Reflection



Both Naaman (2 Kings 5) and the ten lepers (Luke 17:11–19) are healed through humble

obedience and faith. Naaman, a foreigner, finds new life by following a simple command, while in the Gospel, only the Samaritan returns to thank Jesus. These stories reveal that God's mercy transcends boundaries, and true healing comes through humility, faith, and gratitude.

Second Reading Letter of St Paul to Timothy 2:8-13

If we hold firm, we shall reign with Christ.

Remember the Good News that I carry, 'Jesus Christ risen from the dead, sprung form the race of David'; it is on account of this that I have my own hardships to bear, even to begin chained like a criminal—but they cannot chain up God's news. So I bear it all for the sake of those who are chosen, so that in the end they may have the salvation that is in Christ Jesus and the eternal glory that comes with it.

Here is a saying that you can rely on: If we have died with him, then we shall live with him. If we hold firm, then we shall reign with him. If we disown him, then he will disown us. We may be unfaithful but he is always faithful, for he cannot disown his own self.

It seems that no one has returned to give thanks to God expect this foreigner.

On the way to Jerusalem Jesus travelled along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he entered one of the villages, ten lepers came to meet him. They stood some way off and called to him, 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us.' When he saw them he said, 'Go and show yourselves to the priests.' Now as they were going away they were cleansed. Finding himself cured, one of them turned back praising God at the top of his voice and threw himself at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was a Samaritan. This made Jesus say, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they? It seems that no one has come back to give praise to God, except this foreigner.' And he said to the man, 'Stand up and go on your way. Your faith has saved you.'
