Homelessness

A homelessness and mental health a report has just been released with the results of a study carried out by Equity Economics into the housing crisis after the pandemic.

This found that the economic fallout from the coronavirus is expected to result in a 9 per cent increase in homelessness and a 24 per cent increase in families experiencing housing stress in the new year in New South Wales. The adverse effects are anticipated to be worse in this State as we have the highest number of families reliant on two incomes to maintain mortgage payments

The report found that homelessness in NSW will rise by 19.1 per cent.

Whilst the Federal Government has budgeted for an amount of \$8.4 billion to be paid to support housing and homelessness in 2020-21, and this is welcome news,

Such an investment could boost the economy by \$18.2 billion and create 18,000 jobs per year over the next four years. This will significantly ease the budgetary pressures after the pandemic.

2 Samuel 7:1-5, 8-12, 14, 1

Your House and your sovereignty will always stand secure before me

Once David had settled into his house and the Lord had given him rest from all the enemies surrounding him, the king said to the prophet Nathan, 'Look, I am living in a house of cedar while the ark of God dwells in a tent.' Nathan said to the king, 'Go and do all that is in your mind, for the Lord is with you.'

But that very night the word of the Lord came to Nathan:

'Go and tell my servant David, "Thus the Lord speaks: Are you the man to build me a house to dwell in? I took you from the pasture, from following the sheep, to be leader of my people Israel; I have been with you on all your expeditions; I have cut off all your enemies before you. I will give you fame as great as the fame of the greatest on earth. Luke 1:26-38

You will conceive and bear a son.

The angel Gabriel was sent by God to a town in Galilee called Nazareth, to a virgin betrothed to a man named Joseph, of the House of David; and the virgin's name was Mary. He went in and said to her, 'Rejoice, so highly favoured! The Lord is with you.' She was deeply disturbed by these words and ask herself what this greeting could mean, but the angel said to her! You are to conceive and bear a son, and you must name him Jesus. He will be great and will be called Son of the Most High. The Lord God will give him a throne of his ancestor David; he will rule over the house of Jacob for ever and his reign will have no end.'
