probably You know about the 10c cash refund on some recyclable containers. As a way of raising money for the Parish, Steve Rolls a pa-

rishioner has set up the return and earn in 2018 and to date we have raised a lot of money to go towards things like our new air-conditioners and running of the church.

The return containers are set up at the side of the church (drive-way side) for us to drop containers off when we come to mass.

Most containers between 150ml and 3L that are made of PET/HDPE, Aluminum / Steel, Glass and Liquid carboard are eligible for return. Containers need to be marked with the 10c refund logo on the label; empty of liquid; and not crushed or broken.

Proverbs 8:22-31

Wisdom was born before the earth was made.

The Wisdom of God cries aloud:

The Lord created me when his purpose first unfolded, before the oldest of his works. From everlasting I was firmly set, from the beginning, before earth came into being. The deep was not, when I was born, there were no springs to gush with water.
