Reflection

Families work hard to nurture unity and love, so it can be unsettling to hear Jesus in this Sunday's Gospel (Luke 12:49–53) speak of bringing division—even within households.

Unity is built through everyday acts: sharing meals, attending Mass, celebrating together, and honouring traditions. Yet following Jesus sometimes means making choices that are not popular—whether as parents guiding children, or as children standing firm among friends. These decisions may feel like division at first, but ultimately they deepen our unity in faith and love.

This week, talk together about times when doing the right thing was hard. Pray as a family for the Holy Spirit's gift of courage, so that you may follow Jesus faithfully, even when it is challenging.

First Reading Prophet Jeremiah 38:4-6, 8-10

You bore me to be a man of strife for the whole world.

The king's leading men spoke to the king. 'Let Jeremiah be put to death: he is unquestionably disheartening the remaining soldiers in the city, and all the people too, by talking like this. The fellow does not have the welfare of this people at heart so much as its ruin.' 'He is in your hands as you know,' King Zedekiah answered 'for the king is powerless against you.' So they took Jeremiah and threw him into the well of Prince Malchiah in the Court of the Guard, letting him down with ropes. There was no water in the well, only mud, and into the mud Jeremiah sank.

Ebed-melech came out from the palace and spoke to the king. 'My lord king,' he said, 'these men have done a wicked thing by treating the prophet Jeremiah like this: they have thrown him into the well where he will die.'
