Reflection on todays Gospel



In today's Gospel we hear Jesus teach about faith and service to God. The context is a continuing dialogue between Jesus and his followers about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. Jesus has just finished an instruction on sin and forgiveness. There are two related teachings that Jesus offers to his disciples when they cry out for an increase in faith. The first is the familiar reminder that faith, even just a little, will enable the followers of Jesus to do wondrous things. But this uplifting and inspiring teaching is quickly followed by the second teaching, a caution about knowing one's place in God's plans. The disciples of Jesus are to understand themselves as servants to God and his plans. Even when God works wonders through us, with our mustard seed-sized faith, we must not seek praise. Our participation in God's plans is God's grace to us-nothing more, nothing less. When



Sacrament of First Holy Communion 2022



My Journey Glenn Arnold



I was born in Newcastle NSW the eldest of five children and I was baptised in the Anglican Church. My family had no close association with the church ,but I remember as a child wanting to know God as a loving Father .At age 18 I made a commitment to Jesus Christ as my Lord and went on to attend an evangelical missionary training college in Tasmania for 2 years.

I returned to Newcastle and became involved in a local Baptist Church as a deacon. Then in my late twenties I felt a call to ministry and began my 5 year theological training. I became an ordained minister of the Baptist Churches of New South Wales having studied at the NSW Baptist Theological College .I pastored churches in Newcastle, Sydney and the Central Coast.

As a protestant my understanding of the Catholic Church was more of thinking there was a lot of ritual without per-

sonal devotion to Christ. I was so wrong and for this I seek forgiveness .

My journey to become a Catholic has been influenced by several matters. My wife Crimy is from Peru and is Catholic as is her family. I have seen in her a deep personal devotion to Jesus Christ .

I have been able to study beliefs and traditions of the Church, as in the continuity of the Church over a period of 2,000 years. For me this is a clear message in contrast to around 40,000 protestant denominations in the world. To belong to a Church with 2,000 years of history that has kept the continuity of teaching and authority.

The witness of the Scriptures, the Tradition of the Church and in particular the Early Church Fathers and their witness to the unbroken tradition and authority has all spoken to me of truth.

A further challenge for me has been in accepting the Eucharist as the Real Presence of Christ . My protestant understanding was merely a memorial communion .The Church Fathers certainly believed and taught the Real Presence. I have attended Mass with my wife and came to realise how the Mass is saturated in Scripture and the service leads us in repentance, forgiveness and faith .

I have a deep sense of peace in my decision I have made to become a Catholic and I feel I belong .My evangelical tradition has presented to me the need for personal faith and repentance in Jesus Christ which is no different for the Catholic Church.

I think of Hebrews 12 verses 1,2 looking unto Jesus, fixing our eyes upon Him. My journey continues and I pray that in the fellowship of His Church I will do this. I understand that some of my protestant friends will not accept my decision and see me as a heretic. I need to be honest before my Saviour .I am thankful for the support of my Parish and Father Philip at St Mary Mackillop Church Warnervale.
