

Dear Parishioners of St Mary of the Cross MacKillop Catholic Parish



Catechists participate in the ministry bringing the message of God's kingdom to Catholic students who attend public schools. Catechists provide Catholic Special Religious Education, also known as Scripture, to children attending Warnervale P.S. and Woongarrah P.S. in 30-minute weekly lessons.

There are over 200 Catholic children who receive Special Religious Education from the Catechists.

We have other schools in our Parish, one of which is a new school where the children are unable to receive their religious education due to the low numbers of catechists in the parish. The numbers of volunteers have dropped in the past few years with catechists retiring to look after their own health or have moved to another parish. Unfortunately, we have been unable to attract new catechists due to the restrictions of Covid. Now that many of us are vaccinated, the Special Religious Edu-

cation (Scripture) classes are returning to normal and once again the catechists are looking for some generous volunteers to swell their ranks once more.


The program we use, *Walking With Jesus*, has been approved by Bishop Anthony Randazzo. The Teacher's Manuals contain easy to follow lesson plans with specially designed PowerPoints to support each lesson. These PowerPoints contain songs and videos of the Scripture passages plus more, used in the lessons. Each child is provided with a colourful *Walking With Jesus* student workbook.

The necessary training to obtain full authorisation to teach the *Walking With Jesus* program is provided free of charge. This training is provided via Zoom which means you can complete the training without leaving home.

The Catechists in our Diocese undertake a vital evangelising role, educating children and young people and forming them in the Catholic faith.

Second Reading

St Paul to Thessalonians 3:7-12

Do not give anyone food who refuses to work.

You know how you are supposed to imitate us: now we were no idle when we were with you, nor did we ever have our meals at anyone's table without paying for them; no, we worked night and day, slaving and straining, so as not to be a burden on any of you. This was not because we had no right to be, but in order to make ourselves an example for you to follow.

We gave you a rule when we were with you: not to let anyone have any food if he refused to do any work. Now we hear that there are some of you who are living in idleness, doing no work themselves but interfering with everyone else's. In the Lord Jesus Christ, we order and call on people of this kind to go on quietly working and earning the food that they eat.

Your endurance will win you your life.

When some were talking about the Temple, remarking how it was adorned with fine stonework and votive offerings, Jesus said, 'All these things you are starting at now—the time will come when not a single stone will be left on another: everything will be destroyed.' And they put to him this question: 'Master', they said 'when will this happen, then, and what sign will there be that this is about to take place?'

'Take care not to be deceived', he said 'because many will come using my name and saying, "I am he", and, "The time is near at hand." Refuse to join them. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon.' Then he said to them, 'Nation will fight against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be great earthquakes and plagues and famines here and there; there will be fearful sights and great signs from heaven.

'But before all this happens, men will seize you and persecute you; they will hand you over to the synagogues and to imprisonment, and bring you before kings and governors because of my name and that will be your opportunity to bear witness. Keep this carefully in mind: you are not to prepare your defense, because I myself shall give you an eloquence and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to resist or contradict. You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, relations and friends; and some of you will be put to death. You will be hated by all men on account of my name, but not a hair on your head will be lost. Your endurance will win you your lives.'
