The Voluntary Assisted Dying Act 2022, came into effect in NSW on 28 November 2023. Bishop Anthony Randazzo and the Diocese has produced a booklet, an Interim Pastoral Guideline on Voluntary Assisted Dying, which includes a full explanation of the Voluntary Dying Act as well as the Catholic Response.

### **First Reading**

### Prepare the way for the Lord.

The glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it 'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.'
