## Wallaby Track Woman Reflection

Over the next few weeks leading to our feast day we will reflect on Mary MacKillop's life.

We Australians take pride in the beauty of our land. It is often celebrated and acclaimed by poets, storytellers and artists. One expression used for journeying across this vast continent is to be 'on the wallaby track.'

It was in Penola that Mary MacKillop's call to serve the poor became strong and it was in the bush that her spirituality developed. It was typical of Mary's life to walk the wallaby track often against all odds, to be at the service of the most neglected and marginalised.

Mary knew want from the beginning, the whole course of her young life was dictated by the necessity of making a living. Her stance on poverty and the need for women to be able to meet any need grew from her awareness of life for the early pioneers.
