




Pymble Catholic Parish latest Covid-19 Update 26 February 2021

• The use of face mask is recommended but not mandatory when entering the Parish Churches.



 Places of worship and religious services limited to 1 person per 2sqm. Children count towards the capacity limit.

Under the current NSW Health regulations, the permitted capacity of the Sacred Heart Church in Pymble is 260, and the permitted capacity of the Our Lady of Perpetual Succour Church in West Pymble is 130.

 Singing indoors including choirs or places of worship will be limited to **thirty** people, provided the singers observe social distancing. <u>Congregational singing can now occur provided that</u> the congregants wear a mask while singing.

PARISH PROPERTY DEVELOPMENT PROJECT CONSULTATION FORUM

Dear Parishioners and Parents of the Pymble Parish Community,

The Parish has a long history in the Pymble and West Pymble communities - since 1893 the Catholic community in Pymble has witnessed and contrib-

the Catholic community in Pymble has witnessed and contributed to many changes within the Church and the School as our Parish has evolved over time. As careful stewards of our Parish, we have a responsibility to maintain, renew and future-proof the significant assets of the Parish for those that follow; it is only through responsible stewardship that we are able to secure the sustainability of the Parish for our children and grandchildren.

As our "new" Sacred Heart Church is now 30 years old, you will understand that it is in need of major maintenance to preserve its value. The maintenance and other operating costs for the Parish with its two separate sites are considerable. Despite the generous ongoing support of our community, it is clear that the parish can no longer rely solely on traditional sources of income such as church collections and donations, and this trend has only been exacerbated by the COVID-19 pandemic this year.

Some of you will be aware of various past projects which have been considered by the Parish in an attempt to generate additional income. None of these has come to fruition for a variety of reasons. Nevertheless, it is time once again to turn our minds in a concerted way to potential opportunities which will financially assist the Parish with its ongoing costs and we would like to involve our parishioners in the journey we will commence shortly. Underutilised parish owned property could be one option to fill the gap between our current operating costs and income revenue. Please note that importantly, there is no plan to sell any property or to use our highly valued Sacred Heart School oval.

One important early step for us is to provide a forum for community consultation so that views and feedback on potential options for the generation of revenue can be received, and questions and concerns answered. The first stage of this consultation process will involve a **face to face Parish consultation forum** which all are invited and encouraged to attend. The **forum is scheduled for Wednesday**, 24th March 2021, 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm in the Marian Hall, Sacred Heart School – mark your diaries!



Entrance Antiphon

Rejoice, Jerusalem, and all who love her. Be joyful, all who were in mourning; Exult and be satisfied at her consoling breast.

First Reading 2 Chr 36:14-16, 19-23

A reading from the second book of Chronicles

The wrath and the mercy of the Lord are revealed in the exile and liberation of his people.

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.'

And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed kingdom: 'Thus throughout his speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."

Second Reading Eph 2:4-10

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

When we were dead through sins, he brought us to life.

God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ – it is through grace that you have been saved – and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus.

This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

Gospel Acclamation

Glory and praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ! God loved the world so much, he gave us his only Son,

Gospel Jn 3:14-21

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

God sent his Son into the world that we might be saved through him.

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him.

Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son,

so that everyone who believes in him may not be lost

but may have eternal life.

For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world,

but so that through him the world might be saved.

No one who believes in him will be condemned;

but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already,

because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son.

On these grounds is sentence pronounced:

that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light

because their deeds were evil.
And indeed, everybody who does wrong
hates the light and avoids it,

for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light,

so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'

Gospel Reflection The "lifting up" of the Son of Man

Jesus explained to Nicodemus that the "Son of Man" must be "lifted up" to bring the power and authority of God's kingdom to bear on the earth. The title, "Son of Man," came from the prophet Daniel who describes a vision he received of the Anointed Messiah King who was sent from heaven to rule over the earth. Jesus explains to Nicodemus that he will be recognized as the Anointed King when he is "lifted up" on the cross at Calvary. Jesus died for his claim to be the only begotten Son sent by the Father in heaven to redeem, heal, and reconcile his people with God.

The cross defeats sin and death

The bronze serpent which Moses lifted up in the wilderness points to the cross of Christ which defeats sin and death and obtains everlasting life for those who believe in Jesus Christ. The result of Jesus "being lifted up on the cross" and his rising from the dead, and his exaltation and ascension to the Father's right hand in heaven, is our "new birth in the Spirit" and adoption as sons and daughters of God. God not only frees us from our sins and pardons us, he also fills us with his own divine life through the gift and working of his Spirit who dwells within us.

The Holy Spirit gives us spiritual power and gifts, especially the seven-fold gifts of wisdom and understanding, right judgment and courage, knowledge and reverence for God and his ways, and a holy fear in God's presence, to enable us to live in his strength as sons and daughters of God.

The proof of God's love for us

How do we know, beyond a doubt, that God truly loves us and wants us to be united with him forever? For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life (John 3:16). God proved his love for us by giving us the best he had to offer - his only begotten Son who freely gave himself as an offering to God for our sake and as the atoning sacrifice for our sin and the sin of the world.

This passage tells us of the great breadth and width of God's love. Not an excluding love for just a few or for a single nation, but a redemptive love that embraces the whole world, and a personal love for each and every individual whom God has created. God is a loving Father who cannot rest until his wandering children have returned home to him © 2021 The Servants of the Word


