Reflection

PROCLAIM THE GOOD NEWS. The early Christian community could not remain as an enclosed, self-contained group in Jerusalem. Its members felt impelled by Christ to bring the Good News to Samaria and then to the ends of the earth. Christians in every age are called to be fully involved in the life and joys and pains of the world. At times this can be difficult but the Spirit of God is always with us to help us.



Resumption of Masses & Update on Restrictions

As restrictions to protect us from the coronavirus are slowing being eased, changes are happening in our diocese and parish:

The church is now open for private prayer and religious gatherings, with some restrictions.

Masses can be celebrated, with a limit of 10 parishioners who must register prior to the Mass.

Reconciliation can be celebrated inside the church.

Baptisms can have ten people, plus the priest.

Alleluia alleluia!

All who love me will keep my words, and my father will love them and we will come to them.

Weddings can have ten people, plus the bride and groom and the priest. Funerals can have 20 people inside and 30

people outside, plus the funeral directors and priest.

Mass times are 9.15am Monday to Friday and 8am and 9am on Sunday. The church will be open for private prayer from 10 am to 6pm Monday to Friday; and Sunday. Reconciliation will be available each day after Mass, at 10am.

To register to attend a Mass, contact the parish office on Wednesday (8:30am - 4pm), Thursday (8.30am - 2pm) and Friday (8.30am - 2.30pm) on 8379 1740 or warnervaleparish@bbcatholic.org.au.

You can only register for one Mass in this Step One. Step Two will allow for 20 people to attend and we will recommence registrations.

Coronavirus Response Update

Public Masses with a limit of 10 people. You must register to attend.

Church is open for private praver - from 10am till 6pm every day with a limit of ten people in the church. Each time you enter the church you are required to sign in and out. The church will be closed if a baptism, funeral etc is being celebrated.

Reconciliation after Mass at 10am in the church or by appointment with the priest.

Baptisms may be celebrated, with up to 10 people present.

Funerals may be celebrated, with 20 mourners indoors and 30 people outside.

Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated individually, by appointment with the priest

Readings at Mass

First reading

Acts 8:5-8, 14-17

They laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Philip went to a Samaritan town and proclaimed the Christ to them. The people united in welcoming the message Philip preached, either because they had heard of the miracles he worked or because they saw them for themselves. There were, for example, unclean spirits that came shrieking out of many who were possessed, and several paralytics and cripples were cured. As a result there was great rejoicing in that town.

When the apostles in Jerusalem heard that Samaria had accepted the word of God, they sent Peter and John to them, and they went down there, and prayed for the Samaritans to receive the Holy Spirit, for as yet he had not come down on any of them: they had only been baptised in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid hands on them, and they received the Holy Spirit.

Second reading

In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.

Reverence the Lord Christ in your hearts, and always have your answer ready for people who ask you the reason for the hope that you all have. But give it with courtesy and respect and with a clear conscience, so that those who slander you when you are living a good life in Christ may be proved wrong in the accusations that they bring. And if it is the will of God that you should suffer, it is better to suffer for doing right than for doing wrong.

Why, Christ himself, innocent though he was, had died once for sins, died for the guilty, to lead us to God. In the body he was put to death, in the spirit he was raised to life.
