off the Streets program was providing more services to homeless adults rather than youth. Those same youth problems that Fr Chris Riley saw in Sydney are now in the south west and other places. Their new youth program will still provide food at locations about the south west but it will be more of a BBQ rather than an individual meal.

And Youth off the Streets is a different organisation now. It has six specialist high schools at Cordeaux Heights (Years 9-12), Macquarie Fields (Years 9-12), Merrylands (Years 9-12), Redfern (Years 9-10), Maroubra (Years 9-10), and Blue Haven (Years 9-10). It has youth refuge and housing services and various programs to support disadvantaged youth.

So now, after 30 years, our Pymble parish meals donation work has been completed. The last parish delivery was on Friday, 16 May 2025.

We remain grateful for the generous parish community donations of time and materials that have directly benefited disadvantaged youth. On behalf of the Parish and the young lives impacted, we extend our gratitude to the program donors within the parish for their contributions that have significantly enhanced the well-being of those encountered by the Youth off the Streets program. While the full scope of this vital work will remain unknown, our parish community support has been invaluable in fostering a brighter future for these young people.

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike -Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading Romans 8: 8-17 A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Romans

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has

made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but if Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

So then, my brothers, there is no necessity for us to obey our unspiritual selves or to live unspiritual lives. If you do live in that way, you are doomed to die; but if by the Spirit you put an end to the misdeeds of the body you will

Everyone moved by the Spirit is a son of God. The spirit you received is not the spirit of slaves bringing fear into your lives again; it is the spirit of sons, and it makes us cry out, 'Abba, Father!' The Spirit himself and our spirit bear united witness that we are children of God. And if we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory.

And my word is not my own; it is the word of the one who sent me. I have said these thins to you while still with you; but the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I have said to you.'

Gospel Reflection

The gift of Pentecost - the outpouring of the Holy Spirit, and the spiritual gifts and blessings of God - are made possible through the death, resurrection, and ascension of the Lord Jesus. After his resurrection Jesus "breathed" on his disciples and gave them the Holy Spirit. Just as God breathed life into Adam, so the gift of the Holy Spirit is an impartation of "new life" for his people. With the gift of the Holy Spirit a new creation begins. God recreates us for his glory. Jesus' gift of peace to his disciples was more than an absence of trouble. His peace included the forgiveness of sins and the fullness of everything good. Do you want power to live a faith-filled life as a disciple of Jesus? Ask the Father to fill you with the power of his Holy Spirit (Luke 11:13).

Lord Jesus, I thank you for the gift of Pentecost and for the new life you offer in the Holy Spirit. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and set my heart ablaze with the fire of your love that I may serve you in joy and freedom.
