An Update on NAIDOC Week

As we end NAIDOC Week it is worth assessing where the nation is at this time in terms of the challenges we face in addressing the injustices of the past towards our First Nations peoples.

In a document entitled Just Now Catholic Religious Australia has done this exercise, saying that it has been over 4 years since the Uluru Statement from the Heart was made on 26 May 2017. It goes on to say that in the last ten years there have been five governmentendorsed processes, a legislated framework and eight reports on indigenous constitutional recognition. A Joint Se-Committee on Constitutional Recognition for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples was set up in 2018. This body reviewed the report of the Referendum Dialogues which led to the Uluru Statement.

Their recently released report has resulted in the Indigenous Co-Design Process which gives Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Peoples the opportunity to design and implement a national and/or regional and local Voice/s to Parliament.

It has been a rocky road towards achieving a fair place for First Nations Peoples in our country, but the Uluru Statement from the Heart has in turn captured the heart of many Australians. It is time now to seize the momentum created to ensure that a constitutionally enshrined Indigenous Voice is achieved.

The views in this article do not represent the unanimous opinion of members of our Social Justice Committee as at least one member of our Committee does not support the Uluru Statement from the Heart.




